2. A case in point is the Italian Service and AF Coy A.C. (Op. It. Servizi e Trasporti AC.) detachment at Genoa using the designation "265/1 Coy (Autonoma Antieri)."
3. Where alleged BR-ITI Service units cannot be identified in the Italian Army Strength State, they will be refused maintenance at British BID's and instructions issued by this office that they will be maintained from ITI-ITI depots until inquiry as to the proper status is made.
4. Detachment Italian Service and AF Coy AC at Genoa is a BR-ITI unit and arrangements will be made by this office for rations to be drawn from 15 BID Genoa in future.
5. AMIA LO Genoa letter GSN/ 15/4 dated 21 Nov. 49 is cancelled.

DISTRIBUTION DEPOT.-

1. At approx 1630 hours 29 October, Commissariato Genoa informed this office that the river POLCIVERA which runs alongside the Distribution Depot Genoa had burst its banks and smashed the wall surrounding the depot; the depot was flooded to a depth of approx 8 ft, the heavy rains commenced at approx 1930 hours 28 October and continued until 1400 hours 30 Oct.-
2. Capt Cotton endeavoured to reach the depot using all routes leading there-to, but the routes were either closed by landslides or the depth of water was such that it was impossible to get a vehicle through.-
3. The Commissariato Genoa in the meantime managed to get a detachment of the Civilian Fire Brigade and some Army Engineers to the depot in an attempt to carry out salvage work, but this had to be abandoned in view of rising water and mud.
4. At 0830 hours 30 October Capt Cotton accompanied by Colonel Giuliani (Comm.Genoa) and SQMS Laing visited the depot which was found under approx three feet of mud and water, and to enter the depot it was necessary to climb in over roof tops and down ladders; the road leading into the depot still being under water.-
5. All store rooms were visited and it was found that the majority of stacks had collapsed through the force of water, and the contents were lying in three feet of mud. The only stacks remaining standing were flour; the water had risen to a height of nine sacks. The opinion of this office is that the majority of cases commodity and approx 33 1/3 % of the sacked

Genoa informed this office that the river POLCEVERA which runs alongside the Distribution Depot Genoa had burst its banks and smashed the wall surrounding the depot; the depot was flooded to a depth of approx 8 ft, the heavy rains commenced at approx 1930 hours 28 October and continued until 1400 hours 30 Oct.-

2. Capt Cotton endeavoured to reach the depot using all routes leading there-to, but the routes were either closed by landslides or the depth of water was such that it was impossible to get a vehicle through.--

3. The Commissariato Genoa in the meantime managed to get a detachment of the Civilian Fire Brigade and some Army Engineers to the depot in an attempt to carry out salvage work, but this had to be abandoned in view of rising water and mud.

4. At 0830 hours 30 October, Capt Cotton accompanied by Colonel Giuliani (Comm. Genoa) and SQMS Iaing visited the depot which was found under approx three feet of mud and water, and to enter the depot it was necessary to climb in over roof tops and down ladders; the road leading into the depot still being under water.--

5. All store rooms were visited and it was found that the majority of stacks had collapsed through the force of water, and the contents were lying in three feet of mud. The only stacks remaining standing were flour; the water had risen to a height of nine sacks. The opinion of this office is that the majority of eased commodities and approx 33 1/3 % of the sacked items will be salvaged.

6. As seen as the entrance and yard of the ~~depot~~ ^{Genoa} has been cleared of mud, vehicles will transport the salvaged commodities to the Magazzini Generali and for this purpose SQMS Iaing is representing this office. This work will proceed as and when weather condition permit.--

7. In view of the outside wall of the Distribution Depot being damaged the guard posts have been strengthened.--

BULK DEPOT.-

1. The only damage to the Bulk Depot was that the roof (approx 5 square feet) blew off but the personnel covered all threatened commodities with tarpaulins and built channels with saw dust. Negligible damage was caused due to the efforts of the depot staff. At the time of visit 1030 hours 30 Oct the roof was being repaired.-

2. Due to this storm, the already delapidated billets of depot personnel are uninhabitable; steps must be taken by the Ministry of War to speed up provision of better accommodation.

GENERAL.-

1. Detailed lists of stock lost through the storm will be notified as soon as possible but it is pointed out that salvage work is going to be extremely difficult.

2. In view of the fact that it will not be possible to use the Distribution Depot for issues on the 6th Nov, it is hoped to procure a part of Stabia Barracks for a short period, and when 2 Bulk Depot moves to Milan it is suggested that the Distribution Depot moves to the former's location.

3. Details regarding move of Bulk Depot, stocks, etc. will be forwarded as soon as prepared.-



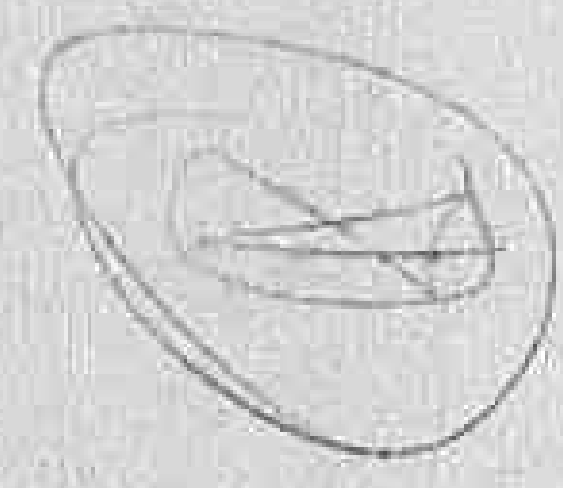

Reference to verbal communication regarding remarks on bread baked with mixed flour supplied to Guards at 2 Bulk Depot.

On August 45, 519 Guard Bn had dislocated his detachments at Varazze - Vado Ligure - Arenzano - Giove Ligure - Camogli - and Portofino and Uscio and considering the distance from Genoa, under request of said Hq., it has been authorized the baking of bread on the place and therefore the drawing of flour in lieu of bread.

Detachments of said Battalion, in a second time moved to other places, in the neighbourhood of Genoa, and the Hq. availing themselves of above authorization continued to get bread from private enterprises (Giovannelli Bakery - Piazza Colombo No.1).

From investigations resulted that on 5th inst., owing to a mistake of civil personnel working at the Bakery, the remainder of a bag of mixed flour (23 Kos) intended for civil consumption was used for the baking of military bread.

No responsibility in the matter has been found by the Commander of II Guard Bde to be charged on military personnel.

This Directorate has disposed that all elements of said Guard Bde located in Genoa and neighbourhood draw bread from the 2 Military Bakery.

Summarizing:

- there are no irregularities in issuing food to the guard personnel at the above Depot.-
- the misunderstanding is certainly due to the fact that servicemen in question did not answer too clearly when questioned, probably because unable to express themselves more clearly.

You are informed of following inconveniencies noted during the supplying of additional items, requesting that an interest be taken in the matter to eliminate them:

SOAP FROM NAPLES: Cases were packed with thread instead of iron wire. Lieut Col Penrose, from MMIA, who lately inspected the Food Bulk Depot, pointed out that the Mission released a quantity of iron wire to the Military Administration just to avoid inconveniency in question, and he was surprise in seeing the boxes tide up with thread.

ARRIVAL OF ITEMS FROM LEGHORN: Trucks are arriving without the despatch tickets and any other documents which shows the loading of each truck and indication as to distribution of loading of each rail car coming from the South to the trucks. Since trucks coming from Leghorn are to proceed, when necessary, to Milan, Turin and Alessandria, it is easy to understand the enconveniencies which arise. It was, therefore, necessary to assign officers to the various loading to secure consignments, which it would not be possible all the times due to shortage of officers.

The Direzione Commissariato of Florence, informed of the above by telegraph, answered that despatching of items from Leghorn is carrying out only by Allied authorities and that the only task of Special Food Depot, Leghorn, is to supply labours and to complete, possibly, the escort personnel.

We were informed by a few units under the II Terr. Hq. which are drawing rations from the 203 D.I.D., that there are some discrepancies between the ration scale to which they are entitled and what they receive, as a result of which it would be opportune to allow units concerned to check on weight of items upon their withdrawal.

In addition, it has been noted that the drawing of vegetables and fresh fruits, even if it takes place once every two days, is causing a noteworthy perishing of said items due to the present hot season.

It would be appreciated; therefore, that during the summer said perishable items be not issued by the D.I.D., authorizing units in question to purchase them directly from the market.

Your Headquarters is informed of the above in order to obtain the required authority.
