2. The work of the unit is entirely in connection with the Italian Army and every day our officers are visiting and interviewing Italian Army officers in all parts of this Terr. Command. It will be appreciated that this inevitably involves a considerable drain on cigarette supplies.

In addition the unit gives an occasional cocktail party for the Italian officers and their wives.

3. As a result of this the officers of this unit use the bulk of their ration of cigarettes for entertainment purposes as things are at present.
