1. The present bakery system for the Italian Army Units in ROME entails the employment of various civilian bakeries in different localities throughout the city, with consequent disadvantages.
2. For this reason the War Ministry has requested that the Military Bakery in Via De Eorie be demarcated, at least in part.
3. It can be appreciated that the release of all the premises may be impracticable from the Allied point of view, but you are requested to investigate the possibility of releasing at least certain parts of the bakery, including any brick oven not being used. Sections released will, if so desired, be walled off by the Italian Engineers and separate entrances to them can be set up.

Bearing in mind also that the premises for which application is made were formerly those of an Italian Military Bakery, it is suggested that the application should be considered sympathetically.

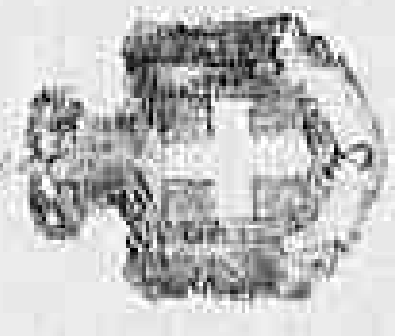

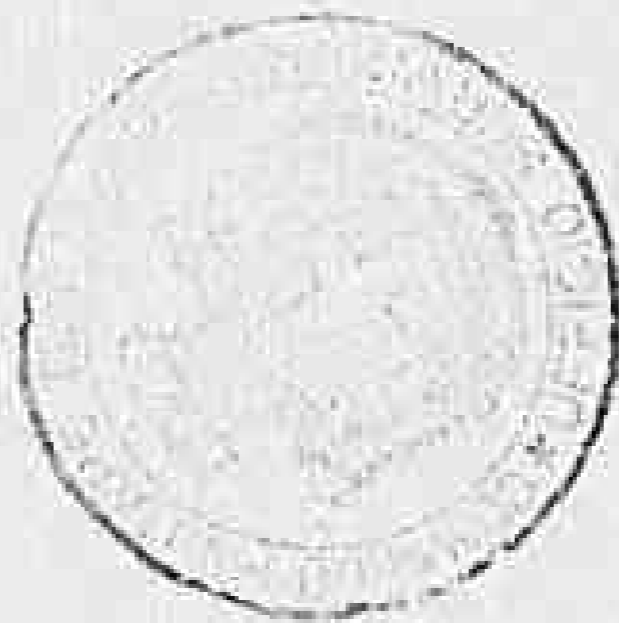

2. In order to obtain from fine flour a 50% "raise" (increase in volume) which is necessary to produce the best bread artificial yeast is essential.

To: A.D.S.T. H.Q. Army Sub Commission, A.C.C. (M.M.I.A.).

Sir, the question of the Italian Bakery in Via NOVARA has been settled today.

The whole trouble is due to the Italian Rome Area H.Q., who stated to the M/W that the Bakery had been regularly requisitioned for use by the Italian Army, with the knowledge and consent of R.A.A.C. This was NOT the case.

I saw Maj. LOTHIAN and Lt.Col. McMURRIE of the Real Estate Section R.A.A.C. and they both stated that they knew nothing whatever about the Italian Army having taken over the Bakery, and so had issued a normal requisition order to the American Red Cross, who were now within their rights in taking possession of it.

I then saw Mr. ROSENDAAL of the American Red Cross, who said that as far as he knew his requisition had been above board and that he had taken special precautions NOT to move before making certain of this. He was, however quite willing to come to a 'Gentleman's Agreement' with this H.Q. and to allow the Italian Army to continue to use their own part of the Bakery as they were doing now. The only stipulation he made was that they kept quite clear of the American Portion. This, as it was a perfectly feasible and reasonable proposition, I agreed to.

On informing Capt. VENTRELLA of the situation, I made quite clear to him that the Italians, through their own incompetence and laziness had very nearly lost the Bakery and that they only remained there on sufferance of the American Red Cross. 

While at A.A.A.C. I heard that the old Italian Army Bakery in Via PRINCIPALE ARDEO No 184 had NOT been found on the books of the Real Estate Section as having been requisitioned, although the M/W states that a British Bakery is now using it. Thus it is possible that, if the Italians claim for the release of that Bakery they may have some chance of acquiring it. This would be the ideal solution of the whole problem.

2. The facts are briefly as follows:-

The original Italian Army bakery was requisitioned for use by the US authorities. This forced the Italian Ministry of War to utilize civilian bakeries in the town to produce bread for Italian troops.

These bakeries are at the same time producing bread for civilian consumption and the Ministry of War are rightly convinced that if they allow these bakeries to use the good white flour received from Allied sources, for the Italian Armed Forces, a goodly proportion of this flour will rapidly make its appearance in the black market.

The Ministry of War are therefore using the very low grade brown flour left behind by the Germans.

The bread yield of this flour is poor. It is dirty in appearance, unappetizing and lacking in nutrition.

This bread issue is causing grave discontent among the Italian troops in the Rome Area and Gen Pelligre, Chief of the ~~Italian~~ ^{Italian} Army, has expressed considerable concern as to the

3. General Pelligra has located and requisitioned a suitable bakery in VIA NOVARA 18, called "Panificio Gentilini", which is capable of producing the daily 5 tons required for issue in the Rome Area.

This bakery he can staff and supervise with Italian military personnel, thus ensuring protection of flour and bread stocks, a thing he cannot do under the existing system.

4. The factor governing the operation of Panificio Gentilini is, of course, that of providing electric power to operate the machinery. An estimated figure of 60 K.W. a day has been given me by General Pelligra.

A seguito di accurati esperimenti, eseguiti presso panifici e con tecnici militari, la resa in pane della farina di provenienza alleata fu, a suo tempo, determinata nel 133%. Sul la base di tale dato fu stabilito di ripartire il quantitativo di farina giornalmente disponibile (gr. 339,750), in gr. 225,6 per ottenerne una razione pane da gr. 300 e in gr. 113 per ottenerne una razione di pasta di gr. 110.

Detta resa però ha incontrato resistenze da parte dei panificatori privati i quali - devesi ammetterlo - non hanno talvolta l'attrezzatura adeguata, il personale adatto, la tecnica necessaria per ottenere sempre e sicuramente la resa ottenuta presso i panifici militari.

Ne sono derivate numerosissime contestazioni, dimostrando, cattiva panificazione etc., rese ancora più irrisolte per la circostanza che gli organi dell'Alimentazione competenti avevano stabilito per la panificazione civile la resa del 130%.

Allo scopo di eliminare tali inconvenienti e per non creare disparità fra le due panificazioni (civile e militare)

per ottenere una razione pane di gr. 110.-

In considerazione che ovvie ragioni di convenienza sigliano di diminuire, sia pure di pochi grammi, il peso della razione attuale, questo Ministero in data odierna dispone che la razione di pasta venga ridotta da gr. 110 a gr. 104.-

Qualora però il Comando Alleato ritenga che la razione di pasta permanga di gr. 110 sarà necessario aumentare di almeno 10 grammi la razione giornaliera di farina, attuata vista in gr. 339, 750.-
