1. U.S. Army Regulations restrict the bestowal of our campaign ribbons to U.S. personnel only. We cannot present them to members of the Italian Army or to personnel in any other co-belligerent army. We are authorized to and do award, U.S. combat decorations, and medals for meritorious service, to individual members of the Italian Army serving with our forces.

2. The Allied decoration of the type referred to in the ISMIA memorandum would require action by our War Department and by the Congress of the United States. We are quite certain that the U.S. War Department will not, at this time, be inclined to take up the question of a separate Allied Victory Medal primarily for the purposes indicated in the attached papers, and we would be extremely reluctant to recommend such a course of action to the War Department.

3. It seems to us that it would be far more appropriate that assistance be furnished the Italian government in obtaining the necessary materials for issue of the campaign ribbon, listed in Appendix "A" to the ISMIA letter, by the Italian government to its military personnel. Since any solution to the problem would require the use of material, this appears to be the more logical course of action.

4. This office has no information regarding the so-called "liberation of Rome" medal, and has no knowledge that such a medal has been requested by American authorities. If your office or ISMIA can furnish additional information on this subject, it will be appreciated.

Subject : Medal commemorating the "Liberation of Rome".

When your Sub Commission learned that this Ministry was preparing a measure for the purpose of instituting the above medal, to be conferred upon all those who took part in operations which led to the liberation of Rome, you informed us verbally that you did not consider it advisable to enact the measure in question.

Whereupon the execution of all instructions issued up to then in this matter was suspended.

I have just received a letter - copy of which is attached - from the First A.D.C. General of H.R.H. the Lieutenant General of the realm who, in sending me a letter from General L.N. Truscott, Commander of the American 5th Army (a copy of which is attached) asks whether the measure referred to above will be enacted.

In order that I may have something definite upon which to base my reply to the aforementioned A.D.C. General, I request your Sub Commission to let me know whether or not there still prevail the conditions which made it advisable to postpone the aforementioned measure, which the Commander of the American 5th Army appears so anxious to see enacted.

As you know, when General Clark and some Commanders of American Higher Formations were awarded Italian decorations in January of this year, the desire was expressed to H.R.H. the Lieutenant General of the Realm that the liberation of Rome should be remembered through the institution of a commemorative medal.

In accordance with the plans which were being made by your Ministry in the matter, General Truscott was informed in April of this year that the Ministry of War intended to recommend to the Council of Ministers the institution of a commemorative medal for the liberation of Rome, to be awarded to all Allied and Italian military personnel and to patriots who in any way helped in the liberation of the capital.

The Ministry of War proposed to determine the type of medal and ribbon and to leave it to the Commanders of the Higher formations to grant to their troops authority to wear it.

General Truscott replied as per attached copy, conveying his thanks and approval of the plan and pointing to the beneficial effect which in the years to come such a link would have, as a reminder to Americans that they sacrificed their lives on Italian soil for a common ideal.

In accordance with the desire of H.R.H. I am therefore requesting you to let me know whether this measure could be enacted by the Italian Government.
