- (a) False accusations of cowardice against Col. CALABRO who commanded the NAPLES Legion at the time of the German occupation.
- (b) Simulating sickness at the same period and thus avoiding his duty.
- (c) Being a communist and a disrupting influence in CC.RR NAPLES. Friend of MANCINI and PALERMO (local communist leaders).
- (d) Supplying confidential material to "La Voce" (local communist paper) for articles vilifying CALABRO.
- (e) General conduct unbecoming a CC.RR officer.
- (f) Too long in one station.
- (g) Ingratiating himself with Allied officers by giving parties, etc. in his house.

With regard to (a) and (b) an enquiry was held by CC.RR in which both officers were exonerated. However CALABRO was transferred. (c) Evidence to support this accusation is not forthcoming. He is a friend of neither MANCINI nor PALERMO, but has had official dealings with MANCINI over epuration matters. All allied security and intelligence units are firmly of the opinion that he is anti-communist and a monarchist. I have seen reports made by him showing clearly that he is anti-communist. In Jan 1944 he denounced Brig. OTTAKE, CC.RR, a fervent communist, for disobeying orders. He dismissed a M.M. VILLANO from CS because of communist sympathies.

- (d) Confidential information was supplied to "La Voce" concerning CALABRO. It is deduced that PECORELLA supplied this because of a feud existing between the two men, and it is not known that any person other than PECORELLA possessed this information.
- (e) This vague accusation implies that he is engaged in black market activities and that his circle of acquaintances contains a number of undesirables. This matter of internal discipline is not supported by evidence.
- (f) He has been 10 years in staff appointments. It is contrary to CC.RR regulations that personnel should do over 4 years in staff positions and therefore his transfer on these grounds is reasonable.
- (g) This accusation is untrue and, again, is not supported by evidence.

3. FECONELLA has done extremely good work for the Allies, who have a high regard for him. He is certainly unpopular with GHQ, CC.RR, but their insistence on his transfer leads one to think that there is more behind the matter.
4. I do not feel that any harm will be done if FECONELLA is allowed to remain at NAPLES as long as the Allied Authorities need his services.

Reference conversation Lt Col YOUNG - Maj CUNY of 5 Jan 46 on Subject.

1. An investigation has been made by this Staff and by 312 PSS NAPLES into the allegations referred to in the above conversation, and nothing has come to light to alter the viewpoint held by 3 District as expressed in para 2 of our letter of even number dated 13 Dec 45 on CS personalities.

2. It is proposed to review briefly the latest series of accusations against Subject.

(a) Firstly, "that he is a close personal friend of Mario PALERMO. "PALERMO is, of course, the most prominent racketeer in the NAPLES area and a very considerable dossier on him is held by 312 PSS. Nothing has ever come to light which suggests that PECORELLA is in his service or has extensive dealings either overtly or covertly with this individual. It would be difficult to imagine a more notorious character in NAPLES for a CS personality to associate with and it would be the extreme folly for any responsible official in PECORELLA's position to have dealings with him.

It must be added that PECORELLA enjoyed the confidence of both Major HARARI and Captain CARTWRIGHT, two I(b) officers who were highly conversant with the intrigues and personalities of the NAPLES area, and is regarded in the same light by the present staff. The present PSO of 312 PSS and his political section, who keep detailed information on NAPLES personalities, were surprised at the attempt to link PECORELLA and PALERMO when they were asked to investigate the alleged connection.

(b) That PECORELLA in the "instigator, if not author, of articles in the NAPLES Communist paper, attacking the CC.RR."

For the past three months no articles of this sort have appeared in the "VOCE" newspaper which is daily scrutinized by 312 PSS. Some time would, of course, be necessary to discover the author of anti-CC.RR. utterances prior to this period. However, PECORELLA's political sympathies, as all who study his appreciations and reports and know him personally agree, are certainly not Communist. He is indeed somewhat anti-left in his views but is free from the political monarchist right-wing bias, characteristic of the CS service.

(c) It is not proposed to make any excuse for PECORELLA's alleged conduct during the famous "Four Days" when the German Command was evacuating from NAPLES, as it is felt that the instances cited, even if true, are typical of what must have occurred in a multitude of cases.

(d) "PECORELLA entertains Allied Officers....beyond his means". This is taken to mean that he is in receipt of illegal "subsidies" and that he holds his position of trust by reason of his indirect bribing of Allied

The present FSO of J12 FSS and his political section, who keep detailed information on NAPLES personalities, were surprised at the attempt to link PECORELLA and PALERMO when they were asked to investigate the alleged connection.

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(d) "PECORELLA entertains Allied Officers....beyond his means". This is taken to mean that he is in receipt of illegal "subsides" and that he holds his position of trust by reason of his indirect bribing of Allied officials. This allegation is considered to be the most comic and at the same time the most valuable of those listed as it is so readily refuted.

(1) For the past four months, PECORELLA has offered no entertainment or good cheer (beyond that on a Xmas card) to the present I(b) Staff at J District. This would surely be a grievous omission for a skilled intriguer as suggested.

(ii) Major HARARI occasionally invited PECORELLA to dine in a civilian restaurant. PECORELLA on one occasion invited Capt ROBERTS, then of the I(b) Staff District, to his home to dinner.

(iii) Lt ASHWORTH, the present FSO, has had no social connections whatsoever with CS. Capt CARTWRIGHT is known to have been swimming with PECORELLA. The FS Section in NAPLES could not recall any extensive entertainment whatsoever.

(iv) Since the death of his son about a year ago, which had a greatly saddening influence on PECORELLA (and for which he is still in mourning) he has led a retired life.

3. PECORELLA has been known to express himself (not to the G-2 or G-3 at District) resignedly on the campaign which he knows is waged against him. He says that he knows that a certain Colonel, a Neapolitan who dislikes the fact that PECORELLA remains in NAPLES whilst he himself cannot, is determined to unship him. Further, he knows that when the Allies leave, his position will be untenable.

4. To sum up

(a) if PECORELLA is the undesirable type recorded in the series of denunciations against him, he has succeeded in deceiving I(b) staffs and FS for a very considerable time, during which he has been under close observation in NAPLES.

(b) some of the denunciations are, to say the least, feeble and have no particular bearing on his present efficiency as a CS officer (i.e. the Four Days).

If this defence is negative, on the positive side it must be recorded that he has worked loyally and well for a series of I(b) officers and that his removal from NAPLES would be greatly deplored by FS and Staff alike.

5. It is hoped that the opinion of those British officers who have worked with Subject, will offset the tendentious condemnations from a distance, condemnations which, in the opinion of the writer, spring from a personal feuding and not from honest opinion.

Reference your CBI 389.514/21-3 dated 21 Nov. '45 and this HQ A 300/I2 dated 24 Nov. '45 addressed to Ministry of War, copy to you.

1. Two further communications on this subject have been received from the Ministry of War; one dated 29 Nov. marked A and attached, one dated 4 Dec. marked B and attached.

2. It will be seen that AFHQ orders to cancel Major PECORELLA's transfer have now been complied with. It is felt, however, that there are certain aspects of this case which may not be known at AFHQ and on which you should be informed.

On June 8 '45 the M3 Branch of the Ministry of War issued an order transferring Major PECORELLA as a result of disciplinary action. On receiving a copy of this order the CO of 808 CS Bn (IAI), realizing that the order could not be put into effect without Allied approval, got the Italian Chief of Staff to write to the Ministry of War on the 26 June and explain why the order could not be carried out. At the same time the CO of 808 CS Bn wrote to the AFHQ LO and asked for approval before carrying out the order. A copy of this letter is attached marked C. On 29 June the AFHQ LO reported in writing to AFHQ that the Ministry of War had issued an order for the transfer of Major PECORELLA, but unfortunately, he made no mention of the fact that formal Allied approval had been sought or that no action in the matter was being taken by the Italian authorities until approval was received. It appears, therefore, that although an order was issued, it appears, taken on it and the Italian authorities were in fact acting in good faith and quite properly in the matter.

3. On the 5 July AFHQ wrote to MMIA suspending the transfer of Major PECORELLA and

3. On the 5 July AFHQ wrote to MIAA suspending the transfer of Major PECORELLA and asking for a report of the facts of the case. After sundry investigations the contents of this letter were passed to the Ministry of War on 23 July. There then followed delay after delay on the part of the Ministry of War which though inexcusable, are accounted for in part by the fact that they called for a full report on this officer from HQ CS.BR and that Major PECORELLA's dossier was held by the Evacuation Commission.

4. As far as the interests of the officer himself are concerned in this matter there are two aspects. Firstly, as will be seen from the letter marked A, he has not served with Territorial Command for eight years and it would be in his

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interests to do so. Secondly, if the Ministry of War consider that he is using the Allies as a shield to avoid this transfer, he may suffer for it when Allied Control is ultimately withdrawn.

5. There is no doubt that the Commanding General of the CC.NR and the Ministry of War feel very strongly over the question of this transfer. Quite apart from the incident in 1943, they consider that the associations Major PECORELLA has formed in NAPLES are unsatisfactory and undesirable.

It is felt that having regard to all the circumstances of the case and the fact that honour has been satisfied and control of the rest of the Army has now been handed back to the Ministry of War, AFHQ should reconsider the cancellation of this transfer, in the future interest of all concerned.

Subject: Major PECORELLA Camillo - Reg. CC.RR.

Reference letter A 300/I2 dated 24/II/45.

1. I have cancelled Major PECORELLA's transfer.
2. The report concerning this officer, requested in your letter A 300/I2 dated 14/9/45 was forwarded by the Dependent General Dir. Officer Personnel to the General Staff Information Officer only on the 26 of this month, due to the fact that the above Gen. Dir. was not in possession of the officer's dossier, held by the Epuration Commission.
3. I point out that the serious reasons for the action taken concerning Major PECORELLA still exist and do not only refer to his behaviour at the time of the Armistice, for which he was punished by a reprimand, but are found above all in the basis of a report from the Gen. HQ of the CC.RR Corps in which it is reported that, being an officer for many years at NAPLES and due to his unsincere character and the numerous friends and acquaintances made there, he is a somewhat undesirable element and harmful to the brotherly spirit of the corps in a centre so important and so highly sensitive.
3. The above HQ has pointed out, moreover, the advisability, also in the officer's interest, that he should be transferred from the Intelligence Corps to a Territorial Gen HQ, a post he has not held for about 8 years.

Subject: Report on the factors determining the awarding of "reprimand" to Major Camillo PECORELLA, CC RR (Regular Army Officer.)

On the 8 Sep. 43, the date of the Armistice, Major PECORELLA was on duty with the CC RR Legion, NAPLES as Major Adjutant.

Just after the Armistice, on the 11 Sep., the Commanding Officer of the Legion, CC RR, Colonel CALABRO, acting upon orders received from the Naples Military Territorial HQ, ordered his Adjutant, Major PECORELLA to prepare a circular (phonogram by hand) addressed to all the CC RR HQs located along the line from NAPLES to SALERNO. In this message they were ordered to inform the Legion HQ of all warlike operations and of the various localities in which encounters between German and Anglo-American troops had been noted.

This circular was signed "by order", by Major PECORELLA, who arranged for its delivery to the units concerned, by means of 3 carabinieri dressed in civilian clothes.

On the morning of the 12 Sept. the city of NAPLES was militarily occupied by the Germans, and at 10.00 hrs on the same day the city authorities were summoned to the Parco Hotel, at which gathering were also present Colonel CALABRO and Major PECORELLA.

During this meeting the German Colonel SCHOLL read the proclamation directed to the citizens, and gave orders for the disarming of the population and the armed forces (including carabinieri).

On the 14 September, Major PECORELLA was called to the office of Colonel CALABRO, wherein took place a conversation between General RADICE, the said Colonel CALABRO and Sergeant LAZZARO, liaison interpreter between the CC RR Legion and the German HQ.

During this conversation Major PECORELLA learned that

upon orders received from the Naples Military Territorial HQ, ordered his Adjutant, Major PECORELLA to prepare a circular (phonogram by hand) addressed to all the CC RR HQs located along the line from NAPLES to SALERNO. In this message they were ordered to inform the Legion HQ of all warlike operations and of the various localities in which encounters between German and Anglo-American troops had been noted.

During this conversation Major PECORELLA learned that all the police duties and functions had been centralized under the command of a Senior Officer of the Royal Finance Guard; the CC.RR also came under this command, and thus, in this manner, Colonel CALABRO was relieved of his Command, without having been received, as was usual, by the German Colonel SCHOLL.

Major PECORELLA, during this conversation also discovered that Colonel CALABRO was greatly alarmed, having learned from the interpreter LAVEZZO, that the German colonel was angry with the CC.RR because a carabinieri had been arrested in civilian clothes, and that in his possession had been found the circular letter issued by the Legion, requesting news of warlike operations.

Colonel SCHOLL had thereby gathered that the CC. RR were favourably disposed towards collaborating with the Allies, and it was precisely because of this occurrence that Colonel SCHOLL had decided to disarm the CC. RR and to shoot in the Piazza Plebiscito, the Prefect, and perhaps the said Colonel CALABRO.

Colonel CALABRO worried because of this news, and believing that he would lose his life from one moment to another, decided to get away temporarily from the Legion. With this in mind, he instructed Major PECORELLA to go before 16.00 hrs to General RADICE (with whom he was already in agreement) and to accompany the latter to the German Colonel SCHOLL in order to point out that the circular letter issued on the 11 had been cancelled on the following day, the 12th; they were also at the same time to justify the Colonel's (CALABRO) absence.

Colonel CALABRO, while handing over to Major PECORELLA the two aforementioned circulars in an envelope, said, by way of conclusion: "PECORELLA, on this hangs my life", thereby stressing the importance of the mission. Major PECORELLA, giving explicit confirmation that he would carry out that which had been entrusted to him added "be calm".

But Major PECORELLA, worried no less than his superior officer, prepared himself for a hasty escape from the barracks, entrusting Captain ROMANELLI with the task. He knew that ROMANELLI was serious and experienced, and he reminded him to confide in General RADICE, and to go together with the latter to the German HQ.

Captain ROMANELLI, thinking that the necessary instructions were contained in the envelope, accepted the task without asking PECORELLA for any further clarification.

Having learned that in the envelope there were only two copies of circulars, he gave no sovereign importance to the task he had accepted, and on the morning of the next day, handed over the said envelope to another officer.

Therefore the envelope, which was of the greatest importance to Colonel CALABRO, was delivered only after great delay.

From study of the above the following facts arise:

Colonel CALABRO, while handing over to Major PECORELLA the two aforementioned circulars in an envelope, said, by way of conclusion: "PECORELLA, on this hangs my life", thereby stressing the importance of the mission. Major PECORELLA, giving explicit confirmation that he would carry out that which had been entrusted to him added "be calm".

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From study of the above the following facts arise:-

- that PECORELLA failed in his duty towards his own C.O., Colonel CALABRO, in that he did not carry out instructions entrusted to him, despite giving assurances to that effect;
- that the said PECORELLA has, furthermore, failed in his duty in that he passed the assignment on to Captain ROMANELLI without ensuring himself that the Captain was fully aware of the task he was expected to perform, the documents handed over, or the importance which such a mission held for Colonel CALABRO.

In view of the above mentioned breaches of conduct, the Minister, on the 24 May 45 awarded Major PECORELLA, CO.RN (Reg. Army Officer) a "reprimand" for the following reasons:-

" While Major-Adjutant to the Legion Commandant, and having from the latter had a most important assignment concerning his very life, and having given formal assurance that the said assignment would be carried out, he did not attend to this personally, but hurriedly entrusted the matter to another officer without assuring himself that this officer had fully understood what he had to do. Thus his said assignment was incompletely carried out, and with great delay - a delay which might have caused great prejudice to the person of his Commandant. He therefore failed to show that sense of devotion due to his superior, with whom he had always worked in close co-operation."

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During this conversation Major Pecorella learned that all the police duties and functions had been centralized under the command of a Senior Officer of the Royal Finance Guard; the CC.RR also came under this command, and thus, in this manner, Colonel CALABRÒ was relieved of his command, without having been received, as was usual, by the German, Colonel Scholl.

Major Pecorella, during this conversation, also discovered that Colonel CALABRÒ was greatly alarmed, having learned from the interpreter LAVEZZO, that the German colonel was angry with the CC.RR because a carabiniere had been arrested in civilian clothes, and in his possession had been found the circular letter issued by the Legion, requesting news of warlike operations. Colonel Scholl had thereby gathered that the CC.RR were favourably disposed towards collaborating with the Allies.

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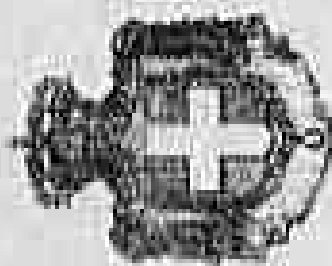

Alla data dell'armistizio, 8 settembre 1943, il maggiore PECORELLA prestava servizio presso la Legione CC.RR. di Napoli quale aiutante maggiore in 1°.

Subito dopo l'armistizio, e precisamente il giorno 11 settembre 1943, il comandante la legione col.cc.rr. CALABRO', per ordine ricevuto dal Comando Militare Territoriale di Napoli, dava incarico all'A.M. maggiore Pecorella di preparare una circolare (fonogramma a mano) diretta a tutti i comandi cc.rr. dislocati lungo le direttrici di marcia Napoli-Salerno, con la quale veniva disposto di informare il comando legione di tutte le operazioni belliche e delle varie località in cui si verificavano scontri fra truppe tedesche ed anglo-americane.

Tale circolare venne firmata "d'ordine" dal maggiore Pecorella che ne curò il recapito agli enti interessati a mezzo di 3 carabinieri in abito civile.

Il mattino del giorno 12, la città di Napoli venne militarmente occupata dai tedeschi e, alle ore 10 dello stesso giorno, le autorità cittadine furono convocate all'hotel Parco ove intervennero anche il colonnello CALABRO' ed il maggiore PECORELLA.

Durante tale riunione il colonnello tedesco Scholl, lesse il proclama rivolto alla cittadinanza e dette disposizioni per il disarmo della popolazione e dei corpi armati (carabinieri compresi).

Il giorno 14 settembre il maggiore Pecorella fu chiamato nell'ufficio del colonnello CALABRO' dove si svolgeva un colloquio fra il generale RADICE, il colonnello CALABRO' medesimo ed il serg. magg. LAVEZZO, interprete di collegamento tra la legione cc.rr. ed il comando tedesco.

Durante tale colloquio il maggiore Pecorella poté apprendere tutte le funzioni di polizia erano state accentrate nelle mani di un ufficiale superiore della RR. Guardia di Finanza alle cui dipendenze vennero posti anche i Carabinieri Reali, che il colonnello CALABRO' veniva in modo esautorato e che lo stesso non era neppure stato ricevuto, come di consueto, dal colonnello tedesco Scholl.

Il maggiore Pecorella, durante tale colloquio, poté anche constatare che il colonnello CALABRO' era molto allarmato, avendo appreso, dall'interprete LAVEZZO, che il colonnello tedesco era indignato contro i CC.RR. per il fatto che, essendone stato fermato uno in abito civile, trovato in possesso della nota circolare diramata dalla legione per aver notizie delle operazioni belliche, aveva ritenuto che essi carabinieri fossero disposti a favorire e a cooperare con gli alleati.

Ed era appunto per tale avvenimento che il colonnello tedesco Scholl aveva fatto disarmare i carabinieri ed aveva deciso di far fucilare in piazza Plebiscito il Prefetto e, forse, anche lo stesso colonnello cc.rr. CALABRO.

Il colonnello CALABRO, preoccupato per tali notizie e ritenendo di dover perdere la vita da un momento all'altro, decise di allontanarsi temporaneamente dalla legione. Allo scopo, dette incarico al maggiore Pecorella di recarsi prima delle ore 16 dal generale Radice (col quale era già d'accordo) e con questi, dal colonnello tedesco Scholl per chiarire che la nota circolare diramata il giorno 11 era stata annullata il successivo giorno 12 e per giustificare, nel contempo, la sua assenza.

Il colonnello CALABRO, nel consegnare al Pecorella, in un plico, le due circolari anzidette, a titolo di conclusione disse: "PECORELLA qui è la mia vita" e ciò per mettere in risalto l'importanza dell'incarico. Il maggiore PECORELLA dette esplicita conferma che l'incarico sarebbe stato assolto, aggiungendo "sta bene".

Ma il maggiore Pecorella, preoccupato non meno del suo superiore, si accinse ad allontanarsi frettolosamente dalla caserma passando l'incarico al capitano ROMANELLI, di cui conosceva l'esperienza e la serietà, raccomandandogli di mettersi d'accordo con il generale Radice e di recarsi, insieme a lui, al comando tedesco.

Il capitano ROMANELLI, ritenendo che nel plico vi fossero le istruzioni necessarie, accolse l'incarico senza chiedere al Pecorella ulteriori chiarimenti al riguardo.

Accortosi che nel plico vi erano soltanto due copie della nota circolare diramata non dette soverchia importanza all'incarico ricevuto e consegnò l'indomani mattina il plico stesso ad altro ufficiale.

Cosicchè il plico, che aveva capitale importanza per il colonnello Calabrò, fu recapitato a chi di dovere con eccessivo ritardo.

Dall'insieme dei fatti sopra esposti è emerso:

- che il Pecorella mancò verso il proprio comandante, colonnello Calabrò, per non aver eseguito l'incarico da questi affidatogli sebbene lo avesse assicurato in proposito;

- che il Pecorella stesso ha altresì mancato nel limitarsi a passare l'incarico al capitano Romanelli senza assicurarsi che questi fosse ben orientato sul compito da svolgere, sui documenti consegnatigli e sull'importanza che a tale missione annetteva il colonnello Calabrò.

In considerazione di tali manchevolezze il signor Ministro, con determinazione in data 24 maggio 1945, intrinse al maggiore cc.rr. s.p. PECORELLA Camillo un "rimprovero" con la seguente motivazione:

"Aiutante maggiore in 1° del comandante di Legione, avuto da questi un delicato incarico che riguardava la sua persona e per l'esecuzione del quale aveva dato formale assicurazione, non provvedeva personalmente, ma lo affidava affrettatamente ad altro ufficiale".

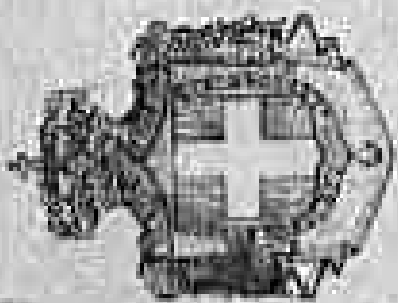

1. The Italian 'Ministero della Guerra' (Direzione Generale Personale Ufficiali) has given an order for the transfer of Major PECORELLA, C.C. NAPLES C.S. Centre to the North of Italy.
2. This order has been given as a result of an investigation respecting a matter of discipline which occurred on 8 Sep. 43, affecting subject and his then Commanding Officer.
3. In view of the agreement between your headquarters and the 'Stato Maggiore' (our letter n. 1109 dated 23 Feb. 45 refers) that no personnel of the 808 C.S. Bn. should be removed from office or transferred without previous consultation with AFHQ, this matter is brought to your attention for such action as you consider necessary.
4. It is thought that the fact that Major PECORELLA initiated the NAPLES C.S. Centre and has cooperated loyally with G-2, P.B.S. and subsequently with GSI, No. 3 District, and that these two headquarters have expressed their appreciation of the good work that he had done in our war effort in Italy, might be taken into consideration before a decision is made regarding his transfer to some centre in N.
