SUBJECT: Return of Funds - Female Neo-Fascist Prisoner Camp, Florence.

TO: Land Forces Sub Commission A.C. (MMIA) (Attn: Col. Kerr)
APO 394, US Army.

1. Basic communication is forwarded recommending approval.
2. The facts as I have them are that on 22 September when the administration of the Female Fascist Camp, Florence, was turned over to the Italian Army, the American Lieutenant who was in charge of the camp at the time of the transfer did not turn over the records and money totaling ~~\$615.625~~ which he had in his possession to the Italian Captain who was to assume command of the camp. Instead he stated at that time he was directed by AFHQ to deliver to an Allied Finance Agent, a Major Bray, the records and funds belonging to the women in the camp. According to Capt. W.C. Hammacher of 334 POW Cage here at Florence, this money belonging to the women at the camp has apparently been deposited in the Bank of Italy by Major Bray. As I understand it he was designated by the Allied Commission to act as A.F.A. for this region but Major Bray stated a few days ago that he had closed his office and was leaving Florence. I have talked to the U.S. Claims Service about this and they have furnished me with a copy of a letter written by Col. Southard to A.C. on a similar matter but in my opinion applicable to the present situation, copy attached.
3. Suggest that an investigation be instituted as to the disposition of these funds. It would appear to me that when all or any of these girls are ready to be released from the camp by the Italian Screening agency who will interrogate them shortly, that their money should be waiting for them and not tied up in some Italian bank. Referring to Para 3 of Col. Southard's letter, there can't be any question as to the kind of the currencies or their legality for it would seem to me that the identities of the funds have been lost when they were deposited in the Italian bank, unless of course a complete record was kept.
4. Regret that I can't furnish more details as to names of the American officers who handled the funds but the POW Command will have a record.



The Italian screening Commission has released most of the Girls. Eight have been detained of the Florence Questura.

The Italian Commanding officer of the Camp was instructed to inform all released Italian prisoners who had been so reclassified as friendly nationals that they should file claims with the Banca d'Italia, producing the receipts issued by American services as evidence. A.F.A letter FA/4.85 of 26 November to HQ M.M.I.A. refers.
