1. It is apparent that repair work was carried out by the Italian Army on the sheds which belonged to the Scuderie Stucchi of the Office of Mobilization S.V. located on Piazza - Parma road in the "Trasone S. MARCO".

These sheds have now been occupied by Allied troops possibly some Indian Unit, and war Ministry are anxious to see in possession of them, as they are urgently required for the 45 Indian Unit.

2. The O.A.R.E. of S. Vitale at Bologna, is only partly used by the Italian Army, as the remainder of the building is occupied by some Allied Unit. The whole of this workshop is also urgently required, as it has been earmarked for the M. Spare Depot for British Stores, which will be made available to the Italian Army by A.C.

3. It is requested you contact 2 District and obtain release of these buildings.

1. The following report has been received from the Italian War Ministry:

a. Captain Graham Bennett, RAMC, of the Displaced Persons Sub Commission at Reggio Emilia on 6 June 1945 made a contract with the firm Ditta Enzo del Conte for the sale of wheels and old vehicle parts belonging to the Italian Army then located at the Artillery Barracks at Reggio Emilia.

b. The Bologna Territorial Headquarters requested Captain Bennett to suspend the execution of the contract he had made as the Italian authorities were satisfied that the sale price of the material was well below the actual value.

2. The Ministry of War takes the stand that such sales of their material constitute speculation by Italian civilians with State property which can be reconstructed and put to use in the military service.

3. Attention is invited to our letter Q/12/12 of 16 July, same subject, referring to a sale of Italian property from the same location, and it is possible that the letter of the War Ministry has reference to the same sale reported in our letter of 16 July.

1. The following report has been received from Italian military authorities at Bologna:

a. There is a refugee center located in the Italian Third Artillery Regiment Barracks at Reggio Emilia, and Captain Graham Bennett, RAMC of the Displaced Persons Sub Commission is in charge.

b. Captain Bennett has sold to Ditta Enzo del Cozza, of the Ente Nazionale Disciplina e Raccolta Rottami Metallici, a large quantity of scrap iron which was in the Third Artillery Barracks, for 660,000 lire, and the money has been placed in a fund for the assistance of "refugees of the community".

c. The Italian authorities state that the sale price of this material was only a fraction of its true value.

d. The Italian authorities state that the material is Italian Army property.

2. Regardless of the ownership of the property, which may or may not be property of the Italian Army, the procedure, if true as alleged, is contrary to the provisions of AFHQ letter, file 386.3/163 LOG-O, dated 22 June 1945, subject: Disposition of captured enemy material in Italy.

3. Request matter be investigated and proper determination made as to the ownership of the property, the method of sale, and the disposition of proceeds.
