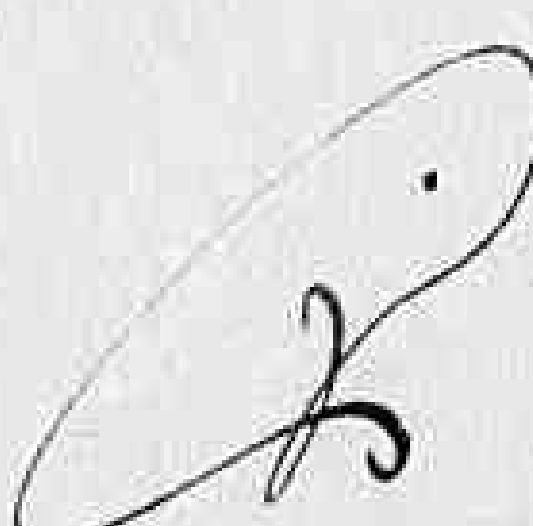

I, the undersigned, Parac. BRUNELLI ALBINO, D.R. of 7 B.L.U. state:-

On the 14 July, 46, at about 0800 hrs. I went to 7 Repair Unit, located in FORTEZZA DA BASSO, to park there the motorcycle B.S.A. No. C.5123826, being a holiday and consequently not having to use on duty the a.m. vehicle.

The motorcycle was placed by me under the proper shed, used as a park for the vehicles belonging to the 7 Repair Unit.

At about 1230 hrs. same day, I returned to the 7 Repair Unit to have my meal, and I was informed by some soldiers belonging to the a.m. Unit, that the motorcycle had been taken away by Cpl. PROIETTI GUIDO.

The undersigned Cpl. PROIETTI GUIDO, born on 1922, on strength of Quartier Generale 7 T.C. and on duty with 7 B.L.U., as driver, states as follows :-

On the 14th inst. the undersigned obtained temporarily the motorcycle B.S.A. 5123826 parked in 7 Repair Unit for the purpose of going to 7 B.L.U. Quarters and reporting to his Officer Lt. APOSTOLI.

As Lt. APOSTOLI was not in VILLA PRIMAVERA (Piazzale Galileo), the undersigned went along VIALE DEI COLLI towards PONTE DI FERRO to return the motorcycle. At the curve immediately before PIAZZALE MICHELANGELO, the undersigned suddenly saw before him a Veh. TOPOLINO parked on the right side of the road; not having time to pull out to the left he tried to pass between the TOPOLINO and the trees on the right side of the road but he did not succeed and collided against the left side of the vehicle; the motorcycle remained at that place without serious damage owing to the low speed and then was recovered by the Carabinieri of Stazione VIALE DEI COLLI. In the collision the undersigned was thrown forward sustaining slight injuries. He was then helped by some civilians who were present and was taken by an American Ambulance passing there to the ISTITUTO ORTOPEDICO VILLA MARGHERITA; he remained there untill 1400 hrs. and was then taken by an Italian Military Ambulance and removed to Main Military Hospital S. GALLO where he is now under observation.

ORDER FOR CIVILIAN GUARD.

1. Civilian Guard will commence duties at 1700hrs and will finish on handing over to the British Military Guard at 0900hrs the following morning.
2. The civilian guard is responsible during the stipulated hours for all property within the garden walls of the Villa Igiea.
3. One guard will be on duty at all times. Civilian guards will be held responsible for any theft occurring during these hours of duty.
4. No unauthorized person will be allowed to enter the grounds. The guard will make themselves familiar with names and ranks of personnel entitled to enter, and will ascertain the authenticity of a request to open the gate before doing so.
5. The civilian guard will station himself at the lodge gate, but will at frequent intervals patrol the area in order to ensure that no unauthorized person has entered either through the gates or over the wall.
6. The key for the main and ammunition room will be obtained from the British Military Guard at 1700hrs., and will be held by the civilian on guard together with the keys for the gate until relieved of them by the British Military Guard the following morning.
7. The main gates will be kept locked at all times, and only opened for the entrance or exit of a vehicle driven by a British or Italian soldier who can prove his identity, and is also in possession of a work ticket bearing the number of his vehicle and made out for the particular day.
8. The guard room will be kept in a clean and tidy condition.

SUBJECT: Ill-treatments suffered by Lieut. BARBARICH Stefano and two Military of the Cremona Division from the Military Police.

.....addresses omitted.....

At 2300 hours of the 11 inst., near Tombolo (Pisa) a truck 15 cwt. belonging to the "cremona" Division of Turin, driven by the private LEPORE Cesare and having on board Lieut. S.P.E. BARBARICH Stefano, Aid de Camp of the General Commanding the above ment. Division, and Cpl. SEVERA, all on duty, coming from Rome, towards Division Command of Turin, was stopped by four gripping pistols Allied Military on board of a Jeep who, afterwards were known as appertaining to the 61st QM. Military Police of Tombolo.

After having obliged them to get out of the truck, hit with fists and disarmed, the M.P.s led them to the Police Board and although the Italian Officer showed his identification Card and warrants proving travel on duty, they were beat again and enclosed in a prison completely surrounded by barbed wire.

We suppose the behaviour of the Allied Police to be attributed to the discovery on the truck of 150 litres of Petrol and American automatic weapons without any warrant.

This morning at 1200 the officer and the soldiers resumed the travel after having got back truck, arms, and petrol, but many personnel objects beside 10000 lire were held by the above ment. allied military who pretended from the officer a written declaration to certify everything was given back. The officer made such declaration to avoid, for the moment, further calamities.

In the case of the Italian soldiers Bravato Giuseppe and Sacco
Giuseppe, we obtained information from an Italian Police Officer, one Briga-
diere Scarano who told us that he and his agent had interrogated the above
mentioned soldiers but had no data as to the day these men were arrested.
On Scarano's advice I went to the Tribunale Militare Territoriale (Territo-
rial Military Tribunal) in Florence.

There, I found out that it was they who had requested the informa-
tion as to the date of arrest of the two soldiers. They have the date of
one man, but the other was arrested later. I examined the record that the
American gas dump had sent to the Italian Military Police but from their
story they don't know when the complete arrest of the two Italian soldiers
was made.

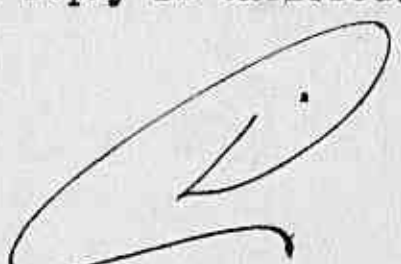

1. Since the arrival of the FOLGORE Div. in this area I have noticed several cases of their transport being driven at excessive speed. This is not only dangerous but is exceedingly bad for the vehicles for which it is practically impossible to obtain replacements.
2. Will you please take steps to ensure that this practice cases forthwith and that the various speed limits imposed are strictly adhered to.
