2. In the opinion of this Sub Commission publication by the Italian Ministry of War in its "Giornale di Medicina Militare" of complete letters and articles from such British papers as the British Medical Journal and the Bulletin of War and Medicine does not amount to an infringement of copyright in that the issue of the Ministry's Giornale to a limited class of persons does not amount to publication within the meaning of the Rome Copyright Convention, 1928, which governs the rights of foreign authors to protection in this country.

I might add that, even if the publication of the articles in question amounted to a technical infringement within the meaning of the Copyright Act 1911 and the Rome Convention of 1928, the chances of any action being taken by the writers or publishers of the articles is in my opinion so remote as to be scarcely worth taking into consideration.

NOTES ON "LA PATRIA".

1. OBJECT.

The object of "La Patria" is primarily to be a "morale sheet". If it is to fulfil this function it must be more than a mere newspaper.

2. GENERAL COMMENTS.

(a) A good newspaper, giving a fair sober account of the main news, and well presented with cartoons, maps, and photographs, but generally NOT inspiring.

(b) One minor comment is that "La Patria" in its presentation of news does not rewrite the Agency reports it receives, but merely reprints them verbatim, which makes it dull and colourless.

3. COST.

(a) The paper is too expensive. One reason is lack of syndication of articles, and the large number of articles written for it.

(b) The following measures seem to be the logical way of cutting down expenses.

1. Discontinue "ITALIA", which is not particularly valuable. If a Sunday paper is necessary, publish "La Patria" seven days a week, but a "special" on Saturday would be better.
2. Conduct a strict enquiry into the numbers of civilian employed. How many are just on the pay-roll without any duties?
3. Conduct a scrupulous audit of expenses. The only articles in the paper which should cost anything directly are bespoke articles by civilian experts.

4. ADMINISTRATION.

(a) The Administration needs reform - Maraldi is Capo Ufficio Stampe, and Editor of "La Patria". V/E of "La Patria" has never had separate identification and many officers work for both.

(b) It is said that the number of soldiers and civilians employed is in excess of those authorised.

(c) It is said that military on the staff receive more than a soldiers pay, and are also paid extra for anything they write for the paper.

(d) It has been suggested that Maraldi is party to a "scheme" whereby various journalists take in each others washing. (i.e. "La Patria" prints articles by outsiders on the understanding that some other paper accepts Maraldi's articles).

(b) does not rewrite the Agency reports it receives, but merely reprints them verbatim, which makes it dull and colourless.

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(b) The following measures seem to be the logical way of cutting down expenses.

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3. Conduct a scrupulous audit of expenses. The only articles in the paper which should cost anything directly are bespoke articles by civilian experts.

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(b) It is said that the number of soldiers and civilians employed is in excess of those authorised.

(c) It is said that military on the staff receive more than a soldiers pay, and are also paid extra for anything they write for the paper.

(d) It has been suggested that Maraldi is party to a "Scheme" whereby various journalists take in each others washing. (i.e. "La Patria" prints articles by outsiders on the understanding that some other paper accepts Maraldi's articles).

(e) There is said to be an agency contract with SIDI - said to be at L 37,000 P.messa. It is also said that 6 - 8,000 would be normal. It is reported that the owner of SIDI is one Corboni, owner of the "Tipografia" on which "Le Patria" is printed.

(f) There seems to be too much connection with other concerns - as witness the reports below :-

1. Bullio, ex-editor and still on the staff, is supposed to be the son of the real owner of the "Tipografia".
2. Spinetti, civilian editor who does the real work, is his nephew publishes on his own account, and works for "Il Momento" and "Gantachiaro".
3. Prof. Lombardi is reported as receiving L 8,000 a month, and does nothing.


We take this opportunity to point out that the

To : Ministry of War.

1. I understand from my liaison officers that the Italian Treasury is considering its ability to continue the Italian Army newspaper, "LA PATRIA" on account of the cost to the nation. I therefore write to make it quite clear to you that I consider "LA PATRIA" to be a vital necessity to the Italian Army, particularly at this time of uncertainty and reorganization. I am sure you realize the great value of this paper as a means of giving information in advance to the troops on such matters as leave, demobilization, rates of pay, home news, repatriation etc. etc. I consider that by this means, advance information can be disseminated in such a way as to help considerably in the prevention of desertion and other acts of indiscretions.

2. I am therefore asking you to make quite clear the views of the Allied authorities and to inform me officially, if at any time there is any question of secretly interfering with this News Service as it exists at present. You realize, of course, that the method of production and distribution is entirely in your hands, and that any modification for improvement considered necessary, should be effected from time to time as circumstances dictate, in collaboration where necessary with the members of my staff concerned.

3. I have discussed this question with the Allied authorities at CASERTA who are in entire agreement, and would be very loath to see any reduction in the scope of "LA PATRIA", particularly during the existing period of re-organization. As suggested in your letter, I 27th of June, it may be possible to obtain financial assistance

one column in each edition were allotted to this purpose,
and providing the advertisements were such as to be of
interest and benefit to the troops.



We are giving below a reply to the 6 points of letter A/241 of May 30th, from your mission:

1. Insufficient control by the manager over articles and news items of all editions is due solely to a lack of adequate telephone communication facilities. Ever since the first day the manager upheld the absolute necessity for at least 30 minutes of telephone communication per day with Florence and Bari, on a fixed-schedule basis. ~~Also~~ Recently the assistance of your Command was again requested in order to facilitate (telephone) communication. So far, however, conversations - often interfered with - are limited to three minutes or slightly over, and are granted after a long wait.

Under such conditions it is impossible to exercise a unified control from Rome over news items and all current subjects (which constitute the 4 points of the newspaper) and it becomes necessary for the editors-in-chief to use their own initiative. Articles which are not of an urgent nature (I.e. prepared in Rome and sent each week to field editors who publish them regularly (as per letter of April 26 from your Command))

The Florence edition has so far published all articles transmitted by the head office after the agreements which followed the letter of April 26th. During its first month of publication the Bari edition published twenty articles transmitted

(2) from Rome or taken from the Rome edition.
Sunday Army news appears regularly in the three editions.

2. To the extent of available means the head office issues daily instructions in writing and by telephone. The manager regards himself as fully liable at all times.

3. There will be maintained, as always, absolute impartiality concerning subjects of national or international politics.

We would like to know specifically to which "political excesses" letter # A/241 of May 30th last, No. 3, from your Command, refers.

Serious difficulties are encountered in trying to achieve a uniform arrangement of printed material in all editions, both because of the differences ~~between~~ in artistic sense of the various arrangers and because of the complete diversity of means and types of the various printing shops. The differences in the appearance of the various editions is, moreover, due to a great extent to constant changes in the grade of paper, wherefore photos, graphs and pictures can be reproduced only if the paper is good.

Everything possible will be done - in addition to the measures taken already - to carry out in full the recommendations contained in your letter A/241 of April 26th.

It is pointed out that the ~~present~~ staff of the newspaper works diligently and enthusiastically. Excellent military newspapermen renounce larger salaries in civilian life in order to contribute to the newspaper.

of our soldiers. Therefore, certain shortcomings must be attributed to ill will, but to the abovementioned handicaps beyond our control which, at any rate, we will try to overcome.

5. We enclose the directives issued by the H.Q., Newspaper Group.

6. The manager would have liked to visit the various field offices. But so far he was held back by his reluctance - in view of communication difficulties - to absent himself from the head office for too long a period of time. Instead of travelling to Florence and Bari he has so far preferred to summon to Rome at least every 15 days the chief editors or assistant chief editors, thus achieving the same purpose with the advantage of not leaving the head office where he performs also other delicate tasks in agreement with the Allies (publication of pamphlets on the contribution of our Army, tri-weekly broadcast for our prisoners, newsreels on the activities of our Army).

During a period of about one month there were summoned to Rome, in order to receive orders, two editors from Florence and three from Bari (the editor-in-chief from Bari has been in Rome these last few days).

In conclusion, in the event a single-type newspaper is desired, the possibility might be considered of printing a single edition in Rome, to be sent by air and fast courier to Milan and Bari.

There is no way^{as yet} to direct the publication of the Milan edition from Rome so long as telephone communication with that city is not made possible.



- Articles prepared by the central directorate are to be published immediately after arrival at their destination.
- A stenographer will be held ready at all times for telephone conversations.







1. The enemy newspaper "La Patria" has now been in production for two months, and it is clear, from reports received, that it has made a good beginning and is welcomed by the Italian soldiers.

2. Layout. It is important that an army newspaper should be attractive in appearance - it must appeal to the soldier. La Patria is sometimes a little dull and heavy to look at. The front page is usually broken by a map but the other pages tend to be too solid. The correct layout can be achieved by the liberal use of cartoons and pictures, both of news and of stage and screen stars.

3. News. There should be more front line despatches and more articles of various branches of the army. Regular columns of regimental news could well be included.

4. Supporting Articles. La Patria is inclined to carry too many articles which are literary essays on idealistic or trivial subjects which lack realism. The articles in the army newspaper should in the main be informative and on subjects which interest a soldier rather than an officer. The reason why the soldier is fighting must be stressed. Every line printed should be weighed up carefully and then only printed if it is considered to be of real interest to the soldier.

5. Organisation. The Florence and Rome editions are virtually separate at the moment, and the Bari edition when it starts will be, too. Each has its own separate staff printers - mainly civilians. It is essential to have a central syndication officer. This officer, responsible to the Editor in chief, would have the task of:-

1. The army newspaper "La Patria" has now been in production for two months, and it is clear, from reports received, that it has made a good beginning and is welcomed by the Italian soldiers.

2. Layout. It is important that an army newspaper should be attractive in appearance - it must appeal to the soldier. La Patria is sometimes a little dull and heavy to look at. The front page is usually broken by a map but the other pages tend to be too solid. The correct layout can be achieved by the liberal use of cartoons and pictures, both of news and of stage and screen stars.

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- a) Selecting articles from those appearing in the Italian Press, Il Vero, Stars and Stripes, Crusader, Union Jack etc.
- b) In conjunction with the editor in chief preparing list of subjects for articles, selecting journalists to write them - military journalists on the N.Y. or "La Patria" should do this, eliminating as far as possible civilian journalists.
- c) Despatching to the various units all material common to all three editions - i.e., articles, blocks for cartoons etc.

(2)

6. The organisation above would mean :-

- a) Economy of effort.
 - b) Uniformity:- The features in all three editions would be the same, and only the news page would be different, so that all three papers would have a strong family resemblance.
 - c) Ease of supervision and control by the Editor in Chief, who has no real control over the edition outside Rome at the moment and is not really "Editor in Chief" at all.
 - d) That the staffs of the three papers were freed to write more, thus enabling "La Patria" to dispense with its civilian collaborators, most of whom are not suitable writers for young soldiers.
7. This system will work if communications are good, and this can be met by instituting a D/R run once a week.
8. In conclusion it is desired to stress the importance of giving to the soldier news of his family and news on matters affecting his personal affairs. This service is typified by the "posta militare" column, messages from occupied Italy, and "Cronaca dell' Italia Liberate". Such features should be encouraged. A column giving extracts from army orders of interest to the soldier, explaining to him plans for leave and demobilising should be commenced & a separate letter is being sent you on this subject.

2. News. As a news sheet is excellent and the publication and circulation of this paper has proved a tonic to the moral effect of the troops.

3. La Patria however lacks a few interesting features and the following points would be of interesting reading.

News of conditions of civilians now living in zones occupied by the enemy; this affects a large number of men who were resident in these areas.

News on conditions of civilian life in liberated territory, in particular the future reconstruction of the civil population and the position regarding military demobilisation as soon as hostilities cease.

News dealing with agricultural matters in view of the fact that the majority of the soldiers are professional agriculturists.

1. Reference your A/27/2 same subject dated 16 March 45, the following report is submitted on the two newspapers "La Patria" and "Italia":

- (1) Distribution: The two internal security divisions "Sabauda" and "Aosta", receive both newspapers from Rome on the Italian Courier Plane. Territorial Headquarters receive a separate allotment from the same source. The two divisions issue the papers out to their respective Regiments for redistribution to the smaller units and men. Territorial Headquarters Palermo redistribute their copies of the papers to all offices and non-divisional units.
- (2) Number received by formations: Each division receives approximately 560 copies of each paper. This provides one paper for each 9 to 10 men. Territorial Headquarters receive 150 copies of each paper and is distributed at about the same ratio.
- (3) Material:
- a. The papers are especially appreciated because of their straight forward news and the lack of excessive comments.
 - b. The paper has a great moral and human interest to the men because of its Italian origin primarily. A very much appreciated part of the paper is the list of names of people for whom there are Red Cross Messages, originating from German occupied Italy. This is of main interest of course to soldiers from northern Italy.
 - c. The sporting news and entertainment is very scanty. The jokes and puns are interesting and well liked.
- (4) A large percentage of the enlisted men do not read the paper. This is due to two reasons,

firstly, the officers do not encourage the men to do so, and secondly, an insufficient number of copies are received. Distribution should be on the basis of one copy to each 3 or 4 men. The Italian Officer should also be encouraged or required to take more interest in the welfare of his men.



1. Reference your letter A/27/2 dated 16 Mar 45, here is a report on the Italian army newspaper "LA PATRIA" and "ITALIA".
2. LA PATRIA is being received daily by this combat group at the rate of 1000 - 1100 copies and is being split up amongst the group.
3. "ITALIA" is being received weekly at the rate of 1000 copies.
4. A request has been received by the Italian Welfare office that the number be increased, in the case of both newspapers to 2000 respectively in order to meet the great demand for both these publications.
5. Both the newspapers are welcomed by the troops who can suggest no improvements and all questioned seem content with the news and entertainment sides of the papers.
6. The newspapers arrive daily with the post and are distributed the same day by means of the postal truck. Thus each unit receives papers the day after publication and is quite satisfactory.
7. Could copies of illustrated magazines and journals be sent to this group. A large number of requests have been made for these.

4. General Suggestions.

- a. I suggest that the allotment of papers be increased as soon as possible.
- b. Although not actually concerned with this report I suggest that Ministry of War make an allocation to the Groups of a selection of periodicals and illustrated "riviste" which are now on sale in most of the large cities. Group Welfare Officer obtains a few by favour and out of his funds but the supply is erratic and small. The subjects cover cinema, stage and pin-up girls. I do feel that it would be an excellent thing.
- c. Another good source to be tapped is P.W.B. I am sure they would be willing to make available sufficient numbers of periodicals such as "Il Lavoro" and other interesting publications which combine good reading and sound propaganda.

1. Distribution

Distribution of the daily "La Patria" is satisfactory. The paper is issued in Florence at 1900hrs and reaches HQ Legnano Group during the night. It is distributed in the morning to all the nearest units of the Group, and by the 1300hrs mail to all the remainder.

2. Numbers received by formations

The Group should get 2000 copies - that is one copy for 5 soldiers - but owing to the lack of paper, fewer copies of the daily "La Patria" are printed than are actually required. The average number of copies received by the Group is about 1500, sometimes only 1000. For the weekly "Italia" the number of copies issued is sufficient.

3. Material

- (a) The troops are very interested in the General news, lately the weekly "Italia" has been printing an appendix in which ~~are~~ printed messages from North Italy (Messaggi dall'Italia Occupata) these reach the War Dept, Vatican, or the Red Cross, and are of great interest to the majority of soldiers.

The news items are considered satisfactory, the morale and human aspect is adequately catered for and entertainment and sports items are fairly complete.

A column would be appreciated for the information of the soldiers on administrative matters - pay, leave, discharge, etc; also the publication of messages from Radio, Vatican, Red Cross, etc.

The weekly paper L'Italia is also much appreciated and is considered sufficiently serious and complete and is favoured for its publication of messages from German occupied ITALY.





The delivery is irregular, with occasional cases of non-delivery, therefore there is room for improvement in this regard.

'PATRIA' - 2,000 copies, three times a week.
'ITALIA' - 450 copies weekly, which are considered insufficient, and at least 1,500 copies are required by this Group. 2,000 copies three times a week are also received of the 'CORRIERE ALLEATO'. Except for the 'ITALIA' weekly, the numbers received are considered sufficient.

3. NEWS.

- a) More propaganda items could be included in both papers, in the way of the Allied war effort, and partisan activities in this theatre, with occasional topical pictures.
- b) Morale and human aspect. The morale value of both papers is considered good, but the human aspect could be greatly improved with more news and accounts of labour problems, reconstruction, and the future of ITALY, written by qualified persons but adapted to be understood by the ordinary soldier.
- c) Entertainment and Sport. Cartoons, humour, and short stories are always greatly appreciated, so more attention to this aspect would be well received. Sport news are considered adequate.

4. General Suggestions

- i) The present printing, type and pattern is rather depressing, and these publications could be much more attractive with clearer type and paper e.g. the 'CORRIERE ALLEATO'. 5435
- ii) More war and domestic illustrations would greatly increase the interest taken in these newspapers.





1. Title.

Since the fascists used to publish a daily entitled "Ticoline" which was anti-democratic and anti-social & which was distributed free even to the troops, the title suggested is "La Patria", symbol of union and accord for all. paper for Italian Troops.

Following is report requested after preliminary survey, including
policy and planning observations which may assist in initial stages.

1. Object of Journal:

- (a) To assist promotion of optimum do corps among Italian soldiers now available or working for United Nations;
- (b) to develop their interests in the world war scene, as opposed to local Italian political events which currently dominate the civilian Italian Party members;
- (c) to record their own achievements in the Allied cause, and to furnish daily news of the successes and problems of the nations they are fighting with.

2. Policy:

- (a) To reduce space devoted to Italian politics to a minimum, irrespective of what has occurred, not what is likely to occur.
- (b) Encourage Police, Civic Guard, to have "New Joined" Article on the history of this war from an Allied point of view - into the events which lead up to it. Articles on past campaigns of Allied Army with which the Italians will serve, possible, in view of education rating of considerable proportion of the troops concerned.
- (c) Considerable space to domestic items of a regimental type.

3. Locations: Strategic:

 (b) To develop their interests in the world war scene, as opposed to local Italian political events which currently dominate the civilian Italian party newspapers.
 (c) To record their own achievements in the allied cause, and to furnish daily news of the successes and glooms of the nations they are fighting with.

2. Policy :

- (a) No reduce space devoted to Italian politics to a minimum. Objective reporting of local political events, confined to reports of what has occurred, not what is likely to occur.
- (b) Encourage policy: "We Have Now Joined". Articles on the history of this war from an allied point of view - also the events which lead up to it. Articles on past campaigns of Allied Army with which the Italians will serve. A collection of maps and pictures would be considered wherever possible, in view of education, training or consideration of proper use of the troops concerned.
- (c) Considerable space to domestic items of a regimental type.

3. Locations Strengths :

O.C., B.A.U., understands position as follows :

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It is pointed out that thought priority should certainly favour forward units, production in Italy will be quicker because of technical difficulties in Florence.

4. Distribution, Alternative Methods:

- (a) With rations. Since rations are not collected daily, some issues would reach the soldiers late, but system can be improved gradually if transport available.
- (b) Supplement existing direct ARMY NEWS STARS AND SERIES and UNION CO. transport. Collective system would exert economy on overall position.

5. O.C., D.A.U.U. suggests following working arrangement:

- (i) Each paper to be produced by Italian civilian personnel under British supervision of Italian officer with small military staff. Civilian officers must be trained journalist, preferably able to speak English. Suggested rank, Major.
- (ii) Maximum personnel needed: 3 officers, viz., 1 at U.O., N.Y.U. translating material, arranging translations and generally editing the project; 1 as liaison with the Italian editor of each journal. Selection of personnel is extremely important.
- (iii) It is suggested Italian Ministry, underground facilities, be sympathetic to this project. (O.G., R.i.W.U.) can put forward one suitable organization for this work.
- (iv) Italian editor responsible to N.Y.U. and Italian Ministry of War, for contacts, with advice from N.Y.U. liaison officer.
- (v) D.A.U.U. to supply suitable articles, and pass on blocks and pictures.
- (vi) P.W.B. to furnish its Basic News Service, film news (blocks) and general material which it at present leases to Italian civilian papers.
- (vii) P.W.B. responsible for censorship.
- (viii) Department, U.S., and all materials to be supplied by Italian by arrangement with United Nations Commission (see para 7).

6. Circulation:

100% supply of papers is anticipated for the two forward Comint Groups. (A morale newspaper for the Italians is bound to have an immediate beneficial effect, and since the number involved is small, it would be wise to issue on a strict basis).

7. Horwood suggested classifications with approximate newsprint requirements:

5. O.C., D.A.M.U. suggests following working arrangement:

- (1) Each paper to be produced by Italian civilian personnel under Editorship of Italian officer with small military staff. This officer must be trusted journalist. Preferably able to speak English. Suggested name, Major.
- (2) Minimum personnel needed: 3 officers, viz., 1 at H.Q., D.A.M.U. enclosing material, according to translation and generally writing the project; 1 as liaison with the Italian Editor of the journal. Selection of personnel is extremely important. Must speak Italian fluently, understand Italian politics, be sympathetic to the project. (O.C., D.A.M.U. can put forward one suitable candidate for this work)

- (iii) Italian Editor responsible to WITA and Italian Ministry of War, for contents, with advice from A.M.U. Liaison officer.
(iv) D.A.M.U. to supply suitable articles, and news on blockade and pictures.
(v) P.W.D. to furnish the Basic News Service, the case (Urgent) and general material which it will forward, times to Italian civilian papers.
(vi) P.W.D. responsible for censorship.
(vii) Newsprint, etc., and all materials to be supplied by Transport by air, and with Allied Commission (see page 7).

6. Circulation:

100% supply of papers to be directed for the two Standard Context Groups. (a morale newspaper for the Italians is bound to have an immediate beneficial effect, and since the number involved is small, it could be quite economy to issue on a radio basis).

1. As one of the measures for reinforcing the morale of the Italian Army, it is proposed that an Italian Army Newspaper should be published, on modest "Union Jack" lines.

2. This newspaper it is considered would help to engender a spirit of cohesion in the units of the Army, which is at present operating in three parts, under British, American and Italian auspices. It will be particularly welcomed by those ITALIAN troops in the forward area, where newspapers are not normally available.

3. Printing and distribution problems are being successfully overcome and it remains for authority to be secured for the release of newsprint. Estimated requirements are $33\frac{1}{2}$ tons per month.

4. As a matter of policy it is considered that if this newsprint can be made available in no other way, it should be produced from that allocated to the Italian civil dailies.

5. The rehabilitation of the Italian Army is most important and Field Marshal Alexander has instructed that every consideration shall be given to the improvement of their welfare, as one of the means of effecting this. This projected newspaper will be an integral part of Italian Army Welfare, and it is therefore requested this paper be made available.
