The nominal HQ of this bakery is at ARNOLD, which is about 20 Kilometres along the coast to the north of GENOA.

The word nominal is used because the bakery does not function at the moment, bread being supplied to the Mantova Division under civilian contract.

The equipment is stored in the quartermaster's stores of the clothing depot at ARNOLD and the bakery personnel numbering 1 Marso and 7 Men are employed in the clothing depot.

Under the circumstances therefore there is no basis for a normal report, the only point to note being that the 7 men bakery referred to were trained at the CBR Commissariato, MILAN.

This being so, their training is wasted, since they are nothing but labourers at the moment.

a) A substantial difference exists between TURIN and GENOA C & B Centres.
The former is a factory equipped with manufacturing machinery further than repairs
devices, whilst the latter is a factory ^{not} equipped for the manufacturing of brand new
shoes, but merely equipped for carrying out repairs.

b) The carrying out of working systems cannot interest GENOA as TURIN factory
is functioning under the direct supervision of M of W.

c) Raw materials used for repairs are supplied by the C & B factory of TURIN,
and so for, are the same used in the process of brand new boots manufacture.

d) Allocations for the C & B Warehouses, be uniforms or boots, are made out
directly by the M of W, drawing them from regional resources. Henceforth the direct
sup from Turin could not work out, without the approval and consequent allocation
from M of W.

e) The main difference between GENOA and TURIN is, that the former has received a big allocation of second-hand Allied boots and another quantity of boots Polish and Worker types, not too tough. Other allocation of brand new boots was lately distributed as 20% spare. M of W is aware of this situation.

f) No particular remarks re uniforms. Same have been allocated for the manufacturing in an egal quantity, with the difference that TURIN can manage the manufacture of a great part in his own factory, whilst GENOA will be in posn to manage only a small part of them, and will be compelled to give the remaining to private firms.

Il Comando Militare Territoriale di Genova con foglio n°02/11535/Serg. del 5 c.m., ha disposto che un Ufficiale Commissario fosse inviato, con lettera di presentazione del 2° B.L.U., al 1° B.L.U. di Torino allo scopo di:

- prendere contatto con l'Opificio Militare di Torino e attingere in posto notizie sulle costruzioni in atto;
- sulla qualità delle materie prime impiegate;
- sulla possibilità da parte dell'Opificio stesso di rifornire di vestiario e calzature gli Enti della circoscrizione del Comando Militare Territoriale di Genova.

In modo particolare dovevasi prendere in esame il problema della scarpe.

Con lettera di presentazione del 2° B.L.U. di Genova, il 9 Agosto 1946 si recava a Torino al 1° B.L.U. il sottoscritto Ten. Commissario S.M.E. FERRERI Vincenzo.

La visita, d'accordo col 2° B.L.U., ha avuto le seguenti conclusioni:

- il Centro Confezioni e Recuperi di Torino differisce da quello di Genova in modo sostanziale. Il primo è uno stabilimento attrezzato di macchinari atti alla costruzione, oltre che alla riparazione, di scarpe; il Centro Confezioni e Recuperi di Genova è un laboratorio non attrezzato alla confezione di calzature nuove; è solamente adibito alle riparazioni;
- i sistemi di lavorazione e la loro attuazione presso l'Opificio di Torino non interessano Genova perchè gli stabilimenti funzionano alle dirette dipendenze del Ministero della Guerra;
- le materie prime usate nelle riparazioni calzature vengono normalmente rifornite dal Centro confezioni e Recuperi (Opificio) di Torino e perciò sono le stesse che l'Opificio adopera per le sue confezioni e riparazioni;

le assegnazioni ai Magazzini V.E., sia di divise che di calzature, vengono fatte direttamente dal Ministero della Guerra traendole dal complesso delle disponibilità regionali. Inattuabile quindi il rifornimento diretto da Torino senza l'assegnazione del Ministero stesso;

At present Dunnage is approximately 1in. Suggest at least 2in. or even higher.

Ref Para h.

Suggest O.C. Depot checks all stacks once monthly and initials Tally Cards accordingly.

Ref Para M.

Suggest Fire Buckets(2 water and 1 of sand) be provided in at least six places in Main Depot and six in Main Yard. Fire Extinguishers now held should have card attached stating date last inspected by O.C. and his initials.

Ref Para n.

Rat Traps should be provided and placed around stacks at night.

Ref Para o.

At present, Depot and Guard personnel are accommodated in an old shed; this appears to be most unsuitable, roof etc in need of repairs. Would suggest complete overhaul or new soon provided.
