Further to this HQ Sig. 4/2/22 of 27 Jan 46 addressed 5 BU, copy to you. Both Major Hope Johnstone (G II at this HQ) and myself were due for L.I.A.P. prior to the institution of the new leave regulations governed by GHOs 461 of 23 June 46 and under the then existing rules had already qualified for 28 days leave (L.I.A.P.), and working on this assumption Major Hope Johnstone has taken SEVEROM in this country (Italy). These new regulations seem an unjust imposition without due warning for there are many who have already had 2 L.I.A.P.s and are now entitled w.e.f. 1 July 46 to an additional 2 periods of 19 days each within the ensuing year. i.e. had Major Hope Johnstone and myself for example taken our L.I.A.P. prior to 1st July 46 we should be entitled to 2 additional periods of 19 days each w.e.f. 1 July 46; we are therefore forfeiting 23 days leave.

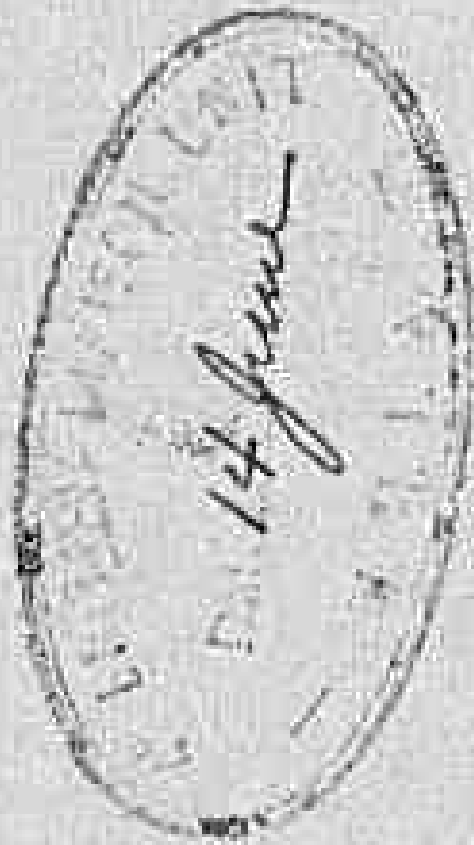

1. General

Due to the reduction of staff, Movement Control at certain Scottish ports will be discontinued, but to ensure that leave personnel proceeding to the Islands of Scotland receive their full period of leave, the following procedure will be adhered to. This will cover leave to the Islands of Scotland and to certain ports on the mainland served by steamer for personnel of all Services travelling on leave by the overland route.

2. Orkney, Shetland and the Western Islands of Scotland and points on the Mainland of Scotland reached by steamer from Oban or Kyle of Lochalsh.

Commencing 1st June, units overseas will issue to personnel proceeding on leave to these Islands (and to points on the mainland served by steamship as stated above) a pro forma, specimen attached, in addition to AF W 3145.

3. Bearers of this document will present it, together with AF W 3145, at the port of entry in the United Kingdom to the L.S.O. who will stamp the pro forma with the same date for return as that stamped on AF W 3145, L.S.O. will withdraw the pro formae, and Embarkation Commandant will arrange to despatch them immediately to Q(M) Scottish Command.

On receipt, Q(M) Scottish Command will calculate the actual date for return, based on giving the holder 29 days or 15 days as appropriate, in the Island, making allowance for any additional voyage to an outer Island. Q(M) Scottish Command will telegraph the corrected date to the officer or man at his leave address. Personnel will retain this telegram with them until reporting back to unit as authority for the later date of return.

4. With effect from 1st June R.T.Os and Movement Control Officers at Stromness, Aberdeen, Thurso, Inverness, Stirling and Oban will no longer be responsible for stamping passes, but may be applied to in case of need by individuals. 378

5. For the Islands of Islay, Jura, Arran and Bute (and for certain points in the mainland of Argyllshire shown on the pro forma) served by steamers sailing from the Firth of Clyde, R.T.O. Glasgow Central or St. Enoch will continue to be responsible for stamping passes. The L.S.O. at the United Kingdom port of entry in such cases will not date the AF W 3145 for return and no pro forma will be issued by units.

2. Orkney, Shetland and the Western Islands of Scotland and points on the Mainland of Scotland reached by steamer from Oban or Kyle of Lochalsh.

They will take this certificate back to their unit as authority for late return.

- (ix) Other ranks holding appointments carrying higher rates of pay (e.g. R.M.S.) will retain such additional emoluments throughout the whole period of absence from Unit on leave unless replacement promotion or appointment has been authorized under (iii) or (iv) above.
- (x) In cases where replacement, promotion or appointment is NOT authorized under (iii) or (iv) above officers or soldiers performing the duties of individuals on leave will have NO claim to be promoted or appointed to the rank etc. or to the additional emoluments appropriate to the duties performed under this rule.
- (xi) Paid acting ranks or appointments or additional emoluments relinquished by ~~Officers and~~ Other Ranks because of replacement, promotion etc. under (iii) or (iv) above will be restored from the date on which individuals resume their former duties on return to their Units from leave.
- (xii) In cases where an individual has NOT relinquished paid acting rank or appointment under (iii) or (iv) above and his Unit has been disbanded or his appointment lapses during his absence on leave he will relinquish paid acting rank or appointment or additional emolument from the date on which his unit is disbanded or his appointment lapses. Full details of such cases will be cabled to the War Office without delay.
