1. Since the Battalion under your command took over Train Guard Duties only two Companies have been fully employed. A Course of Instruction was held for 6 Officers and 8 NCOs at this HQ. and you were instructed to ensure that similar courses were held by you so that all Officers and men should become thoroughly acquainted with their duties. I consider that you have had ample time for this, nevertheless it is reported that NCS's have been detailed for duty with little or no knowledge of what is required of them.

2. Railway Working Instruction No 13 sets out very clearly the above duties and also enumerates the reports and returns due to be rendered to this H.Q. I must again point out that there has been a considerable delay in the rendition of these returns. For instance your Monthly Report on the Working of guards for August was not received at this H.Q. until 13 Sep. This report is dated 5 Sep.

3. H.Q. Mov. Ancona report that no Officer had up to 3 Sep. visited your Ancona Det. You yourself admitted that you had not visited this Detachment until 3 Sep. some 18 days after your unit had taken over.

4. On 5 Sep my TG 145 instructed you to send a Representative to report Town Major, Falconara, upon the subject of accommodation.

At a conference attended by you at this HQ on 6 Sept you were informed of this fact yet on 9 Sept and again 12 Sept., I am informed by Town Major Falconara and 61 Area respectively that this order had not been complied with.

5. Further on 6 Sept. you were informed that 110 rfts were due to be released to you between 3 - 9 Sept. and arrangements should be made for their reception. Apparently this was not done, although you stated at the conference that arrangements had been made.

6. Since taking over train guard duties I have had numerous complaints of the increase number of civilians who are being allowed to travel on mil. trains and what is worse increased pilferage due to Officers and NCOs and men failing to carry out their duties, sentries asleep or absent from their posts.

7. I can only conclude therefore that you lack the drive, initiative and powers of command required of a Battalion Commander.

8. Will you please forward me your comments on the above.



1. A report has been received regarding the conduct of Capt. TURILLI, who is at present assigned to Fifth Army Interrogation centre in Vienna as a P.V. Interpreter, which indicates that he is not a proper person to be entrusted with such duties and should be immediately forwarded pending an enquiry into his conduct.

2. The report states that on the 7th June a man named GOMILLI, "Mo fa Venzone", alleged stay-behind agent of the 40th Division in underground movement, was arrested by the Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment of the 51st. 327 and his house in Vienna was searched. During the course of the search, the following articles of the property of Capt. TURILLI were found:

- a. A pocket knife in dress jacket.
- b. A .35 caliber revolver.
- c. A leather case containing a knife, some notes and letters sent to a Severe d. 1000 documents No. 0025 dated 9 March, 1945, issued by General ARMANDO, "Pegaso", of the State Maggiore Generale, Republic "I".

3. When interrogated regarding these articles, GOMILLI stated that Capt. TURILLI was an old friend of his whom he had known at the Fascistists training school at VIENNA about three years ago. GOMILLI also stated that he had met him in VIENNA in 1937, 1938, had invited him to dinner at his home and that Capt. TURILLI had left some suit cases and clothes together with the above mentioned items when he left VIENNA for YUGOSLAVIA. GOMILLI added that when Capt. TURILLI returned to VIENNA on his way to ROMA to collect his property, he was in a great hurry and in his haste, forgot the ladies case and the leather dress jacket.

4. It is known that during the course of his duties, THE H.I. had occasion to travel between VIENNA and ROMA. It is known that the Director of the Italian liaison centre at VIENNA has not given notice of his transfer from their organization.

5. Regarding the end of Capt. TURILLI received notice to report to his Headquarters and last visited VIENNA 1st May 1945 and has not since returned although the Italian liaison centre at VIENNA has received no notice of his transfer from their organization.

2. This report states that on the 7th due a man named CHI SHAN, WHO IS UNKNOWN, alleged spy "double agent of the P.D.A. DETAILS NOT UNDERRATED AT PRESENT, was arrested by the Chinese Intelligence Corps. According to the 7th, who saw his home in KOWLOON was searched, during the course of the search, the following articles of the property of Capt. CHI SHAN were found:

- a. A British battle dress jacket.
- b. A "So called" revolver.
- c. A box containing a knife, some notes and letters.
- d. A leather case containing a pistol, some notes and letters.

3. When interrogated regarding these articles, CHI SHAN stated that Capt. CHI SHAN was an old friend of his whom he had known as a revolutionary soldier at TUN HWA about three years ago. CHI SHAN stated that he had met him in KOWLOON in May, 1945, had invited him to come at his house and that Capt. CHI SHAN had loaned some money and clothes together with the above mentioned belief that Capt. CHI SHAN would return for them. CHI SHAN added that when Capt. CHI SHAN returned to KOWLOON on his way to HONG KONG to collect his property, he was in a great hurry and in his haste, forgot the belief cases and the leather cases jacket.

4. It is known that during the course of his duties, THE 7TH had occasion to travel between KIAU YUNG 2, KIAU YUNG 3, KIAU YUNG 4, KIAU YUNG 5 and the Interrogation centre at VASSA, working for a few days at each place.

5. Around the end of May, THE 7TH received notices to report to his headquarters and left VASSA FOR KOW LOON and has not since returned although the Interrogation centre at VASSA has received no notice of his transfer from their organization.

6. It appears that Capt. CHI SHAN was guilty of gross negligence in leaving such articles in a private dwelling, particularly that of such a person as CHI SHAN. If he did not wish to do so to ascertain the history of the articles, his nature to do so is a serious offence for an officer in his position. If, on the other hand, as appears probable from the Interrogation of Capt. CHI SHAN, THE 7TH was aware of CHI SHAN'S activation, his failure to report the matter constitutes an even greater offence than that of leaving his personal documents, papers and articles of service in a private house.

7. It is requested that you brief an enquiry into this case and submit the results of your investigations to this局 with the least possible delay.

8. In the meantime you are requested to forward this note.

TO: Commanding Officer, 2695th Tech Sup'n Regt (Ovhd)

1. Pursuant to instructions contained in Land Forces Sub Comm. A.C. (MMIA), letter to Ministry of War, dated 23 March 1945, the following adverse report for inefficiency of Captain Gino Caporali, Artillery, as the Commanding Officer of the 20th Italian Pack Mule Company, 4th Italian Pack Mule Battalion, is submitted.

(a) False official Morning Report: On 10 May 1945, Captain Caporali signed and submitted a morning report for his organization reporting the number of mules in his organization on 9 May 1945 to be 252. (Certified True Copy Enclosed). On May 9, 1945 I personally inspected the 20th Italian Pack Mule Company, commanded by Captain Gino Caporali and during the course of my inspection I made an exact count of all the mules then present in the organization. The actual count by section was as follows:

Hq Section	25
1st Section	41
2nd Section	55
3rd Section	48
4th Section	54
Total	223

During this inspection I was accompanied by Major Guerrini, Commanding Officer, 4th Italian Pack Mule Battalion and Captain Caporali, and the count was witnessed by them. When the count had been completed, Captain Caporali asserted claim for additional mules as follows:

3 Mules - Sick in vicinity of S. Marano
6 Mules - Enroute from S. Marano to Stellata
9 Total

There was thus, on 9 May 1945, a shortage from the morning report figure of 20 mules in the 20th Italian Pack Mule Company which was known or reasonably should have been known by Captain Caporali.

(b) UNEXPLAINED LOSS OF 20 MULES

On or about April 25, 1945, I verbally instructed the Commanding Officer, Amdet, 20th Italian Pack Mule Company to obtain sufficient mules to bring this company to its authorized strength of 260 mules and on that date, 18 mules were obtained and the company's strength after delivery was 259 mules (one mule was killed in action that day), and was so reported to me by the Commanding Officer, Amdet, 20th Italian Pack Mule Company. This has been confirmed by the present Commanding Officer, Amdet, 20th Italian Pack Mule Company. Since 25 April 1945, neither combat nor other hazardous operations could satisfactorily explain the loss of 20 mules.

(c) UNSATISFACTORY CONDITION OF COMPANY

The 9 May 1945 inspection of the 20th Italian Pack Mule Company revealed an unsatisfactory condition in this organization as follows:

- (1) General condition of mules -- Poor
- (2) Kitchens - Unsatisfactory
- (3) Latrines, with one exception - Unsatisfactory
- (4) Police of Company area - Unsatisfactory

The 9 May inspection was made on three days prior notice. On 16 May 1945, an informal inspection of this company's kitchens and latrines was made and found to be still unsatisfactory, and a report thereof made to the Commanding Officer, Amdet, 20th Pack Mule Company (Italian) for his information. Copy Enclosed.

2. By reason of the foregoing, it is recommended that immediate action be taken to relieve Captain Caporali from command.

3. On 9 May 1945, the Commanding Officer, 20th Italian Pack Mule Group was informed of the matters set forth in paragraph 1 (a) above via a letter to the Commanding Officer Amdet, 20th Italian Pack Mule Group. A copy of this letter as well as the reply of the Commanding Officer, 20th Italian Pack Mule Group, are enclosed herewith.

4. It is believed that both Col. Bernie, Commanding Officer, 20th Italian Pack Mule Group, and Major Guerrini are fully cognizant of the conditions in the 20th Italian Pack Mule Company. Major Guerrini has recently informed me that Captain Caporali is now absent sick and that action for his relief from Command has not been taken.

5. Existing conditions in the 20th Italian Pack Mule Company urgently require the services of a competent Company Commander at once and in my opinion, none of the junior officers in that company are competent commanders even temporarily.

SUBJECT: Inspection Report

TO: Commanding Officer, AMDET, 20th Italian Pack Mule Company.

1. Upon my informal inspection of the kitchens and latrines, 17 May 1945, the following deficiencies were noted:

(a) 1st. Section - (Lt Caradore)

KITCHEN - Dirty and disorderly; stove and utensils very dirty; trash on floor; two men were sleeping in kitchen; a tray of meat was partially exposed and partially covered by a dirty burlap sack.
LATRINE - No Latrine.

Note - On my prior inspection of this section the deficiencies observed included: Very dirty kitchen and the absence of a latrine. At that time suggestions were made and concurred in by Captain Caporali and Major Guerrini, that a separate latrine be dug at once.

(b) 2nd Section -(Lt Pepini)

KITCHEN - Very dirty; stove and utensils unclean and piles of debris and trash on floor.

LATRINE - An indoor latrine that on the previous inspection was considered unsanitary, was still being used, and continues to be filthy. NOTE - At prior inspection, the foregoing deficiencies were called to the attention of the Company Commander, and it was suggested and concurred in by Captain Caporali and Major Guerrini that the indoor latrine be closed and the door nailed forthwith, and that an outdoor latrine be dug. Obviously, no action in this direction has been taken.

(c) 3rd Section - (Lt Morey)

KITCHEN - Kitchen was filthy; stove and utensils dirty; trash and food around the floor; 5 men sleeping in room used as kitchen.

LATRINE - Was a satisfactory permanent installation accomodating 5 persons, but despite its ample facilities fecal matter littered the floor.

(d) 4th Section - (Lt Desidieri)

KITCHEN - Police of kitchen unsatisfactory, but some improvements over the prior inspection noted.

LATRINE - Satisfactory, but men using latrine must be instructed not to pollute the area surrounding it.

2. The deficiencies noted, reveal a deplorable state of discipline and control in this company, and must be regarded as a serious reflection upon the personnel concerned. The condition of this company is even worse than it was on my last inspection when conditions were found to be unsatisfactory.

It was explained by the Commanding Officer of the 20th Italian Pack Mule Company that 3 sick mules are in the vicinity of Marano for treatment and that 6 mules are still enroute to Stellata. Inclusion of these nine mules brings the total to 232.

2. The Morning Report dated 9 May 1945, reports the number of mules in this organization to be 252.

3. It is suggested that this discrepancy between the actual count and the number reported, be brought to the attention of the Commanding Officer of the 20th Italian Pack Mule Group for appropriate action.

4. The last actual count of mules in this organization was made by the Commanding Officer, AMDET, 20th Italian Pack Mule Company on or about 25th April 1945. On April 26, 1945 he verbally reported to this Headquarters a total of 299 mules in the organization.

On 26/27 Apr 45 the a/n ECO's stayed the night in Rome without proper authority and received as punishment stoppage of Pay for 5 and 3 days respectively.

I have investigated this matter and told the O.C. Coy that the punishment was far too light and that he should report them to higher authority.

I was informed however that this was the maximum punishment he could give and that he could not denounce them for such a crime. I then intimated that I would make this report.

The facts are as follows. GIRARDIN went absent of his own accord and disobeyed instructions to return to Unit from 104 Gen.Hos.Detachment when part of it was withdrawn.

PAGANINI was detailed as guide to hospital party returning to Unit but did not perform this duty. Instead he asked permission of S-Ten MENOLLA to stay in Rome.

This officer having no authority to do so did grant permission and thus is also guilty of a grave offence.

Instances of this nature and the lack of proper and fitting correction encourages crime and seriously undermines discipline. It is essential that Italian higher authority be made to act in this and similar cases and to ensure that proper measures are instituted to deal with these serious breaches of discipline quickly and effectively.

SUBJECT: 47 Artillery Regiment Depot - Copertino.

From enquiries carried out by the Bari Military Territorial Commandant it appears that :-

- 1) - the adjutant, Lt. Col. ANTONANTE Angelo, mainly concerned and responsible for the management and careful conservation of the materials, has not exercised sufficient care in respect of the cleanliness and perfect rearrangement of all the materials; he has therefore been punished with 5 days Simple Arrest.
- 2) - the officer in charge of the materials, 2/Lieut. Zappino Carlo, having assumed such duty on the 31st January 1945, failed, at the time of checking on taking over, to order the cleaning and rearrangement of the materials; he has therefore been punished with 5 days Simple Arrest.
- 3) - the W.O. employed in the stores, TORNESE Pasquale, has shown little care and interest in compiling the returns of the materials, compiling it from deductions made from previous ones made out by the out-going officer (who was discharged for slackness) and altering it only in respect of movements which occurred, without checking whether the facts thus obtained corresponded or not with the stocks in the stores; he has therefore been punished with 5 days Rigorous Arrest.
- 4) - Colonel Salvi Giambattista, Commandant of the Depot, a scrupulous and upright officer, very attached to his duties, is free of blame.

I shall rebuke Colonel Salvi because, as Commandant of the Depot, I consider him partly responsible, even though indirectly, ~~on the lamentable occasions~~; I am of the opinion, however, that the officer, whose character and capacities have been fully confirmed by the Bari Military Territorial G.O.C., should not be discharged from the service.

1. This report is to put forward views of 209 Div with reference to O.C. Depot - Ten Col PAPADIA.

2. They are not satisfied with his efficiency. On the occasion of the last inspection by Gen OIMI, after due warning had been given, he found conditions were not as good as they should have been. Ten Col PAPADIA has had little experience of actually commanding men. The majority of his career has been spent as an officiale d'ordonnance. As O.C. of the depot he has to supervise 3 Bns. Gen OIMI is of the strong opinion that his lack of command experience does not qualify him for this.

3. The O.C. British cadre has a good opinion of ten col PAPADIA. Gen OIMI considers from past experience, as PAPADIA has served under him before, that his good presence does not compensate for his lack of experience.

4. I cannot express any personnel views as I have only met PAPADIA once. There have, however, been many complaints from Sub Areas and District about the lack of hygiene etc the depot. Even recently, more than 10% of the rfts sent to POSSOMBRONE should not have been sent for medical reasons. ST enquiry into the spending of the extra money for rations revealed a serious lack of control. 209 Div regard it as one of the least satisfactory units under their command, bearing in mind the excellent barracks of any other unit.

5. The above information is passed to you as I believe O.C. British cadre would be unwilling for him to be posted.

Reference to U.S. Debut - Gen Col PAPADIA.

2. They are not satisfied with his efficiency. On the occasion of the last inspection by Gen OLLI, after due warning had been given, he found conditions were not as good as they should have been. Ten col PAPADIA has had little experience of actually commanding ten. The majority of his career has been spent as an officer in ordnance. As O.C. of the depot he has to supervise 3 Bns. Gen OLLI is of the strong opinion that his lack of command experience does not qualify him for this.

3. The O.C. British Indre has a good opinion of ten col PAPADIA. Gen OLLI considers from past experience, as PAPADIA has served under him before, that his good presence does not compensate for his lack of experience.
