1. Since the above quoted letters were written a communication on the subject of Major PECORELLA has been received from A.C., a copy of this letter No 3626/EG of 31 Dec. '45 is attached.

Para 7 and 8(e) of the Public Safety report read as follows :-

Para 7 - "My informants also reported on another officer of CC.RR. who is assigned to and working with the S.I.M. at Naples, a Major PECORELLA. Whether or not this officer is involved in undermining the CC.RR. at Naples is not known but my informants states that he is a close personal friend of Mario Palermo and that he is the instigator, if not the author, of articles in the Communist newspaper at Naples, attacking CC.RR. officers and the CC.RR. It is reported that this officer, at the time of the Naples "Four Days" in 1943, claimed three months sick leave, left his CC.RR. command and went into hiding where he remained until about two weeks after the arrival of the Allied Forces in the city. He then came out of hiding, reported for duty without medical check over, and obtained a posting to S.I.M. He immediately began instigating himself with Allied officers until he is now at a solidly entrenched that, stated my informant, he cannot be moved on any order but then one issued by the Supreme Allied Commander. He is reported to entertain Allied officers in a second hand

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Para 8(e) - It is recommended that Major PECORELLA be transferred out of S.I.M. and from Southern Italy."

2. In view of this report and the instructions of the Chief Commissioner contained in the letter attached I request that authority be given for Major PECORELLA's posting out of S.I.M. and away from NAPLES. The Ministry of War have already expressed their anxiety to obtain this authority.

2. Will you please therefore take this matter up with AFHQ and the Ministry of War with a view to orders being issued for Major Pecorella's removal from Naples. Will you please treat this matter as urgent.

Comune of Pittorano sul Gizio

Subject: Removal and transfer of AMADIO Paolo, Brigadier of the CC.RR.

To : The Command of the CC.RR. Legion Chieti
The Command of the CC.RR. Corps Rome
H. E. De Gasperi, President of the Council Rome
Admiral Stone, Chief Commissioner Rome.

The leaders of the political parties that have been formed in Pittorano heard about the undeserved and unfair transfer of Brigadier Amadio Paolo, who managed to reestablish order in civilian life, with special tact and ability, in a period of unrest. He gave to his corps an authority and seriousness worthy of its past and to the population the feeling that the Carabinieri in command should safeguard public safety and enable the citizens to carry out their activities in peace. In fact after Brigadier Amadio had been in Pittorano for a few months, public order was no longer perturbed by all kind of manifestations, this for the benefit of the whole population. As soon as it was heard that the Brigadier was to leave Pittorano, discontent spread among the citizens who publicly and privately expressed their displeasure for the way in which this active non commissioned officer had been treated; his only purpose was to fulfil his duty.

We therefore deem it advisable to ask the Authorities to revoke the transfer.
