MAINTENANCE OF LAW AND ORDER

1. GENERAL.

- (a) The initial responsibility for the maintenance of law and order rests on I-16, who have the Carabinieri under their control for this purpose. Personnel of the ILLINOIS Group will only be employed to deal with civil disturbance on orders of the local Area/Sub Area Comd. (Comd LEGHIO Group in the case of 144 Inf Regt). Orders will normally be passed by officers of 56 ILL.
- (b) If there is a possibility of tps becoming involved in a purely civil disturbance, the local Italian Comd will confine all Italian tps to barracks.
- (c) A disturbance in which military personnel are involved is a military responsibility and will be dealt with accordingly.
- (d) Particulars of disturbances, damage to persons or property, and any case in which circumstances cause the local Italian Comd to depart from the principles in sub paras (a) - (c) above, will be reported without delay to the nearest available officer of 56 ILL.

2. ORDERS FOR EMPLOYMENT OF TPS TO QUELL CIVIL DISTURBANCE.

- (a) In cases where Allied or Italian tps are used to quell disturbances the following instructions will apply :-
 - (i) All possible measures will be taken to quell the disturbance without recourse to firing.
 - (ii) Tps will be moved to the scene of the disturbance with arms unloaded.
 - (iii) Weapons will be loaded only on the comd of an officer.
 - (iv) Only rifles and pistols will be carried by tps. Automatic weapons if taken will be held in reserve. Automatic weapons will only be used as a last resort and only against armed resistance. Grenades are specifically prohibited.
 - (v) NO tps will open fire upon rioters except on the express order of an offr.
 - (vi) An offr giving the order to fire will :-
 - (a) Nominate clearly who is to fire.

(c) A disturbance in which military personnel are involved is a military responsibility and will be dealt with accordingly.

(d) Particulars of disturbances, damage to persons or property, and any case in which circumstances cause the local Italian Comd to depart from the principles in sub paras (a) - (c) above, will be reported without delay to the nearest available officer of 56 IU.

2. ORDERS FOR APPOINTMENT OF TPS TO QUELL CIVIL DISTURBANCE.

(a) In cases where Allied or Italian tps are used to quell disturbances the following instructions will apply :-

(i) All possible measures will be taken to quell the disturbance without recourse to firing.

(ii) Tps will be moved to the scene of the disturbance with arms unloaded.

(iii) Weapons will be loaded only on the command of an officer.

(iv) Only rifles and pistols will be carried by tps. Automatic weapons if taken will be held in reserve. Automatic weapons will only be used as a last resort and only against armed resistance. Grenades are specifically prohibited.

(v) NO tps will open fire upon rioters except on the express order of an officer.

(vi) An officer giving the order to fire will :-

- (a) Nominate clearly who is to fire.
- (b) State the target, which will if possible, be the ringleaders of the disturbance.
- (c) State the number of rounds to be fired.
- (d) Order the firing to cease as soon as it becomes effective.

Officers must bear in mind that they are only justified in using the minimum force necessary to quell the disturbance.

(vii) The following will NOT be permitted :-

- (a) Firing over the heads of a crowd.
- (b) The use of blank am.
- (c) Firing on women and children.
- (d) The use of smoke, tear gas or chemicals of any kind.

(b) The decision whether to open fire or NOT will rest with the OC Tps. If possible previous warning will be given to rioters that fire will be opened and that it will be effective. The OC Tps must maintain strict control of his men and independent action by individuals must be avoided except in clearly defined cases of self defence.

3. SECURITY IN 60 SUB AREA. (Not applicable to 155 Arty and 114 Inf Regts).

Tps may be required to guard vital installations or to deal with riots in GENOA, SAVONA or VADO LIGURE. The following preliminary measures will be taken. All rescue will be as inconspicuous as possible.

(a) Vital installations will be studied, and tentative plans will be prepared for guarding them from sabotage. In SAVONA the docks and coal apparatus, and in VADO LIGURE the bulk oil installations are of particular importance. In GENOA a knowledge of the topography of the town is essential.

(b) Arrangements will be made for organizing mobile columns of one bn in IT at three hours notice. (Rehearsals should be carried out).

(c) Alternative RV's will be selected where tps required for duty in any of the towns named in sub para (a) above can debus and form a base.

4. PROCEDURE FOR CALLING OUT TPs.

The following is intended only as a guide. Details will vary according to circumstances. The example is drawn up with reference to 60 Sub Area and 76 Inf Regt, but is applicable in the main to other areas.
