1. H.Q. 3 District report that examination of the master rolls for Civil Labour shows a considerable amount of Labour is now being paid from public funds for which there is no justification. In addition it is apparent that Labour units are in many cases being used uneconomically and on duties for which they were not authorised.

2. The War Office has recently issued instructions calling for rigid economy in local expenditure including expenditure on local Labour, which constitutes a large item in the overall expenditure of the Army overseas.

3. Energetic action must therefore be taken to review all existing employments, both by Labour employing services at formation HQ and by individual unit commanders, and the necessary instructions should be issued to all concerned immediately to :-

(a) Examine the necessity for all civilian labour employed and to discharge any Labour that is not absolutely essential.

(b) Ensure that all civil labour retained in a proper charge against public funds, and in any case where it is desired to retain labour which is not a proper charge against public funds to ensure that the wages of such labour are only paid from private funds.

(c) Examine to what extent economies can be effected by pooling certain types of labour between neighbouring units, e.g. washerwomen.

(d) Ensure that with reducing commitments, labour employed is kept constantly under review so that surplus labour can be discharged immediately the need for it has passed.

(e) Examine the duties on which labour units or deta are employed with a view to effecting economies.

4. The need for economy in the employment of civil labour must not be construed as an excuse to use SEP/IV labour in replacement of discharged civilians. The AFHQ policy on the employment of SEP/IV remains unchanged.

5. There appears to be a general tendency to raise the rate of pay in the grade to the maximum as soon as possible. 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APPENDIX 'A'NOTES ON THE EMPLOYMENT OF CIVIL LABOURGROUP I - Professional, Administrative, Supervisory and Clerical Staff

Civilians in this Group may only be employed against deficiencies in WE. The mere fact that Military personnel cannot be provided against a deficiency on a WE is NOT justification for the employment of civilians. Military necessity is the only justification and employing units must be prepared to justify on these grounds all civilians employed in this Group.

GROUP II - MT Drivers and Mess Staff and Servants (such as waiters, Cooks and Orderlies)

The same considerations apply as for Group I except that in the case of Mess Staff and Servants, the scales applicable are those in ACI 380/45.

NOTE :- In certain cases units may be employing Group I and

II civilians in excess of WE on the authority of an Area Comd. Such authorities are valid for not more than two months and if the need is likely to exceed that period action must be taken to obtain an increase in WE before the period expires. When disposing of applications for employment in excess of WE Area Comds will consider the application in relation to other similar units and will satisfy themselves that the need is real and not due to some fault in the administration of the Unit.

GROUP III - Interpreters

It is thought that in some instances one or more interpreters are being employed as a convenience when the actual interpreting duties do not justify the whole time employment of an interpreter at all. The fact that more than one officer in a unit requires the occasional services of an interpreter does not of itself justify the employment of a second interpreter. The wage of this grade are comparatively high and the employment of interpreters must be kept to the essential minimum. All authorities for the employment of interpreters will in future reviewed every two months.

GROUP IV - Hotel Staff

The employment of civilians in this group is governed by Administrative Instructions No. 3 and 16. It should not be necessary to employ any civilians in excess of those engaged and paid by the Civilian Manager. Economies can be effected

GROUP III - Interpreters

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GROUP IV - Hotel Staff

The employment of civilians in this group is governed by Administrative Instructions No. 3 and 16. It should not be necessary to employ any civilians in excess of those engaged and paid by the Civilian Manager. Economies can be effected by reducing the number of hotels occupied.

GROUP V & VI - Marine Grades and Artisans

These grades are normally only employed on specific Service functions on the authority of the Head of the Service, or his authorised delegates. In exceptional circumstances Area Comds may authorise non service units to employ civilians in these groups. These authorities will however be for a specific period and purpose and will only be issued after careful examination.

1. In Italian industry it is the practice, as provided for by syndical agreement, to have in each plant a committee of employees known as an Internal Commission. This committee approximates what is known as a "works" or "shop committee" in the UK or US.
2. It is the policy of this headquarters that the formation of such Internal Commissions should be authorized. When a request for Internal Commission is initiated by the civilian employees of a military installation, the responsible military commander should encourage its formation.
