Ref. your A 224 of 1 October 46, the following report is submitted covering welfare activities in Rome Territorial Command.-

1.- WELFARE HOSTELS.

(a)- There is one at No.24 via Guidobaldo del Monte, Rome, functioning under the name of "Posto di sosta per militari alle armi".-

It can take upto one hundred service personnel allocated as follows: Army 60; Navy 30; and 10 for the Airforce.-

(b)- Eligibility for admission is confined to soldiers (1) discharged from hospitals and having not more than ten days leave.-

(II) soldiers who for some reason cannot spend their leave at their home.-

(III) any particular cases of a compassionate nature.-

It has been found necessary sometimes to accept persons from other Ministries apart from the Armed Services.-

(c)- The Hostel supplies:-

(1) free board and lodging .

1.- WELFARE HOSTELS.

(a)- There is one at No.24 via Guidobaldo del Monte, Rome, functioning under the name of "Posto di sosta per militari al-le armi".-

It can take upto one hundred service personnel allocated as follows: Army 60; Navy 30; and 10 for the Airforce.-

(b)- Eligibility for admission is confined to soldiers (1) discharged from hospitals and having not more than ten days leave.-

(II) soldiers who for some reason cannot spend their leave at their home.-

(III) any particular cases of a compassionate nature.-

It has been found necessary sometimes to accept persons from other ministries apart from the Armed Services.-

(c)- The Hostel supplies:-

- (1) free board and lodging.
- (2) bar and canteen at reduced prices.
- (3) free barber shop service.
- (4) lounge and writing rooms.
- (5) billiard room.
- (6) small theatre with limited amount of scenery.

2.- VOLUNTARY WELFARE WORKERS.

There are no full time voluntary workers in any Welfare Organization.-

There is however occasional service supplied voluntarily by individual civilians and voluntary work provided in cases where it is requested by some specially constituted committee.- Service at canteens, rest camps, etc., is supplied by civilians who are paid.-

Three personnel of the C.A.P. (Corpo Auxiliario Femminile), allocated to this Command by the War Ministry, receive rations and a small salary.-

There is no suggestion of political bias being the reason for the negligible amount of voluntary welfare service offered to the Army by civilians but rather a general lukewarmness in the attitude of the public and press to the Services.-

3.- S.A.P.A.M.

S.A.P.A.M. is functioning in this Command.-It obtains goods from certain firms for retailing, payment being made after the goods have been sold.-

The organisation is handicapped in this Command by lack of funds and a suitable accommodation.-

Accommodation is likely to be provided shortly in via Labicana.-

The hospital Directorate have a special fund of L.80.000 with which they can make advances to approved compassionate cases.

Apart from above the Hospital

- distributes tobacco to all patients,
- has mobile cinema equipment to give performances in the wards.-

(c) Civic Hospitals

The following organisation exists:-

(1)- A grant of £.50.000 every three months to be utilised for individual and collective welfare.-This money is controlled by the Medical authorities at Territorial Command H.Q.-

(2)- Gifts of clothing, food, and magazines.-

(3)- One Officer is appointed as being responsible for the welfare of each hospital.-

(4)- periodical visits to patients to endeavour^{to} adjust any complaints or give advice on any personal matters.-

(5)- distribution of free tickets to local cinemas or sports meetings.-

(6)- there is usually one cinema or stage show per week in each hospital.-

5.- ENTERTAINMENT.

In Rome Territorial Command, Welfare Services and Public Relations are controlled by the same individual, and the overlapping referred to does occur.-

It has been pointed out that it should be avoided as far as possible.-

6.- WELFARE OFFICERS, STAFF & TRANSPORT.
