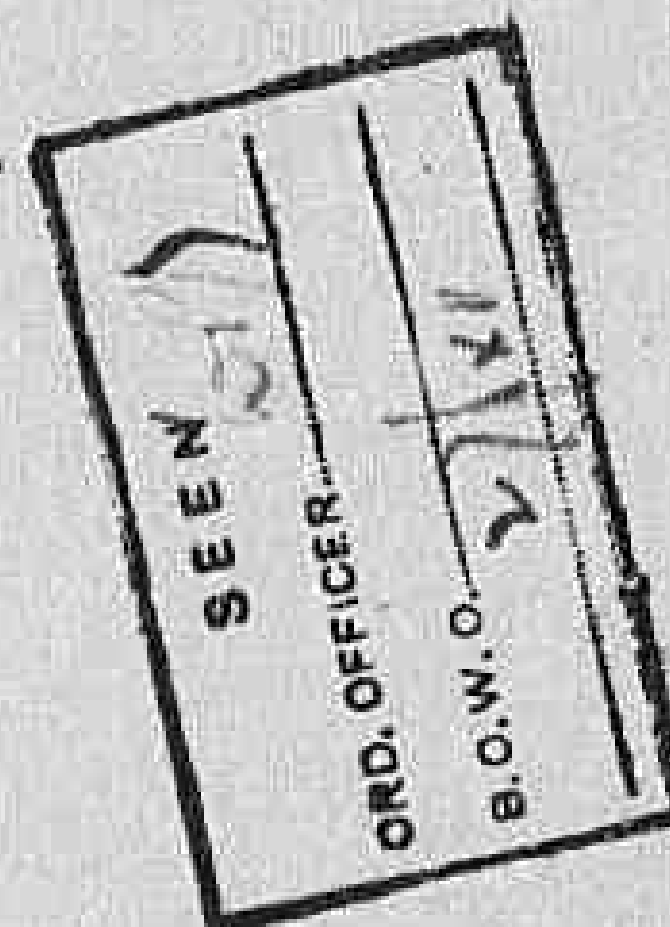

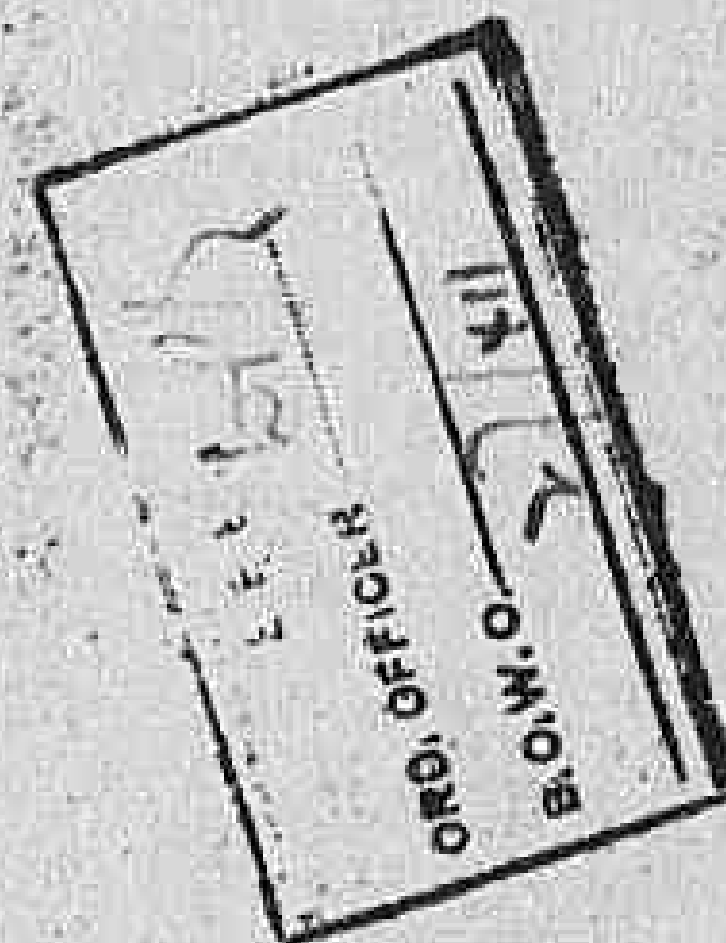

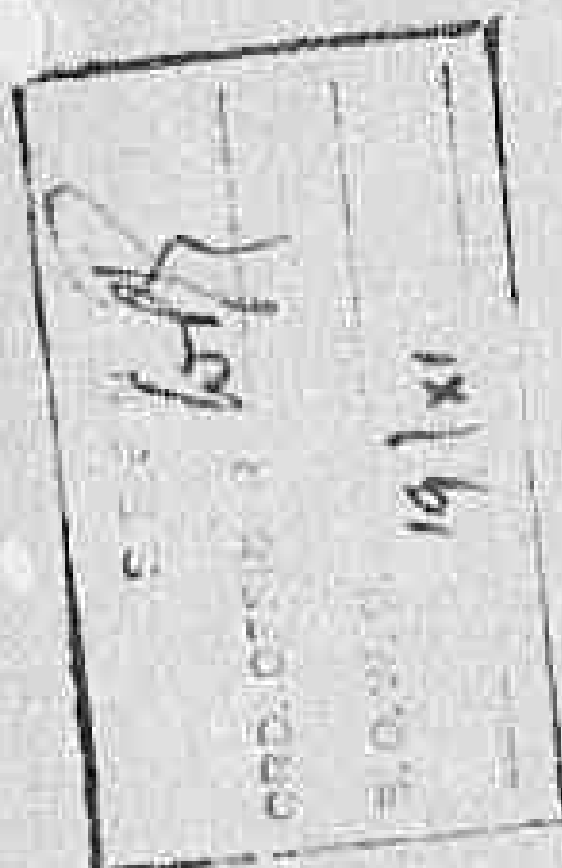

In other words those who have deferred under the "gentleman's agreement" ARE eligible for LIAP, provided they fulfil the other conditions laid down in above G-1(B) letter.

My Dear Geake,

You are aware that, as regards release, there exists at present a so-called "Gentleman's Agreement" (presumably a Gentlewoman's Agreement) in the case of ATSI, by which personnel can defer release indefinitely without binding themselves under any official obligation.

You are also doubtless aware that nobody within six months of release may proceed on LIAP.

Now it seems to me that it is likely that a number of officers may hesitate to defer under the gentleman's agreement because they are under the impression that they are ineligible for LIAP - being technically within six months of the date on which they would be due for release; indeed in some cases being past it!

We propose therefore that any officer, (male or female), who defers under the gentleman's agreement, should be granted LIAP in his or her turn, if otherwise eligible, provided that there is a reasonable expectation that he or she will not demand to be released for at least six months from the day after he or she proceeds on LIAP. Of course, if subsequent to the grant of LIAP, circumstances

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Now it seems to me that it is likely that a number of officers may hesitate to defer under the gentleman's agreement because they are under the impression that they are ineligible for LIAP - being technically within six months of the date on which they would be due for release; indeed in some cases being past it!

We propose therefore that any officer, (male or female), who defers under the gentleman's agreement, should be granted LIAP in his or her turn, if otherwise eligible, provided that there is a reasonable expectation that he or she will not demand to be released for at least six months from the day after he or she proceeds on LIAP. Of course, if subsequent to the grant of LIAP, circumstances, either private, compassionate or business, arise, which force the individual to require release before the six months elapses, he or she must be released, and the situation accepted as the rub of the green.

Will you please publicise this as much as possible amongst those under you, as I hope that thereby we may secure a contribution to help to offset our serious officer shortage.

I would remind you that we are not allowed by the War Office to issue any official instructions re the gentleman's agreement.

On the evening of the 22nd January 1945, I and three other storemen were with 20 lorries of an Italian convoy, there being an Italian sergeant in charge of same. The lorries were empty and were proceeding to 2 Sub Depot, 557 B.O.D. for the purpose of collecting stores. The journey was broken at Naples for the purpose of refreshment. The Italian sergeant in charge detailing 5 Italian personnel as guard. On return at approx. 18-00 hours one of the Italian personnel reported that his lorry was missing, he being one of the five men on guard. I then asked whether he had informed his sergeant of the occurrence and he replied that he did not know the sergeant's whereabouts. I had to wait and see the sergeant first before reporting the same, as I could not understand the Italian sufficiently to give full details to the C.M.P. The sergeant returned at approx. 20-00 hours, and I then obtained full particulars. At approx. 22-00 hrs I took the Italian driver to the C.M.P. They questioned him and took full particulars. I then asked if they required my name and number, to which they replied "No".

On returning to D.A.D.O.S. Dump I reported one vehicle as having been stolen, reporting same to Staff Sergeant Crosby.

Myself and the other three English soldiers witnessed the mounting of the five Italian guards, who were detailed by their sergeant. We then went to the canteen for tea.

On returning shortly afterwards, we were informed by the guards that one of the lorries was missing. We asked how long the lorry had been missing, and they replied that they did not see it go. The driver of the missing vehicle was one of the sentries, and he reported that he had immobilised his lorry as soon as it was parked. Acting on this information, Pte. Backus informed the G.M.P.

During the evening of 22nd January 1945, at approx. 1700 hrs, I with the other three English storemen, having seen the vehicles of the convoy into the car park adjoining the Royal Opera House Naples, left them under the care of five of the Italian drivers after which we walked to the nearby NAAFI for tea.

Upon returning about half an hour later, we were informed by an Italian driver that his vehicle had been removed. He gave us to understand that he was a member of the guard, and that the vehicle had been immobilised by removal of the rotor arm, which was still in his possession. The lorries were parked in two ranks at the back of the area, and the missing vehicle had been taken from the rear rank, apparently without being seen by the guards. The loss was discovered by them in a check up. At first it was suspected that one of the other drivers had driven away the truck for some reason, but as the drivers returned, this theory had to be abandoned. Consequently Pte. Backus informed the C.M.P. Naples.

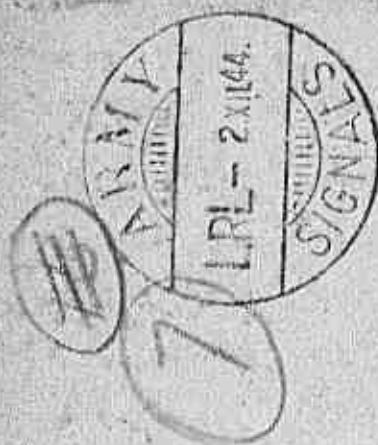
