SUBJECT:- MELIS G. Battista - culpable homicide.

Reference letter 201/A of 17.1.1946

Letters 116806/I/1 and 122272/I/P of this Ministry dated 26 August and 19 November last respectively replied to letters 201/A of your M.M.I.A. dated 21 August and 30 September 1946.

With regard to the present position of the accused MELIS; we consider it irrelevant as to whether he is or is not serving, as regards the authority to try him would in any case be within the jurisdiction of the Military Tribunal.

This Ministry assures you that it will give the question of MELIS its full attention, as it has never ceased to do. We would point out however, also with the object of furthering the matter, that the intervention of this Ministry can only assume an indirect form as the question of MELIS - a strictly judicial matter - must be settled by the Naples Military Tribunal. The office directly commanding and supervising the military judicial offices is the Military Procura General which, it appears to this Ministry, has already seriously approached the Procura of Naples in accordance with the wishes of your M.M.I.A.

1. The Italian Army Strength State and Order of Battle as at 9 June 45 (No: 2/10) shows No: 2 General Tot Coy (Combat) (i.e. 2o Reparto Transporti) - W.E. CM 531, 532, 533 + 539/1 - as being a British-Iti Unit, at that time located at SESANO. The unit is shown as being under command 5 Army (LEGNANO D.P.).
2. As this appears to be the unit to which 6 COMILITER are referring, it is confirmed that it was under British Command at the time in question.
3. Correspondence (Italian) is returned as requested. English copy is retained for reference.

As, following the accident, a law suit for damages has been initiated, you are kindly requested to let us have, as soon as possible, a statement (in quadruple) declaring that the above mentioned truck is Allied property.

SUBJECT : WILHELM BATTISTA - Guiltless Victim.

Further to this HQ letter to 201 A, dated 9 Dec 46.

1. Allied Force Headquarters have instructed us to take this matter up again most insistently with your Ministry.
2. It is pointed out that, prior to our letter referred to above, we had previously communicated with you on this subject on 21 Aug, 46 and on 30 Sep 46, both references 201 A.
3. Will you please, therefore, give this case your urgent attention and inform us definitely whether the a/n soldier is still in the Army or not. If he is still in the Army, will you please arrange for him to be brought to trial on the charge indicated above without further delay.
4. If he has, on the other hand, been finally discharged from the Army, A.F.H.Q. insist that particulars of his present address and whereabouts be obtained and action taken to have him brought to trial before a Criminal Court under civil jurisdiction.
5. Your attention is again drawn to the fact that he was found directly responsible for the death of three British soldiers by a Court of Enquiry held after the occurrence.
6. Sixteen months have now elapsed since the event took place. As you are well aware, this is not the first occasion when you have failed to bring a man to trial within a reasonable period at the request of the Allies. I am directed to say that you will give this matter your immediate attention.

1. You will establish definitely whether or not the above named man has been discharged from the Army. If he has, obtain particulars of his present address, and take all possible action to persuade the Italian Government to try him before a Civil Court.
2. If he is still in the Army, he should be brought for trial by Court Martial without any further delay.
3. You are reminded that a Court of Enquiry found him directly responsible for an accident on 22 August 1945 which resulted in three British soldiers being killed.
