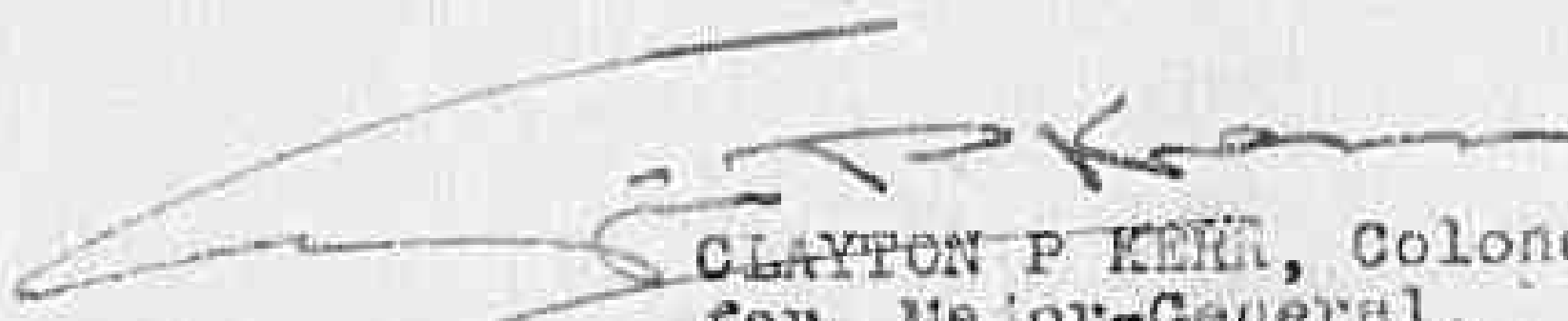

1. Returned herewith Analysis Report for flour condemned on 12 Feb. 46.
2. Authority will be given to write-off the eleven (11) tons of flour declared fit for animal consumption.
3. An important factor in determining whether credit be given to the Italian Government for condemned foodstuffs sold for animal consumption or some industrial use is that frequently the compensation derived from such sale exceeds the original charge made against the Italian Government for the foodstuffs. In this particular case it is quite possible that the remuneration derived from the sale of the eleven (11) tons may be as much as the charge made against the Italian Government for thirty-six (36) tons of flour.
4. It is requested that you
 - a. report, and include on the Analysis Report, the amount of flour recovered of the twenty-five (25) tons fit for animal consumption.
 - b. procure a statement from the local Commissariato Directorate or O.C. #3 Military Bakery concerning the compensation derived from the sale of the flour fit for animal consumption.

1. Instances are occurring in the proceedings of Analysis Commissions for the condemnation of deteriorated foodstuffs wherein certain food has been found unfit for human consumption; however the foodstuff may be put to industrial uses, or sold as animal feeding stuffs.
2. The normal procedure for disposition of foodstuffs found unfit for human consumption is destruction by fire or other means, the purpose of this method being to ensure that condemned foodstuffs do not become available for human consumption on the black-market.
3. Authority is delegated to the Allied Officer member of the Analysis Commission to authorise that condemned foodstuffs be sold to civilian contractors, on credit will, however, be given for foodstuffs disposed of in this manner.
4. In the event of the Analysis Commission recommending disposal of bad foodstuffs for industrial purposes or animal feed the Commissariat Directorate concerned will make out a certificate which will be signed by the purchaser, such certificate will state that the items purchased will be used in the manner laid down by the Analysis Commission. Signed copies of this certificate will be attached to all Analysis Commissions reports forwarded to this HQ (Ministry of War letter 13712/S/4 dated 13 Aug 45 to all Commands refers).

1 You will probably be aware that it is an established procedure that periodically analysis commissions are held for the purpose of examining supplies received in Italian Supply Depots from Allied sources and which have been found to be unfit for human consumption.

2 It is desired to continue the present procedure of having an Allied representative on these commissions as in many cases it is necessary to decide whether credit shall be given to the Italian authorities for supplies so examined and destroyed.

3 In cases where the Italian depots are unable to prove that the supplies were received unfit for human consumption or Allied depots, it is not normal to recommend credit and in no circumstances is credit recommended where it is possible to sell condemned supplies for animal consumption.

4 Attached is a copy of the current instructions dealing with this matter.

2. It is desired to continue the present procedure of having an Allied representative on these commissions as in many cases it is necessary to decide whether credit shall be given to the Italian authorities for supplies so condemned and destroyed.

3. In cases where the Italian depots are unable to prove that the supplies were received until for human consumption ex Allied depots, it is not normal to recommend credit and in no circumstances is credit recommended where it is possible to sell condemned supplies for animal consumption.

These instructions are based on MHA Administrative Instruction No. 3 issued 4 June 44, but should there be any points of difference between these instructions and Adm Instruction No. 3 it is notified for the information of all concerned that these present instructions will constitute the governing document. Any necessary amendments to Adm Instruction No. 3 will be made and issued in due course.

1 When rations delivered to the Italian Armed Forces by the Allied Military Forces are suspected to be unfit for human consumption at the time of handing over, the Italian Port Detachment taking delivery will immediately report the fact to the Direzione Commissariato concerned. Officers Commanding Italian Army Food Depots will similarly so report any foodstuffs held by them in their depots which are suspected as unfit for consumption.

2 In all instances where food supplies are reported to the Direzione Commissariato as unfit for consumption, a short "Unfit Subsistence" report will immediately be forwarded to Hq MHA by the MHA Sector Liaison Officer. See Appendix 'A' for proforma to be used.

3 The Direzione Commissariato, on receipt of such reports from Port Detachments or OGC Depots will, by arrangement with the MHA Sector Liaison Officer concerned, convene an Analysis Commission to examine and adjudicate upon the supplies in question.

Analysis Commissions will comprise:-

An officer representative of MHA.
An Italian officer representing the Divisione Commissariato.
An Italian officer qualified as a chemist or food analyst.

Liberty forces are suspected to be unfit for human consumption at the time of landing over, the Italian Port Detachment taking delivery will immediately report the fact to the Direzione Commissariato concerned. Officers commanding Italian Army Food Depots will similarly so report any foodstuffs held by them in their depots which are suspected as unfit for consumption.

2 In all instances where food supplies are reported to the Direzione Commissariato as unfit for consumption, a short "Unit Substances" report will immediately be forwarded to HQ MIA by the MIA Sector Liaison Officer. See Appendix 'A' for proforma to be used.

3 The Direzione Commissariato, on receipt of such reports from Port Detachments or OSC Depots will, by arrangement with the MIA Sector Liaison Officer concerned, convene an Analysis Commission to examine and adjudicate upon the supplies in question.

Analysis Commissions will comprise:-

An officer representative of MIA.

An Italian officer representing the Divisione Commissariato.

An Italian officer qualified as a chemist or food analyst.

Where necessary an additional independent analyst's report ⁴⁰³ ~~402~~ obtained.

4 Analysis Commissions will record facts and record action taken, in accordance with the Analysis Report, proforma for which is attached at Appendix 'B'.

This report is required in sextuplicate, copies disposed:-

(one) 1 copy retained by MIA Sector Liaison Officer,
(one) 1 copy retained by the concerned Direzione Commissariato,
(Four) 4 copies forwarded to HQ MIA.

5 Action recommended by Analysis Commissions, vide para II of the Analysis Report, may be put into effect forthwith without awaiting confirmation by HQ MIA.

In cases where immediate destruction is decided upon, the Destruction Certificate forming part of Appendix 'B' will be completed before the Analysis Report is sent forward.

6 After endorsement of Analysis Reports by HQ MIA copies will be disposed as follows:-

MMIA intends to introduce a new ruling with regard to action to be taken by Analysis Commissions, after they have certified that the items are in a bad condition.

The present procedure is that food deemed unfit for human consumption are destroyed by fire or other means, principally to avoid them being used by the Black Market.

Since these items, though unfit for human consumption, may be used for other purposes, LO's and Allied officers who are members of the Analysis Commission are allowed to authorize their sale to civilian firms so that their fat content may be used or that they may be given as food to animals.

If the aforesaid officers avail themselves of this, the Italian Military Authority (Commissariat) will make out a certificate (to be attached to the Analysis Commission's report), declaring that the items will be sold, with the obligation on the part of the purchaser to use them in the manner prescribed by the Commission and not for human consumption. A declaration to this effect by the purchaser will be made at the act of selling.

Addressees will contact LO's with regard to the above and will adopt the necessary procedure.

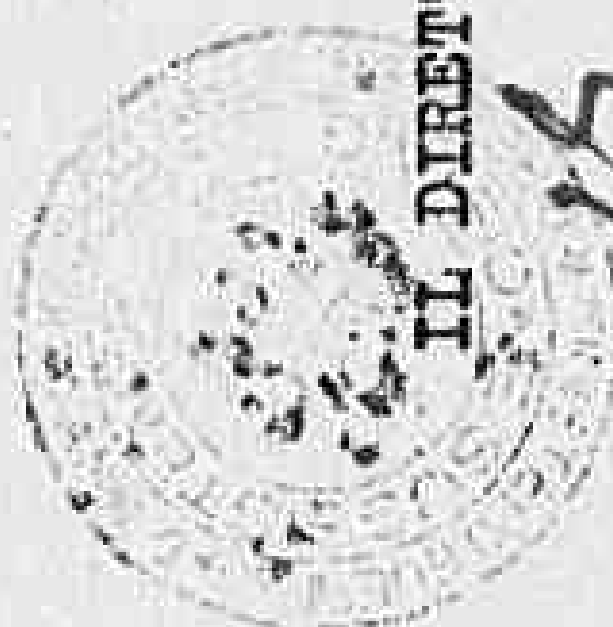

1. Several instances have occurred in the proceeding of Analysis Commissions for the condemnation of deteriorated foodstuffs wherein certain food has been found unfit for human consumption; however, the foodstuff may be put to other use.
2. Normal procedure for disposition of foodstuff found unfit for human consumption is destruction by fire or other means. The primary purpose of this procedure is to ensure that condemned foodstuff does not become available for human consumption or the black market.
3. Authority is delegated to the MHA 10 or Allied Officer member of the Analysis Commission to authorize that condemned foodstuffs be sold to civilian contractor for utilization of the content of foodstuff or for use as animal feed.
4. No credit will be given to the Italian Government for foodstuffs disposed of in this manner.
5. Italian military authorities involved must certify that the foodstuff will be disposed of in the manner agreed by the Analysis Commission and that the foodstuffs will not be utilized for human consumption. This certificate will accompany the report of the Analysis Commission.

1. It is observed that the amounts of tinned commodities, more especially P Meat 12 oz. tins, being brought before Analysis Commissions for condemnation are increasing.
2. During a recent inspection of stocks of P Meat held at a Distribution Depot, the worst samples of rusty and discoloured tins were opened. Whilst the top of the meat appeared to be slightly discoloured, a thorough examination revealed the contents to be perfectly fresh and fit for consumption.
3. It is thought that some units might not be making a sufficiently thorough inspection of tins opened and having noticed that the appearance of the top of the contents is slightly discoloured, have discarded the whole unnecessarily, and by the time the items are brought up for condemnation they have become completely decomposed. In case of doubt, the opinion of a Medical Officer should always be sought.
4. Would you please issue the necessary instructions that the contents of all tinned commodities of doubtful quality will be thoroughly examined by an officer who will decide whether or not they are fit for consumption.

The damaged goods thought fit for animal consumption are not, as is known, ever credited to the Italian Government.

For this reason, perhaps, the commissions charged with the examination of these foodstuffs do not think it necessary to pronounce about the time when the damage took place and to be precise whether the damage was caused or not before the goods were handed over to the charge of Italian Depots.

Now it seems to this Ministry that for the eventual counter-value credit to the Italian Government, it is necessary to find this out, even in the hypothetical case mentioned above.

As there is in fact reason to believe that the debit price for such goods will be inferior to that established for those fit for human consumption, this Ministry would think it advisable to take notes of those stocks for which the Italian government will have to pay a minor price.

If the MMIA is of this same opinion, would she be so kind as to instruct the L.O.'s accordingly.

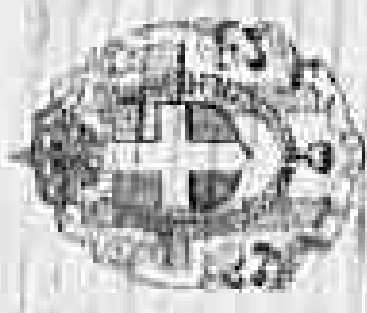

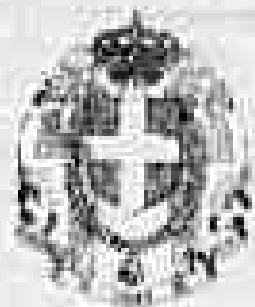

These instructions are based on MIIA Administrative Instruction No. 3 issued 4 June 44, but should there be any points of difference between these instructions and Adm. Instruction No. 3 it is notified for the information of all concerned that these present instructions will constitute the governing document. Any necessary amendments to Adm. Instruction No. 3 will be made and issued in due course.

1. When rations delivered to the Italian Armed Forces by the Allied Military forces are suspected to be unfit for human consumption, at the time of hand-over, the Italian Port Detachment taking delivery will immediately report the fact to the Direzione Commissariato concerned. Officers Commanding Italian Army Food Depots will similarly so report any foodstuffs held by them in their depots which are suspected as unfit for consumption.

2. In all instances where food supplies are reported to the Direzione Commissariato as unfit for consumption, a short "Unfit Subsistence" report will immediately be forwarded to HQ MIIA by the MIIA Sector Liaison Officer.

See Appendix 'A' for proforma to be used.

3. The Direzione Commissariato, on receipt of such reports from Port Detachments or Cs. C. Depots will, by arrangement with the MIIA Sector Liaison Officer concerned, convene an analysis Commission to examine and adjudicate upon the supplies in question.

Analysis Commissions will comprise-

An officer representative of MIIA.

An Italian officer representing the Direzione Commissariato.

An Italian Officer qualified as a chemist or food analyst.

Where necessary an additional independent analyst's report may be obtained.

Commissariato as unit for consumption, will immediately be forwarded to HQ MIA by the MIA Sector Liaison Officer.

See Appendix 'A' for proforma to be used.

3. The Direzione Commissariato, on receipt of such reports from Port Detachments or Es. C. Depots will, by arrangement with the MIA Sector Liaison Officer concerned, convene an Analysis Commission to examine and adjudge upon the supplies in question.

Analysis Commissions will comprise-

- An officer representative of MIA.
- An Italian officer representing the Direzione Commissariato.
- An Italian Officer qualified as a chemist or food analyst.

Where necessary an additional independent analyst's report may be obtained.

4. Analysis Commissions will record facts and record action taken, in accordance with the Analysis Report, pro-forma for which is attached at Appendix 'B'.

This report is required in sextuplicate, copies disposed:-

- {one} 1 copy retained by MIA Sector Liaison Officer
- {one} 1 copy retained by the concerned Direzione Commissariato.
- (Four) 4 copies forwarded to HQ MIA.

5. Action recommended by Analysis Commissions, vide para II of the Analysts Report, may be put into effect forthwith without awaiting confirmation by HQ MIA.

In cases where immediate destruction is decided upon, the Destruction Certificate forming a part of Appendix 'B' will be completed before the Analysis Report is sent forward.

6. After endorsement of Analysis Reports by HQ MIA copies will be dispensed as follows:-

- One (1) Copy to the Italian Ministry of War.
- One (1) Copy to the Direzione Commissariato.
- (Thru MIA Sector L.O. and will be used as a credit voucher to stock record of depot concerned).
- One (1) Copy retained by HQ MIA.
- One (1) Copy to Chief Accountant, (ACC) (If Italian Government is allowed credit)

7. Destruction of foodstuffs as a result of the recommendations of Analysis Commissions will be witnessed by an Allied Commissioned Officer, normally the MIA Sector Liaison Officer, and Destruction Certificate completed accordingly.

8. In cases where it is a matter of urgent necessity to destroy foodstuffs to ensure the safe keeping of other commodities, or in cases where destruction is so urgently required that the Analysis Commission procedure is impracticable, Officers Commanding Italian Army Depots will so inform the MIA Sector Liaison Officer concerned.

The latter will authorize and witness any such destruction and will ensure Analysis Reports and Destruction Certificates are completed as to relevant risks and disposal as stated in para 4 above. The O.C. Italian Army Depot submit a report in writing to the Direzione Commissariato, giving the full circumstances.

9. Foodstuffs found unfit for consumption in Italian Army units and formations will normally be returned to Distribution Depots for replacement in kind. Thereafter they will be dealt with by the concerned Distribution Depot in accordance with these instructions.

10. Foodstuffs unfit for human consumption may be suitable for animal consumption or may contain recoverable fats or other recoverable by products or components. Analysis Commissions will pay particular regard to this point and will recommend disposal to ensure the maximum benefit accrues to Italian and Allied Armed Forces.

11. In NO instance will foodstuffs found unfit for human consumption be replaced in kind to the Italian Armed Forces.

12. The foregoing instructions become effective immediately and you are requested to issue your own instructions accordingly without delay, forwarding a copy to this Headquarters for information.

The undermentioned Board of officers has been assembled in Lecce, to day 26th May 1944, to approve the condemnation of supplies held in the Depot "Villa Zagari" Lecce, according to the authority given by the Italian War Ministry in his letter n° 4488/3 of the 11th May 1944.

The officers of the board examined carefully all the supplies and

ascertained that:

1° - The tins of Italian canned meat represented the remnant of a stock of 274.259 issued to the units and they had been rejected by the same units as being blown or with holes in them.

The meat had been tinned in 1943 and as the tins had always been kept in the proper premises, the decomposition of the meat was probably due to faulty production.

The whole lot was unanimously judged to be for human consumption. The whole lot was grumous, ash coloured, mouldy;

2° - The Canadian flour (192 Kil) was grumous, ash coloured, mouldy; consequently, it was judged to be unfit for human consumption. This flour arrived from the Italian Depot - Brindisi - in March 1944; it was contained into 200 sacks and most of them had absorbed dampness in transit.

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This flour arrived from the Italian Depot - Brindisi - in March 1944; it was contained into 200 sacks and most of them had absorbed dampness in transit.

It was removed into other sacks the quantity mentioned above, being already damaged, could not be issued.

The board judged the 192 Kil. to be suitable for animals.
The members of the Board ascertained that 200 sacks of Canadian flour, owing to dampness absorbed during the transportation, were incriminated with flour that could not be removed and weighed 145 Kil. instead of 100 Kil; thereon it was judged that the consignee should be discharged for the 45 Kil. lost in transit for the reasons already mentioned.

3. - The rice (12 Kil) was green coloured and mouldy; it was judged to be unfit for any consumption;

it was received from the Italian Depot - Bari - in April 1944 and alleged to be already in the condition mentioned above.

4° - The biscuits (Kil.27,200) were also mouldy and unfit for any consumption. They arrived from the Italian Depot - Brindisi - in March 1944, into three tins which did not close properly, as it was stated.

./.

5° - Of the 969 tins of canned beans, 879 were blown or with holes in them caused by rust in transportation and 90 were dubious as partially blown. The board unanimously judged that 379 tins were unfit for any consumption and some of the remnant lot of 90 tins should be examined by the Provincial analyst in order to establish whether the lot should be condemned.

These tins were included in a stock that arrived from the Italian Depot - Crotone - at the beginning of April 1944 and were already damaged when received.

6° - 7° - 8° - The tins of meat and vegetables (1 tin of 6 lb & 12 oz; 3 tins of 30 oz each) cheese (9 tins 12 oz each) and meat (7 tins 16 oz each) were blown or with holes in them and the content was judged to be unfit for any consumption.

The tins were included in a stock received from the Italian Depot - Bari - in April 1944 and already damaged.

On the statements mentioned above, the Board concluded unanimously that:

a) - damages and losses are due to unavoidable accidents and - consequently - the consignee is to be discharged for the following supplies:
