

Subject: Monthly Report.

To : G-3 (I)

1. At the beginning of the month, a physical inventory of Italian clothing and equipment was held in all main depots on the mainland, Sicily and Sardinia.
2. On the 10th of October, a physical inventory of Allied Clothing and Equipment was held in all bulk Issue Depots. The quantities reported as a result of the inventory were made the opening figures in a new accounting system at Ordnance, MMIA. The new system is designed to give more up-to-date information as to stocks on hand ready for issue. It is based on a system of daily returns from the depots, acceptance notes for physical receipts and issue vouchers for physical issues. The system was set forth in MMIA Admin. Instr. No. 11.
3. Cpt. Leverett C. Hamilton, Infantry, joined the Ordnance Branch on October 15th.
4. The repair of Allied Clothing in Italian workshops was greatly increased and an accounting system adequate to deal with the increased program was set forth in MMIA Admin. Instruction No. 15.
5. Lt. Ward visited the Ministry of War on Oct. 27th and 28th for conferences with Lt. Col. Nabissi. Reports required of the Ministry of War and the establishment of an accounting system in Rome Clothing and Repair Depot were among the subjects discussed.

- 1 The early part of the month was devoted by the office to the assignment of a standard nomenclature both in English and Italian to the items of Allied Equipment at present in clothing depots intended for issue to Italian troops. A stock number was also assigned each item for purposes of easy reference. The standard nomenclature and stock numbers were set forth in Admin. Instr. # 10
- 2 On Aug. 20, Lt. Ward inspected the store of new Cotton Comforters in the Italian Depot at Rome. The roofing was found to have been adequate against the preceding stormy weather. However no proper fire fighting aids were found. The situation was reported at the Ministry of War in a visit by Lt. Ward on Aug. 21 and action to be taken outlined.
- 3 On Aug. 22, Lt. Ward visited the Clothing Accounting Dept. at the War Ministry in reference to a report of stock states of Allied Clothing submitted by the War Ministry. The reported stock states were in many cases considerably different from the stock states reported by individual depots to Ordnance M.M.I.A. (Main) The Italian accounting authorities agreed to examine their ledgers and scrutinize for possible errors.

Subject: Monthly Report.

1. Frequent visits have been made to the War Ministry by Major Gregson.
2. On 7 Aug., in company with Lt. Colonel Shipley, Major Gregson visited # 70 Base Depot at Civitavecchia to arrange for the movement of comforters and dye from Civitavecchia to Rome for use by the Italian Army. The Italian Station Depot was also visited this date where 176 cartons of various colors of paint were frozen. The U.S. Ordnance Depot # 2 was also visited to suggest they take over the above mentioned paint.
3. On 15 Aug., 1st Lt. John J. Ward was assigned to the Ordnance Branch as assistant to Major Gregson.
4. On 24 Aug. Corporal Brown RACC was attached for temporary duty with the Ordnance Branch pending assignment.
5. On 29 Aug. Major Gregson and Lt. Ward inspected the Italian Clothing Depot. at 186 Via Principe Amedeo, Rome to ascertain the actual quantity of comforters received and obtain the pertinent acceptance notes.
6. On 3 Aug. 46 drums of dye were shipped by rail from Civitavecchia destined for Naples. This shipment became misplaced and the wagon # 17775 was not found until 26 Aug. in the Naples yard. Telephone confirmation has been received from the MIA L/O, Naples, that the amount received constituted 39 1/2 drum. Written confirmation plus an explanation of the delay and shortage are being forwarded to this office.
7. On 31 Aug. Pfc. Anthony Colavito, U. S. and Pvt. Robert McDonough were assigned to the Ordnance Branch for duty.
