Subject: Extraneous duties

Reference your GB.MR./C/14 of 23 Mar'46.

1. A portion of the Port of Livorno is already under control of Italian Government, and 2 officers and 100 Carabinieri are at present employed on guard duties in this area.
2. The C.B.M. so employed depend on Legion H. for matters of discipline and administration only. All orders regarding their duties at the Port are given by the Questore, as Port Police are within the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Interior.
3. These men are drawn from various Legions and are part of the M.I. although they report for duty direct to the Questura Police Station at the Port, and within a few days will be residing in barracks, which the Questura has prepared, and equipped, within the Port area.
4. If the whole of the Port is to be handed over to the Italian Government it will be necessary to increase the present C.B.M. strength for guard duties by an additional 2 officers and 150 men.
5. To enable this to be done it is suggested that the C.B.M. engaged on such duties should be s.o.s. and not considered as part of the M.I. as they do not perform any normal duties of the C.B.M.
6. Copies of all local orders on the subject, which are issued by the Questore, herewith for information.
