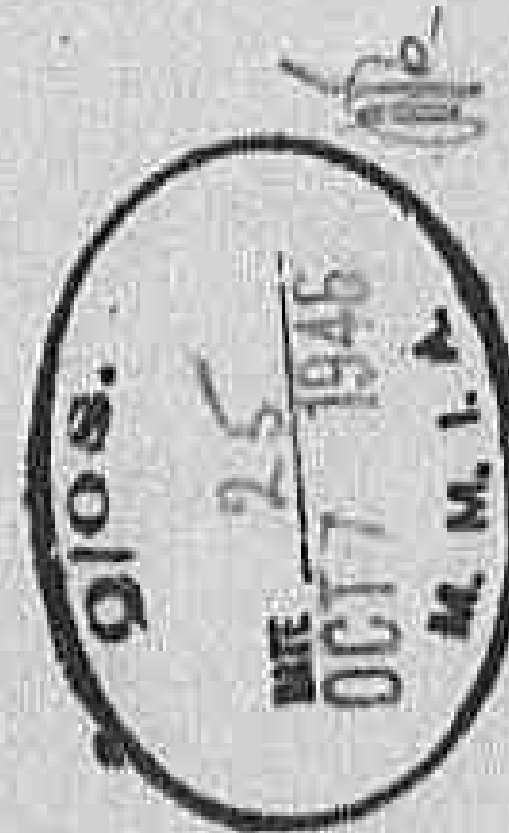

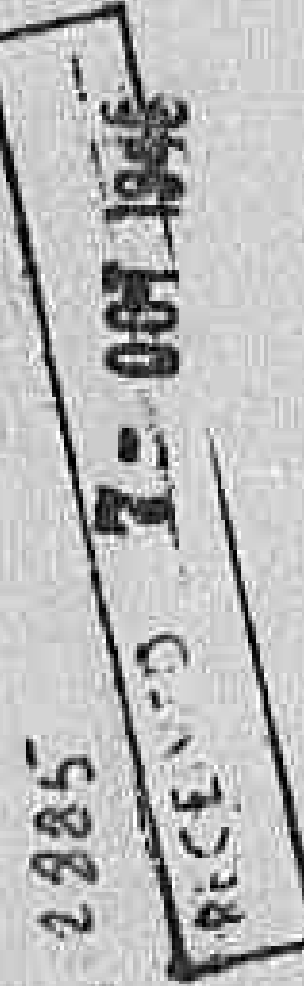

supply of M.T. spares, no instructions have yet been received from Ministry of War on the procedure to be adopted by formations to obtain M.T. spares, the result is that now all Infantry Divisions are attempting to buy spares a costly and unsatisfactory procedure. Is it at all possible to hasten Ministry of War to lay down a set procedure to be adopted by Divisions when they require spare parts.

Ministry of War have not yet given permission to occupy the barracks at Monza which is required for use as a Technical stores Depot, if permission could be given soon most of the difficulties re supply of stores could be smoothed out, as the Italians could lay directives re supply of stores from the Depot.

Vote 7.

Divisions are still short of all vote 7 items, it is realized however that no vote 7 stores can be obtained from British sources.

Vote 8.

There is still a shortage of cils for small arms and Artillery equipments, also of British sizes of spanners which are not manufactured in Italy. (B.S.W. B.S.F. etc).

General.

I have had great difficulty in obtaining the lists of M.T. spare parts held by Legnano Inf Div which are required by 2 District, this difficulty is only natural as a matter of two thousand ledger headings are involved and the O.P.P. are at the moment very short handed. I have been to Bergamo myself, a distance of 150 miles, and have almost completed the lists. Great difficulty is still being

experienced in keeping the transport of the Infantry Divisions on the road, owing to the complete lack of M.T. spare parts. It is hoped that the 60 days maintenance pack, at present held at Bologna, will soon be issued to an Italian Stores Depot from where it can be distributed, it is emphasised that if the Infantry Divisions do not get some M.T. spares very soon their transport will be entirely off the road.

Wireless and Artillery spares seem to be still in fairly good supply from the Div. O.F.Ps, this state cannot last much longer however unless a source of supply to the O.F.Ps is found, at present they are existing on stocks provided before 15 November 1945.

Small Arm spares are required, these are also included in the 60 days maintenance pack, and as the Italians cannot replace BLR small arms at the moment, it is vital that those they have be kept in a good state of repair. Flannelette is another item that is urgently required.

Armourers tools are required by 4 C.A.R., they have no tools at all for the repair of small arms, this fact has already been reported to M.M.I.A. by G.S.O. 1 of this B.L.U., also if the Territorial Regiment is to be equipped with British Arms, they will require Armourers tools and a scaling of spare parts for small arms.

Vote 8.

The only report I have had re shortages in vote 8 is oil for small arms and special oils for Artillery Equipments (Oil Dag - Buffer Oil - Grease Graphited etc) these oils are not available on the local market, and damage to Artillery Equipments may be caused if the wrong type of oil is used.

Vote 7.

As usual, the Divisions are short of all vote 7 items, boots, socks, and K.D. clothing being the most important items. This shortage does affect the morale of the troops, as it is quite impossible to keep discipline if the troops have to walk about in old K.D. clothing and worn out boots.

General.

Assistance is requested to get the Italian Tech. Stores Depot functioning, the officers concerned are all keen and experienced in Tech. Stores, but require guidance on such points as provisioning and scalings. I have assisted as far as I can and am now waiting for permission to occupy a barracks at Monza for use as a Depot, this matter is being considered by the Italian Ministry of War at the moment, it is hoped that they will give a decision soon.

Subject: Summer clothing for the "Friuli" Division.

Further to your verbal request we forward the attached list in which is shown:

- a)- Quota of summer clothing reported as held by the Friuli Division at the end of last winter;
- b)- The allocation already ordered by this Ministry for the above Division, to complete scale of issue laid down for Army Units;
- c) - Further allocation (being made at present) just ordered by this Ministry in order to satisfy the urgent requirements pointed out by the a/n HQ in order to replace recruits clothing who are arriving at Units under its command.

I would point out that the scale of issue for each man consists of 1 khaki uniform, 2 shirts and 1 pair of shorts, from examination of these figures and their comparison with the strength of the Division, we deduce that:

- 1°- Summer clothing has been ensured in sufficient quantity to cover Unit requirements;
- 2°- Even allowing for a certain percentage of waste when the clothing is issued, this will not be large enough to compromise normal service orders;
- 3°- Present allocations, ordered on the basis of a telegraphic request from the Friuli Division should, anyway, settle any deficiencies, in view of the fact that this request has been met in full.

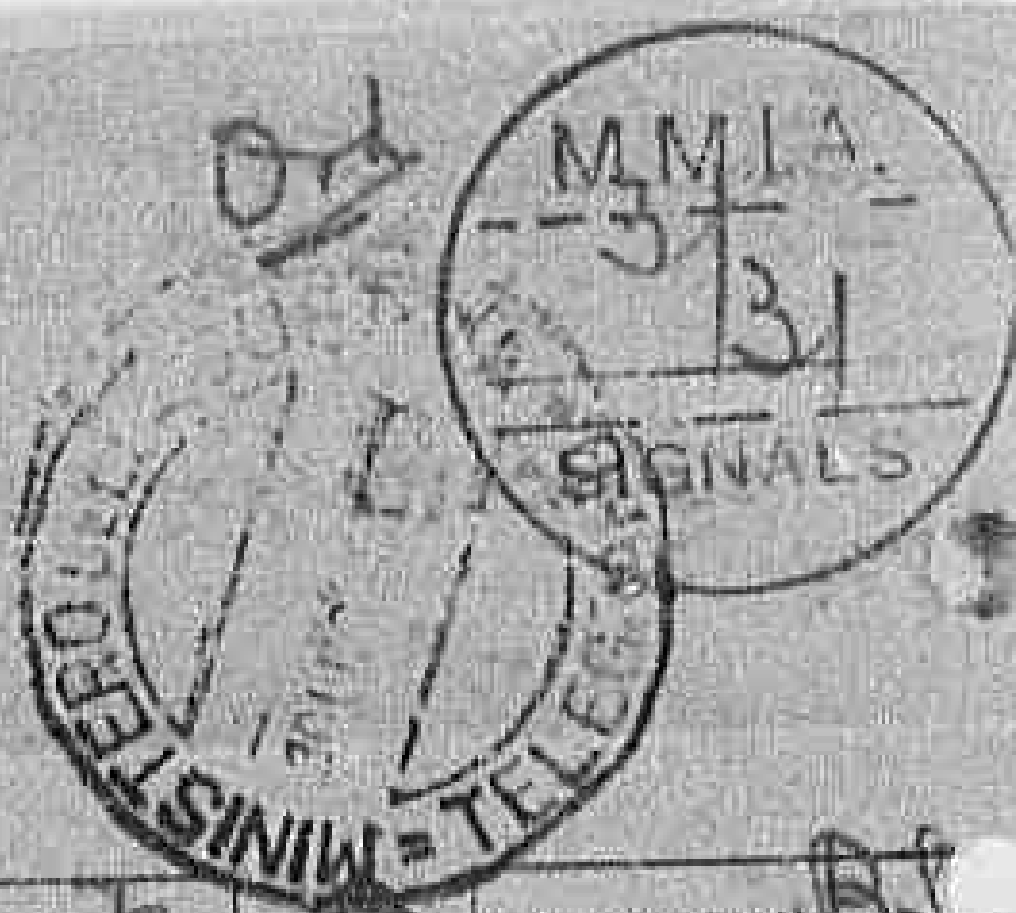

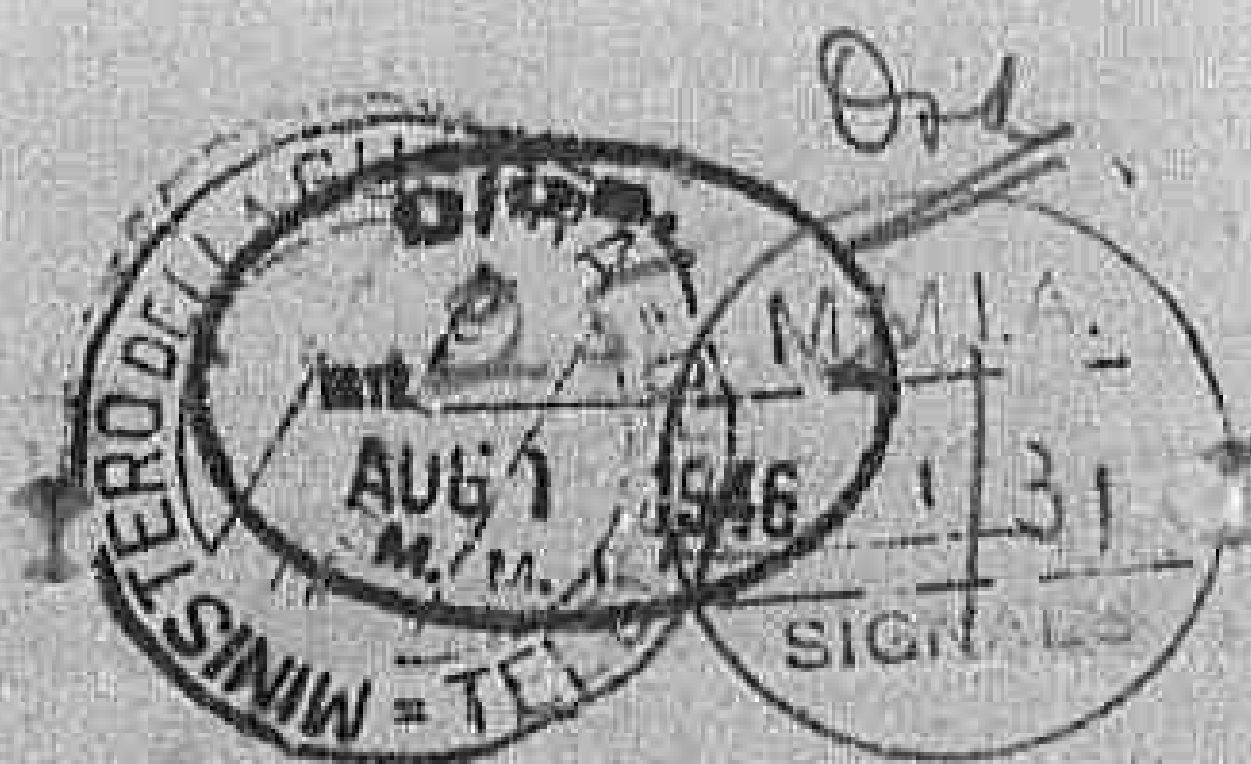
