to Italian Military Hospitals. Sick Partisans
may be evacuated through the same channel if
they come through the line sick. Sick from
Reception Centres should be sent to Italian Military Hospitals".

"Ex-Partisans who become sick after dispersal among the communities are not entitled to any treatment other than that in Italian Civilian Hospitals".

"For present location of Italian Military Hospitals see Appendix "A".

"Where the use of Italian Military Hospitals is impossible, casualties should be directed to the Italian Red Cross Hospitals rather than ordinary civilian hospitals!

2. Partisans in Military Hospitals must of necessity be fed Italian Military Rations because one patient can't be fed one ration and one another. Query: Is this statement correct or not?
