Subject: Explanation of Census.

1. The monthly Census of Vehicles and Warlike stores received from Units of this formation are very rarely correct, therefore I am forwarding the following explanations of these Census, in the hope that Units will realise how important they are, and that it is really essential that they are correct. It is hoped that if Units clearly understand the objects of the Census, they will find more interest in its completion, and eventually, both their work and ours will be reduced.

"B" Vehicle Census. G.H.Q. naturally keep a record of how many vehicles are in a theatre of operations, for the following reasons:-

- (A) New vehicles can be ordered from England to maintain a pool of vehicles for you to draw on, as your vehicles are conditioned B.L.R.
- (B) Spares may be ordered from England 6 months before they are actually required, so that when indents are submitted to Depots, stores will be waiting there to meet them.

From the above, it will be clear to you that in order to demand vehicle spares from England, G.H.Q. must know the types and contract numbers of all vehicles, and also, in order to maintain their pool of vehicles, they must know how many of a certain type are in the theatre of operations.

Monthly Census of Warlike Stores. Only a certain quantity of import stores are allotted to a theatre of operations, and so, of course, G.H.Q. want to know who is using them and where they are. Also, it is considered necessary, owing to the importance of the stores in question, to keep a reserve, not only to replace U/S, but also to be available for all emergencies. Accordingly, you are asked to state the position every month, so that the records can be kept up-to-date.

Interest in its completion, and eventually, consequently, will be reduced.

Part X Vehicle Census. G.H.Q. naturally keep a record of how many vehicles are in a theatre of operations, for the following reasons:-

- (A) New vehicles can be ordered from England to maintain a pool of vehicles for you to draw on, as your vehicles are conditioned U.L.R.

Spares may be ordered from England months before they are actually required, so that when indents are submitted to Depots, stores will be waiting there to meet them.

From the above, it will be clear to you that in order to demand vehicle spares from England, G.H.Q. must know the types and contract numbers of all vehicles, and also, in order to maintain their pool of vehicles, they must know how many of a certain type are in the theatre of operations.

Monthly Census of Warlike Stores. Only a certain quantity of imports & stores are allotted to a theatre of operations, and so, of course, G.H.Q. want to know who is using them and where they are. Also, it is considered necessary, owing to the importance of the stores in question, to keep a reserve, not only to replace U/S, but also to be available for all emergencies. Accordingly, you are asked to state the position every month, so that the records can be kept up-to-date.

Part X Orders. These are really important, as you have seen from the preceding paragraphs that G.H.Q. keep records of all vehicles, and it will be obvious to you that the only they know when a vehicle becomes U/S is when you tell them, and the way you tell them is by sending two copies of a Part X Order to this office. This will forward one of the copies to G.H.Q., and the vehicle is then crossed off the record of your Unit which G.H.Q. hold. A Part X Order must be passed within 24 hours of a vehicle being conditioned B.L.R. You would soon start shouting, if you did not get a replacement, but one of the chief reasons why replacements are not always available is that Units wait a month sometimes, before submitting a Part X Order. God knows why, it is easy enough, and through the fact not being reported, G.H.Q. would think that all vehicles are on the road, while, in fact, some are U/S.

You will appreciate the magnitude of the task, and

3. Electrolyte.

This is in very short supply, the small quantity available is held by O.P.P. and will only be issued to units who provide necessary containers.

32. Clothing.

There is a world shortage of wool and it is therefore necessary to exercise strictest economy with all items of clothing. Clothing will be exchanged only when unserviceable, and not on account of appearance.

All U/G clothing will be inspected for unfair wear and tear, and disciplinary action taken where necessary.

33. M.T. Spares.

The demands for M.T. spare parts made on the O.P.P. are far in excess of normal requirements for the number of vehicles in this formation.

In order that the stock held by O.P.P. can be replenished quickly, arrangements have been made for indentors to be sent to Base by Special Air Service and stores forwarded by the quickest possible means. 36. Cleaning Materials.

Unit contingently make the excuse that the bad condition of their equipment is due to non-availability of cleaning materials. This excuse which reflects upon the efficiency of Ordnance, and particularly the B.O.W.O.'s concerned, will not be tolerated.

Cleaning materials have never been in short supply and in all cases where enquiries have been instigated, it has been found that the unit concerned have been in possession of cleaning materials which have not been used.

1. Small Arms.

38. Jerkine Leather.

All leather jerkins will be returned to DADOS Dump immediately, tied in bundles of ten. Units will report to DADOS any action taken in respect of deficiencies.

39. Winter Clothing.

Units will submit indents immediately through usual channels, to bring themselves up to full scale of Winter Clothing.

40. B.O.W.O's.

There is a strong possibility that B.O.W.O's will be withdrawn from this formation, their past efforts having been so successful that higher authority considers their retention no longer necessary. Until their withdrawal, their advice and assistance where necessary will continue to be at the disposal of units they serve.

1. It is apparent from the recent confusion over indenting for stores that the true meaning of 1st & 2nd Ech Repair and its effect on store procedure is not appreciated by LADs or Wkps. For LADs and Wkps to function efficiently, it is essential that they both fulfil their correct role and thereby complete the chain of repair and recovery.

2b Function of the LAD

Primary purpose assistance to Unit Fitters and 1st Line Repair beyond the capacity of Unit Fitters.

1st Line Repair consists of work which does not entail the replacement of a major assembly and the LAD must immediately render a completed ARG. 1045 to ME Wkps for any vehicles requiring the replacement of a major assembly as detailed below:-

Vehicles (also applicable to Carriers)

- 1. Engines. 2. Gearbox. 3. Front & Rear Axle.
- 4. Transfer Box. 5. Chassis, Cab and Body. 6. Any part which entails removal of an assembly from the vehicle.

Motor Cycles

- 1. Engine. 2. Gearbox. 3. Frame.

3. Function of ME Wkps (2nd Line Repair)

Primary function is the replacement of major assemblies secondary, to assist LADs with excess first line repairs. All 3rd Line Repairs being back-loaded to REME Wkps BORGOSAN LORENZO for repair and return to LEGNANO.

Note:- From the above it will be seen that the chain of repair is Unit - LAD - ME Wkps - REME Wkps (BORGOSAN LORENZO) and eventually back to LEGNANO. It is therefore important that vehicles requiring repair should be back-loaded with the minimum amount of delay to that Wksp capable of its repair and it is also essential that these vechs should not be cannibalised as otherwise their final repair and return to the LEGNANO GRUPPO is made extremely difficult (if not impossible).

These are held by Units, LADs and Wkps and are in proportion to the work to be undertaken by each.

(a) Stores for 1st Line Repair (LAD)

(i) Unit FAMTO held by LAD covers repairs and replacement items for major assemblies which do not entail the removal of EMX or any major stripping of major assembly engine - gaskets held in FAMTO and will therefore be replaced by LAD. Crankshaft not held in FAMTO or in OFP and will therefore not be replaced by OFP.

(ii) OFP - Reserve of stores to replenish Unit FAMTOs and must be regarded as the store section of all DADs and to act as a reservoir between the LADs and Base (Ord.) supplies. For the OFP and LAD to function smoothly and efficiently this point must always be borne in mind and it must be realised that major assemblies are only supplied to 2nd Line Wks (IE Wkps)

(iii) When indenting for spares LADs should adopt the following procedure:-

For vch awaiting 1st Line Repair - indent to cover sufficient spares for that ONE vch ie one gasket not 20 indent to be endorsed with vch WD No -

For the replacement of used FAMTO - to be endorsed "For FAMTO replacement" and if FAMTO scaling is 10 and 6 items have been used then the indent must be for 5 and NOT 20.

9. Greatcoats are in very short supply, and units will make every effort to equip each man with a greatcoat from those already issued. When it is found impossible to fit a man with a greatcoat, infants will be submitted for deficiencies, to reach D.A.D.U.S. office by 1 Feb. Care must be taken to ensure that the correct sizes are stated on infants.

10. Boot Repairs.

Boots will be inspected once per week, and repaired immediately the sole is broken. Boots will not be returned until major repairs are necessary. Arrangements have been made for boots to be repaired locally. Units will hand in boots for repair to D.A.D.U.S. Disp. Boots will be securely tied together in pairs, and each boot to have label showing, Name, Rank, Unit and "Boatman".

11. Socks.

Dubbin is available in every unit, and will be used on all boots. The practice of using poison will cease.

12. Shoes.

Shoes will be inspected once per week. Units will ensure that they are kept in good repair. It is not necessary for any man to have shoes with holes.

13. Chimney Warrant Officers.

The C.W.O.'s on D.A.D.U.S. staff are available to advise and assist units on all stores matters. Unit Q.M.'s should apply to D.A.D.U.S. office for the name of the C.W.O. allocated to his unit.

14. Equipment.

Units will submit a list of all items deficient as soon as possible.

15. Blankets.

Efforts are being made to equip all men to four blankets. As these become available, they will be issued to units without infants.

16. Gloves and Vests.

Gloves and Vests will shortly be available, and will be issued to units without infants.

Unserviceable stores will not be brought on charge.

Discrepancies.

Units will check stores on collection from D.A.D.O.S. dump, and a signature will be obtained. Discrepancies from units therefore will not be admitted.

When stores are received, and a deficiency is found, the vouchers will be marked "see reverse", and the quantities voucherised, received, and discrepancy will be shown on both copies of vouchers. This will be signed by O. i/c Dump and initialised by Brit. M.C.O. and passed to D.A.D.O.S. office.

Responsibility.

The O. i/c Dump is responsible for the issue, storing, maintenance, accounting, and guarding of all stores.

D.A.D.O.S. (Int.) is responsible for receipt and demanding of stores on depots.

Guard.

The O. i/c Dump will forward a copy of Guard Orders to this office.

Fire.

Fire Orders will be prominently displayed in Dump, and copy sent to this office.

Smoking.

Smoking is not allowed in storehouses. The O. i/c Dump will reserve areas and offices where smoking is allowed.
