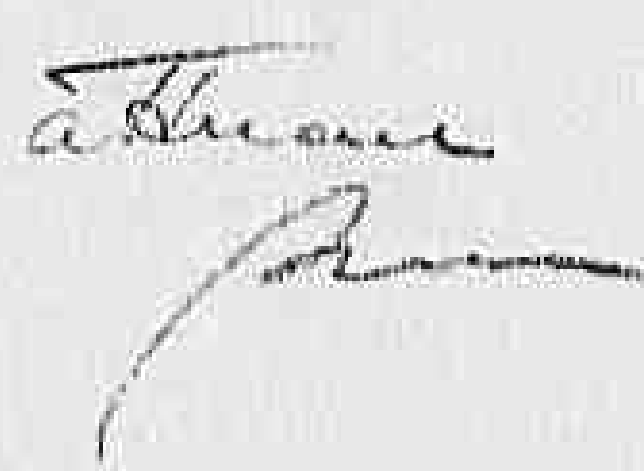

MEMORANDUM

OBJECT: Repair works at Villa Vaselli in Anzio - Via Nettuno - actually occupied by the Graves registration Unit-U.S.Army.

The Villa includes about 20 rooms and is not seriously damaged.

Repairs are indispensable and urgent for the actual precarious living conditions of the building.

Repair works, in order of importance are the following:

- 1) repair all the windows (actually there are no panes or Venetian blinds but only nets in bad conditions;
- 2) repairs to the water equipment and connecting it to the urban pipe which is running near the Villa;
- 3) repairs to toilettes and bath rooms (actually the personnel uses a field latrine, situated in the garden;
- 4) repairs to the ceiling and the plaster in some rooms and paint needed in almost all the rooms;
- 5) repairs to the electric equipment which is seriously damaged (wires removed etc.). Actually the provisory equipment is unsatisfactory and dangerous;
- 6) build a partition in a large room and arrange a little kitchen in a contiguous little room (the idea is to make a little apartment)
- 7) repair the heating equipment;

The Graves Unit can furnish some materials as pipes, wires, paint and also some not specialized workers and painter.

Is no requested a 1st. class work but only what is necessary to improve the living condition of the soldiers.

Bathroom - supply missing fixtures and toilet seat, fix lock on door.

Dressing rooms (women) A, B, C,

and D - repaint, repair shutters, replace window glass.
 Toilet E - Supply missing fixtures and toilet seat; replace broken glass, fix lock on door.

(4) Second floor - Replace and lock door to 'pink' room from stairway.

Sittings Rooms A, B, C, and D - Repair and rehang the doors; replace glass, repair blinds; repaint where necessary.

Storeroom - Replace window and screen.

Shower Room - Supply hot water boiler and storage tank and restore the plumbing; repair frosted glass.

(5) Third floor - Snack bar: replace window glass, repaint, rehang doors, rescreen, repair blinds.

1. As per verbal order of Ass't C/S, G-4, an inspection of the work being performed by the Genio Militare at Caserma Mussolini was made on Wednesday, 27 February 1946. Included in the party were representatives of: Rome Area, MTOUSA, G-4 Section and Engineer Section; French and Italian Liaison Sections; Genio Militare, and a French officer from the barracks.

2. Work in progress consisted of plumbing repairs and refinishing a series of rooms on the 4th floor to accommodate 65 non-commissioned officers. A stairway had already been refinished and painted. Work to be completed consisted of reconstruction of a kitchen and repair to an elevator used for carrying food from the basement to the dining-room on the first floor to be used by the 65 NCOs. The purpose of the inspection was to convince Rome Area and Genio Militare representatives of the importance of the kitchen and elevator repairs.

3. It was decided that the kitchen repairs were not absolutely essential, in view of the following reasons:

a. Adequate messing facilities are already provided for 300 soldiers elsewhere in the barracks. There is adequate space to cook in the present kitchen for an additional 65 NCOs.

b. Genio Militare has no intention of ever using the installation in the future for messing.

1436

c. The cost, approximately 200,000 lire for 65 men, would seem too high in view of the fact that the Italians do not plan to utilize the repaired kitchen later on themselves.

4. The work already finished, and that partially completed, was approved by Genio Militare because they realized the interior decorations would have to be made by them eventually, if they ever expected to use the installation as an office building. Since the Italians do not expect to utilize any kitchen facilities in the installation and the French are able to feed the additional 65 NCOs from the kitchen now in use, it was decided not to urge Genio Militare to undertake the repairs to the kitchen.

Object: More works to be executed at the Barrack ex Mussolini for the French Command in Rome.

The French Military Mission of War in Italy, with Paper n. 579 of the 5th ult., requests to the writing Command for the effectuation of some works, not foreseen in the project approved by the Ministry of War and in the way of being executed at the Barrack ex Mussolini.

This Command informed the Ministry of War about the question, making then follow at once two projects concerning one, the most important mural works, of the amt. of £. 2.400.000 - and the other, the hydraulic and sanitary installations, to be effectuated in addition to the other works, for the amt. of £. 360.000.

The idea was to entrust the works to the awardee of the former contract, also in consideration of the remarkable abatement offered (45? 20%) which made reduce the necessary financing to the net amt. of £ 1.500.000.

In waiting that the Ministry of War would consent the financing of works, and owing to the continuous solicitings of the French Command which needs the over-said settlements for the lodging of 65-70 officers living now in the Hotel Diana in way of derequisition, the direction of works, gave the order for the prosecution of works, also in consideration that, till then, all the the financing of works, on account of the Allied, had been always allowed, giving the greatest urgency to their execution.

Meanwhile, some more restrictive orders were given from the Ministry of War, in agreement with the M.M.I.A., in consideration of the execution and the procedure to be adopted for the works requested by the various Allied Commands.

Actually, the Unit intrusted to decide the question, is the 8th B.L.U. detached at this Command.

The works already executed, as a High Officer of this Command has already ascertained, are all those of the enclosed request of the French Mission, with the exception of the systemisation of the kitchen and the putting into a state of function of the lift and the elevator.

The works already effectuated are indeed necessary for the lodging of the French Officers, but are also of great importance for the future systemisation of the Barrack fo Italian exigencies.

We can't say the same for the works still to be executed, which would be made only, owing to French exigencies.

For this reason, this Command asks the 8th B.L.U. to give the authorization for the works already finished and to study the possibility not to adhere, for the over-said reasons, to the systemisation of the kitchen, lift and elevator.

In this way, an economy would be verified on the already requested financing of the amt. of £. 1.500.000, for the non-execution of the systemisation of the kitchen and so on, as the other works were not foreseen.

Object: New Works to be made at the barrack ex Mussolini for French troops.

Gross amt. £. 2.770.000 = Net amt. £. 1.500.000.

I. For the settlement of French troops in these barracks, there have been recently executed some works, owing to the Ministerial approval, for a total of £. 2.107.000 at the net amt.

Such works consist essentially in a revision of fixtures, reprises of plaster, various colourings, arrangements of central-heating installation and rearrangements of electric installation.

II. Successively, the French Command in Rome, requested directly at the Engineer Command, for some other ^{works} consisting in:

a) arrangements of dormitories at the 3rd floor troops' building, (repairings of fixtures, application of window-glasses, varnishing, tinting, replacement of locks);

b) arrangements of the 3rd and 4th floor Command building (arrangements of fixtures, application of window-glasses, replacements of locks, patches at floors, tinting and varnishing).

c) arrangements of the locality, destined to be "Foyer du Soldat";

d) tinting of the staircase of the Command building;

e) putting into efficiency of the rooms to be used as kitchen for sublieutenants, arrangements of the kitchen itself, of the hydraulic installations and elevators;

f) putting in use of the elevator.

Some of the works, (letters a)b)c)d), are already finished or in the way to be so. Those, concerning letters e) and f) have still to be completed.

III. For the former suppletive request, the Engineer Command informed the Engineer General Direction, sending also the relative projects of the gross amt. of £. 2.400.000 and £. 360.000, referring respectively to the mural works and to the hydraulic and sanitary installations.

In waiting that the Ministry of War should approve and finance the suppletive works, the Direction Engineer Works has provided for the continuation of working that is now almost finished.

This has happened owing to the continuous pressure of the French Command and in consideration that it had always be given a prompt approval and execution to all works for Allied, to avoid remarks from the Allied themselves.

IV. Meanwhile, the rules regarding works to be effectuated on account of the Allied, are fundamentally changed, as for the former idea of largeness in the approval of works, some more restrictive measures have been taken for safeguard of the finance of the Italian Government.

V. Owing to these new orders, the Engineer Command informed the French Command in Rome, in order to provide to the regularization of works already executed, and ask the approval of the competent Military authority for the further requested works.

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- a) arrangements of dormitories at the 3rd floor troops' building, (repairings of pictures, application of window-glasses, varnishing, tinting, replacement of locks);
- b) arrangements of the 3rd and 4th floor Command building (arrangements of fixtures, application of window-glasses, replacements of locks, patches at floors, tinting and varnishing).

- d) tinting of the staircase of the Command building;

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V. Owing to these new orders, the Engineer Command informed the French Command in Rome, in order to provide to the regularization of works already executed, and ask the approval of the competent Military authority for the further requested works.

At this point the arrangement finds an obstacle which is necessary to surpass, for the regularization of the pending business.

The R.A.A.C. seems to be contrary for the execution of works, as the French Command has applied directly to the Engineer Command, without asking a preventive authorisation.

The Ministry of War, owing to the new disposition, must have the consent of the M.M.I.A.

The proposal to the M.M.I.A. for the execution of works, should come from the R.A.A.C.

My advice is, that a possible solution could be the following: the Engineer Command informs the 8th B.L.U.

the 8th B.L.U. approves and informs the Ministry Of War with the invitation to finance the project.

I have deduced what I have communicated, from the great discus-

sions held this morning between representatives of the R.A.A.C., of the French and Engineer Command, and myself.

Nevertheless, I think it advisable to also the advice of Gen. and Ten. Col. Re of the Engineer Command, who are treating this question.

Waiting for the Ministry of War to approve the project, and owing to the continuous demands of the French H.Q. which needed to settle 65-70 officers who lived at the Diana Hotel, which is going to be derquisitioned, this Direction decided to begin the works above mentioned.-

In the meantime, more restrictive orders were communicated by the Ministry of War, in agreement with the M.N.I.A., concerning the execution of works required by the Allied Comands.-

It is the 8°B.L.U. which has the decision now.-

The works already finished are those that have been asked by the French Mission, exception being made for the kitchen and for the repair of the lift.-

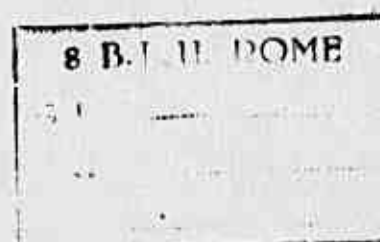
