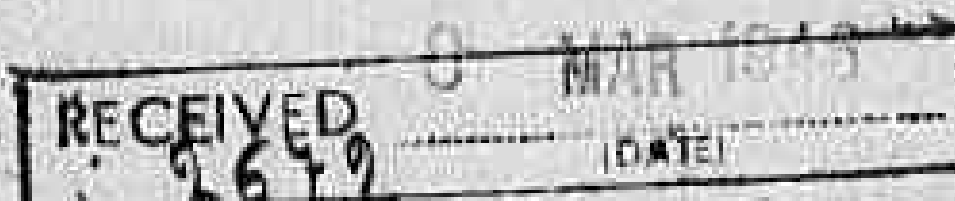

This main highway, (apart from any others) is clearly signed (both in English and Italian), showing that there is a 20 M.P.H. Speed-limit.

It is therefore requested that immediate steps be taken to ensure that this, and all other Speed-limits within Palermo, are rigidly enforced.

It is further suggested that regular Military-Police patrols are put on all roads in and out of the city - especially Via LIBERTA' and the necessary disciplinary action taken against all offenders.

- 3 20 copies of all Proclamations, Orders, regulations and judicial or administrative rules (other than those mentioned above) which have been issued in a Region or any Province thereof, showing where and when they have been brought into force, will be forwarded at once by the Region concerned to the Information Division of the Public Relations Branch of this Headquarters.
- 4 All documents sent to the Information Division in accordance with this instruction will be accompanied by descriptive lists showing the quantity of each item forwarded.
- 5 Regions and Sub-Commissions respectively will in future supply the Information Division with the said number of copies of all the above described Documents which may be issued hereafter as the same are issued.
- 6 Archivers will so far as they can, supply from the records of closed Regions such copies of orders etc issued in such Regions as may be spare up to the above mentioned maxima.

SUBJECT: Use of WD Transport - Civilians

DISTRIBUTION : List 'B' (British).

1. GRO 345/45 specifically forbids the conveyance of Civilians in WD Transport except in certain clearly defined circumstances. This prohibition includes the use of WD Transport to convey civilian partners to dances.

2. I am prepared to admit relaxation of this order subject to strict control.

3. In the case of units Commanded by an Officer not below rank of Major, Commanding Officers may permit the conveyance of civilian lady partners on condition that :-

(a) Permission is only given for specific dances properly organised under unit arrangements.

(b) Authority must be signed by the Commanding Officer personally and must specify vehicles to be used, numbers of civilians to be carried, and precise route by which travel is authorised. Such an authority must be in possession of each driver.

(c) All civilians carried must sign a certificate absolving the WD from any claim that might result if an accident should occur.

4. In the case of units Commanded by officers below the rank of Major, application will be made to this Headquarters giving particulars as specified in para 3 (a) and (b) and certificates as in 3 (c) must be obtained.

5. In the case of a unit where the Commanding Officer is a Major or of higher rank, a return will be forwarded to this Headquarters on Saturday of each week giving the following information in respect of each journey, in respect of any one vehicle during the previous 7 days.

1. It is agreed that a single authority should be responsible for deciding which GROs are applicable to the Italian Army and in view of the fact that your HQ has closer knowledge of the conditions it is considered that the decision should be made by you.
2. The decision as to which GROs should apply to the Italian Army may in some cases involve complications, and to avoid any difficulties which may arise it is suggested that when you decide that it is desirable that a GRO should apply to the Italian Army you should notify this HQ and obtain concurrence before acting. Normally the only GROs which should be considered for such application are those which bear the footnote "Applicable to all Troops".
3. If you will say whether you agree with this proposal the decision will be notified to formations under command of this HQ.

1. The time has come when it is necessary to consider as a possibility the situation which will be created by a cessation of hostilities in Europe. Such a situation might arise as a result of a formal armistice with Germany, or on the other hand, hostilities may drift gradually to an end. Two different sets of conditions may thus arise which will require somewhat different treatment.
2. It is the intention of the Commanding General, Rome Area Allied Command, whatever the circumstances, to prevent any riotous behaviour of undue disturbance, and, while allowing scope for legitimate rejoicing, to preserve normality in the conduct of the area. Discipline will not be relaxed.
3. It is particularly the intention that undue crowds of troops will not be allowed into the city of Rome. Passes will be strictly limited to normal numbers.
4. This applies to officers equally with enlisted men and other ranks. Units quartered in the Rome Area will allow no more than the usual quota of officers into Rome and others will be reminded that it is their duty to be present in their unit lines.
5. No more than the normal percentage of enlisted men and other ranks will be allowed on pass.
6. It is therefore important that officers commanding units organise entertainment and diversion within unit lines with a view to keeping men amused and preventing them, so far as possible, from drifting into Rome. In addition, special efforts will be made from area resources to provide as much entertainment as possible to keep men in Rome out of the streets.
7. When the situation arises it will be necessary for all units to keep a particularly tight control over transport vehicles to prevent unauthorised "joyriding" and all officers commanding units will prepare plans with this in view.
8. Personnel on pass will not be permitted to carry fire-arms and unit commanders will take the necessary steps to ensure that this order is carried out.
