REPORT ON RATIONS.

Several visits have been made to the DID in connection with the drawing of rations for MMIAL.

No faults could be found in the issues made from the DID.

It is pointed out that the quality of fresh fruit and vegetables will deteriorate as the season for that commodity draws to a finish. In addition when contracts are first made by the L.R.O's for a specified quantity of any commodity the contractor through unforeseen circumstances may have to call on another 'grower' for assistance to meet the commitment.

Issues of fresh meat were inspected and were found to be in order, most of the cutting up is done by the British NCO i/c who is a tradesman butcher.

Arrangements were made with the O.C. DID that:-

- (1) Meat would be cut up at the Butchery for as many splits as required by this Mission, i.e. families, Messes etc.
- (2) Ration NCO this Mission attends the Butchery for instruction in the cutting up of meat until such time as he may feel confident of carrying on on his own.

It is finally suggested that any queries on the condition of commodities be forwarded to S & T this Mission who will take the matter up with the O.C. DID.
