SUBJECT: Message Precedence

TO : Commanding Officer, Each Unit This Command

1. In many instances, units presently being serviced by Signal and Message Centers, this Headquarters, are violating seriously, established regulations and directives affecting precedence utilization in the transmission of signals. To alleviate these malpractices, the precedences shown in the following chart will be followed:

1. Only Commanders of separate commands or their specifically designated authorities are authorized use of MOST IMMEDIATE (Ir) or URGENT (Am) precedence. Usual isolated examples may be quoted to Signal Officer for necessary authorization. It is emphasized that the precedence "URGENT" is an American classification comparable to British "MOST IMMEDIATE".

2. Signal Officer, this Command, has been instructed to bring to personal attention of Commanding Officer, any future violations.

3. Due to present acute shortage of personnel, signals can only be processed efficiently if justifiable precedences are affixed to outgoing messages. In no instance will unwarranted precedence be given to compensate for administrative delays.

4. It is the direct responsibility of Commanding Officer, each Unit, to bring this letter to the personal attention of all Officers and other ranks involved in the handling or processing of outgoing signals.

5. Violations detected by units not under direct control of this Headquarters, will be forwarded to AFHQ, WFOUSA or GRC CMT for necessary action.

2- Discipline and Morale.

Reports from Territorial HQ's and GAR's report that discipline is generally good and morale improving: A serious incident occurred at the GAR BRESCIA, during which the troops made certain demands concerning pay, leave, housing, and family allowances. It is considered that, though some of the complaints may, in the main, have been justifiable, the method of their presentation was chiefly due to political and anti-army elements from outside. Conditions of this GAR are again normal.

3- Public Relations.

A public relations organization under Col. FIORI-VERBAZZA has been set up by the Ministry of War. A P.R. officer at each Territorial HQ is envisaged. It is hoped that this organization will quickly improve both morale in the army itself and the esteem with which the army is held by the public.

4- Welfare: Purchase of Sports Kit.

Ministry of War have allotted the sum of three million lire for the purchase of sports kit. An agreement has been made with C.E.P.I., GHI, to sell sports kit of this value to the Italian Army. A meeting has been arranged between Chief Supply officer, RFI and a Ministry of War representative to complete the purchase. In addition to this, purchases of sports kit have been made by BOLOGNA Military Command and GAR, GENOVA from RFI.

CC.FP. BULLETIN No. 2.

Note:-

The contents of this Bulletin is primarily for the information of CC.FP. Liaison Officers with CC.FP. Brigades and is intended to offer a general appreciation of the situation regarding the re-organisation of CC.FP., together with items of specific interest.

1. ADMINISTRATION. GHQ. CC.FP. have agreed that personnel returning from interment and not likely to be actively employed in the near future, shall not be clothed from CC.FP. stocks, but by the "CENTRAL ALLOCAT".

The serious position regarding supply of stationary and office equipment, is appreciated by this HQ. It was hoped that some assistance would be given from Allied sources but investigation showed that supplies in this country were equal to, if not better than those at home. It is presumed therefore, that finance is again the problem. Obviously CC.FP. administration will suffer seriously if these essentials are lacking. LOs should discuss this problem with Legion Commanders, and if they consider the position as grave as has been stated verbally, Legion Commanders should submit their complaints in writing to GHQ. Suitable pressure will be applied by this HQ for practical assistance to be given to Legions. Copies of CHQ replies to Legions should be forwarded to this office for information.

In a letter dated 9th APRIL, addressed to GHQ, it was stated that the present method of distributing PL was considered uneconomical. It was recommended that PL supplies within Legions be drawn by the sub-unit concerned, (Groups, CCys, Terrances etc.) from C.I.P pumps or depots, and that coupons be supplied for this purpose; the existing method of supply for Mobile Bus. to remain. Acceptance of this recommendation is awaited.

HQ.CC.FP. state that it is confident that about 50% of the personnel of the 10,000 increase can be enlisted from CC.FP. at present in (Germany) by the end of MAY. These CC.FP. have expressed

HQ.CC.R. state that it is confident that about 50% of the personnel of the 10,000 increase can be enlisted from CC.R. at present in 'Congenial', by the end of MAY. These CC.R. have expressed the desire to return to service; they will be recruited locally by Legions, and as they are ex-CC.R., should be immediately available for duty when re-enlisted. Another 1300 are expected from returned POW sources. Until more clothing is available, they will be clothed from existing Legion stocks, which will have the effect of allowing down new issues and replacements of clothing to CC.R. at present in service.

By the end of May the strength of small stations should be not less than 7 men. Orders have been given by CC.R. HQ for all personnel dispersed from Mobile Hqs to be returned to Mobile En Hqs.

It is also proposed by GHQ.CC.R. to use CC.R. of the TRIESTE Legion (until if and when required to be activated at TRIESTE) as reserve Companies of about 350 strong at Group Hqs at LESSANTRI, PULZANO, VERONA, LIVORNO, ANCONA, ARRUZZI, CATANZARO and ESSILA, as land carrying vehicles become available, these Companies will be in the nature of a reserve (mobile) force.

Ordinary recruiting is proceeding satisfactorily.

168 STANCHION ARMOR. Cars have been allotted to CC.BR. and are being collected from KALLES, AMBASS, BOLGOM and FOMI. Mobile BRs should be in physical possession of these Vehicles by the end of April. Ministry of War has been informed it is considered light tanks and obsolete armored cars at present held by Mobile BRs should be handed in for disposal within 7 days of receipt of STANCHIONS. LOS are requested to assist by hastening as possible.

3. WAR ESTABLISHMENT. W.E. for Mobile BRs has been agreed and copies will be forwarded to LOS under separate cover.

Ministry of War has been requested to provide to a W.E. for workshops to be attached to each Legion HQ. In view of the varying number of vehicles held by each Legion, it has been recommended that three types of War Establishment be implemented, to be known as types A, B and C, based on total holdings.
