3. Repair of Stores.

In dealing with repairs to Vote 8 Stores, full use should be made of repair cannibalisation.

Before any repairs of an extensive nature are undertaken the estimated man hours to be expended in relation to the raw materials likely to be conserved should be assessed. If the repair is likely to prove uneconomical, i.e. the cost of labour and material being more than the cost of the new article, then the article should, as a general rule, be condemned as unserviceable.

This principle however, must obviously be applied with discretion, since departure from it may occasionally be warranted by special local conditions, e.g. scarcity of raw material or urgency of a requirement.

Subject:- REPAIR OF MOSQUITO AND SANDFLY NETS WITH BASTICK

1. The following method of repair of Mosquito or Sandfly Nets and Curtains by the use of bastick cement instead of by the usual method of sewing on patches, is notified for the information of all concerned.
2. Application: The maximum size hole with which Bastick can be successfully used is 1" diam. The patch necessary for repairing the hole should be 2" diam., giving $\frac{1}{2}$ " overlap circumferentially.
Calico patches are preferable to netting.
In all tears, cuts and even holes where the net is missing, e.g. burns, it is only necessary to fix the patch on one side of the net or curtain.
The smallest amount of Bastick possible should be used to cover the entire area of the patch. No advantage is derived from using large quantities of Bastick.
The final treatment is to cover the patched area liberally with French Chalk or saddle powder. This is most important.
3. Experiments have shown that this method of repairing Mosquito and Sandfly Nets and Curtains, increases the output by 40% and arrangements should be made for its adoption to the fullest possible extent.
