1. Contents of the letter report in basic communication have been fully noted and studied.

2. R. Francozzi is an agent of this command and he was on a mission of this office under secret orders at the time of the incident in question. He was further instructed to concern himself with the whereabouts of the person COSTA and advised to exercise his discretion in this regard. I have questioned FRANCAZZI thoroughly as to the action allegedly taken by him with relation particularly to the use of threats, etc. FRANCAZZI's explanation appears entirely satisfactory and in view of his record with this and other commands it is felt that, while such action as was taken, which is vehemently denied by FRANCAZZI as to its reporterial accuracy by the CG:RR involved, appears upon its surface to be unusual, it is respectfully submitted that our agents are very often placed in difficult and embarrassing circumstances in view of the nature of their work and its secret and confidential nature.

3. It is pointed out that the CC:RR in question refused arbitrarily to recognize the written authority possessed by Costa; that he had in his possession also confidential documents in a sealed envelope belonging to this command; and that he was operating an American jeep. Notwithstanding these circumstances, he was withheld arbitrarily. Pursuant to authorities granted by higher authority, Francazzi, in an effort to complete his mission with a minimum of time and discussion referred to himself as Colonel. He did not in this respect exceed his authority inasmuch as our agents are instructed to adopt whatever identities necessary for the accomplishment of their missions. He was therefore authorized to take such action as he deemed necessary and discreet. He has been advised, however, that in the future in dealing with matters relating to personnel of the Italian Armed forces, that he obtain higher authority where time allows and no unusual emergency presents itself. FRANCAZZI has expressed regret that the matter has caused both your command and that of the CC:RR concern, and both he and this office assure you and the CC:RR that every effort will be extended to eliminating a recurrence of such conflict of authorities as appeared to exist in this case. It is believed that if both the CC: RR and Francazzi had exercised more restraint, the mission might have been accomplished with greater harmony. The entire personnel of this office has been apprised of the necessity of understanding the relative positions of the Italian Police and armed forces and the need of cooperative and coordinated relations between Allied and Italian authorities.

For your information and necessary action you deem necessary be taken by M.I.A., I have to inform you of the arbitrary way of acting of American Colonel FRANCOZZI against a C.R.R. "brigadiere", who was carrying out an arrest warrant which had been made by the Chief Judge of the Sicily War Military Tribunal on July 29, 1944, against Aventino COSTA di Ugo & di Mario Cappelli, born at Frediano on February 11, 1905, charged with aggravated theft and other crimes.

On morning of October 1st, "brigadiere a piedi" Giuseppe TRICARICO of the Trapani main C.R.R. H.Q., having had news that Costa was moving from Trapani to Palermo on an American vehicle, telephoned the Alcamo C.R.R. H.Q. about it so that the wanted person could be arrested while passing through Alcamo. This operation, which was arranged at Alcamo, was successful.

On the afternoon of the same day, October 1st, C.R.R. Captain Giuseppe CASINI, O.C. the Trapani C.R.R. Coy, was informed by telephone, via the Salemi exchange, that an American Colonel was ordering the immediate release of Costa. Succeeding at last in obtaining the direct line, Capt Casini was asked by the American Colonel at what time Costa would arrive at Palermo. Capt Casini replied that he would arrive at about 1930 hrs, and straightaway ordered "brigadiere" Tricarico to pick up the arrested man at Alcamo, accompany him to Palermo, ask for instruction from the Chief Judge of the Sicily War Military Tribunal and then act accordingly.

At 1945 hrs the "brigadiere" arrived with the arrested person at Palermo, at the "Sole" Hotel, where the Chief Judge of the War Military Tribunal, Capt BOTTAZO, was living. On the moment in front of the Hotel he met American Colonel FRANCOZZI who, having recognized Costa, went up to the "brigadiere" denouncing the arrest of Costa and stating that the same person would now be under his charge. Having seen a document, held by Costa, issued by the Allied Authorities and stating that the said person could not be detained without informing the said Authorities, the American Colonel accused the "brigadiere" of being "ignorant", of having carried out an abuse, threatening to denounce him to the Allied Military Tribunal and declaiming against Lt Col TOSCANO, O.C. the Trapani C.R.R. Group, Capt Casini and Tricarico himself.

"brigadiere" Tricarico showed Col Francozzzi [the warrant for the arrest of Costa, asking him to be allowed to interpellate the Chief Judge of the War Military Tribunal and his superior officers] living at the "Sole" Hotel, and to be allowed to go to the Palermo C.R.R. Legion H.Q. to inform the of what had happened & receive instructions. He received a flat refusal, and the prohibition to speak to anyone about it, Costa being at the complete disposal of the Colonel and the order to release him.

At this imposition the "brigadiere" replied he could not release the prisoner without the authorization of the Chief Judge or of his Superior Officers; Col Francozzzi, placing his hand on the hilt of his pistol, intimating: "Try and touch him! If you touch him I will fire at you!"; "You will tell your Captain that I have detained Costa and that he is under my charge"; "Go away immediately, or else I shall fire at you".

The "brigadiere", before releasing Costa and the American vehicle on which the said Costa had been arrested at Alcamo, asked the Allied Officer for a written statement. The Officer adhered to this request, writing in English on the Warrant: "Aventino Costa is at the disposal of the Rome C.I.C. H.Q.. He had a regular and legal document. These were not recognized by the C.R.R.. The C.R.R. took an American vehicle and an employee of the American Intelligence Service and detained them for about 9 hrs, their documents were in order. Costa is at the disposal of Col Francozzzi, and he cannot be arrested or detained. Sgd R. Francozzzi Rome, S/A-C.I.C. Sgd A. H., G.O.C.. Many civilians witnessed the incident in front of the "Sole" Hotel. Sgd A. H., G.O.C..

To your information and necessary action you deem necessary is taken by M.G.L.A. to inform you of the arbitrary way of acting of American Colonel FRANCOWSKI against a citizen "brigadiere", who was carrying out an arrest war apt which had been made by the Chief Judge of the Military Bar Tribunal on July 29, 1943, against Aventine COSTA di Lugo e di Mart. Capellini, born at Nieddo on the 16th June 1885, charged with aggravated theft and other crimes.

On morning of October 1st, "brigadiere a piedi" Giuseppe CARMINI of the Trapani main C.R. H.Q., having had news that Costa was moving from Trapani to Palermo on an American vehicle, telephoned the Alonso C.R. P.O. about 8:00, that the wanted person could be arrested while passing through Alcamo. This operation, which was arranged at Alonso, was successful.

On the afternoon of the same day, October 1st, O.R.P. Captain Giuseppe CA. INTI, O.C. 1st Trapani C.R. H.Q., was informed by telephone, via the Salini exchange, that an American Colonel was ordering the immediate release of Costa. According to fact in obtaining the direct line, Capt. Carini was asked by the American Colonel at what time Costa would arrive at Palermo. Capt. Carini replied that he could arrive at about 1930 hrs, and straightforwardly ordered "brigadiere" Tricarico to pick up the arrested man at Alonso, accompany him to Palermo, ask for the function from the Chief Judge of the Military Bar Tribunal and then act accordingly.

At 1945 hrs the "brigadiere" arrived with the arrested person at Palermo, at the "Mola" Hotel, where the Chief Judge of the Bar Military Tribunal, Capt. TRICARICO, was living. On the instant in front of the "Hotel" of American Colonel FRANCOWSKI who, after recognizing Costa, went up to the "brigadiere" demanding the arrest of Costa and stating that the same person would now be under his charge. Being given a document, the "Note", issued by the allies authorities and stating that the same would not be detailed without informing the said institution, the American Colonel assumed to "the law" of the "Agreement", of which carried out on a note, to continue to denounce him to the allied Military Tribunal or English the next day at Alonso, to the Trapani C.R. H.Q. from Capt. Carini himself.



## MEMORANDUM

TO : Colonel C. P. KENT,  
 Land Forces Sub Commission AG (UNIA), ROME

1. Your Memorandum Q/S/10 of 19 July and attached copy of letter from Ministry of War, received.

2. A report on the motor vehicles in the hands of Marchese Antonio di San Giuliano together with copies of purchase receipts and allied correspondence, was made to your headquarters in my File number 361 dated 10 January 1945. I have never received a reply to my letter and evidently it was not brought to your attention.

3. In brief, the Marchese di San Giuliano and Rosario Cannavò, purchased from Headquarters, 56 Area, No. 1 District through a Captain Williams, then U.S. Salvage; a number of motor vehicle wrecks, lying on the battle fields of Sicily. Some of these wrecks were cannibalized to repair others, until at least seven (7) of them were restored to mechanical running order. This took place in the early part of 1944. In October 1944, the Italian Military became aggressive in an attempt to reclaim the seven efficient vehicles and were partly successful in that they secured possession of all the vehicles by seizure, but General Mariottii (so I am informed) permitted the return to San Giuliano of three of the vehicles because the Italian Navy desired to and did purchase them. A fourth vehicle was returned to San Giuliano because it was a German truck suitable only for garbage collection and was performing that function to headquarters 20, 56 Area. The other three trucks are still in possession of the Italian Military and it is these that they desire to requisition and not all seven vehicles as reported to you by the Ministry of War.



Subject: Requisitioning of Vehicles

To : Land Forces Sub Commission, AC (MIA)

1. During February 1944, Mr Antonino PATERNO CASTELLO, Marquis of S. Giuliano, Major of Catania during the period of liberation, obtained from the Allies, in partnership with the firm Rosario CANGEMI also of Catania, the concession of a number of trucks and wrecks belonging to the Italian Army for the small sum of 1,040,000 lire.

2. By the following April, the above mentioned gentlemen had managed to put 12 of these vehicles in working order.

Five of these vehicles were sold during the month of July, to the Royal Navy for the sum of 4,000,000 lire.

3. During the month of October 1944, the above mentioned partners were apprehended by the police, because during a search of the Cangemi Stores, considerable quantities of petrol of British origin and various materials of Italian Army origin, were found on the premises.

4. On 28 October 1944, the Sicily Military Headquarters, on invitation of the Allied Commission, withdrew from the Marquis of S. Giuliano and partner, seven trucks, because it came to their knowledge that the above partners were negotiating to sell them also to the Royal Navy.

5. In the meantime, the State Exchequer asked to confirm if the Marquis of S. Giuliano and Partner could claim legitimate possession of above-mentioned vehicles. The Exchequer confirmed that they could, recognizing that the above-mentioned partners were the legal possessors of the vehicles which were purchased from the Allied authorities.

6. Having thus stated the above, and in consideration

That the Marquis of S. Giuliano paid a very poor sum of money to the Allies for the wrecks handed to him.

1083

That the profit made from the sale of five trucks to the Royal Navy, amounted to approximately four times greater than the amount paid for the complete number of wrecks, to the Allies.

Of the further profit made from the use of the remaining seven vehicles in transport of a private character.

Of the purely speculative nature of his purchase, and repairing of the wrecks, which had no beneficial reflection from a public utility point of view, proved by the fact that the further sale of seven trucks to the Royal Navy was being contracted.

Of the favorable repercussions of the local public opinion, as the speculative nature of the purchases and repairs etc is well known.

Of the absolute necessity of the Military Administration to gain possession of as many vehicles as possible previously belonging to them.

We propose:

The requisitioning of the above-mentioned seven trucks from the Marquis of S. Giuliano paying suitable prices and assigning them to the Palermo Military Headquarters, who have repeatedly complained of their scarcity of transport in proportion to the service needs of the Island.

1. Herewith various receipts and allied correspondence in connection with seven (7) motor vehicles and various motor vehicle material purchased by the Marquese Antonio di Juliani from Dr. Airo and seized by Italian Military Authorities in October 1944.

2. I have discussed this matter with Lt. Col. Patti, Deputy Chief of Staff Piemonte Territorial HQ., Lt. Col. Walker, A.D. Cetamura and Gen Juliani. I am informed by Col. Walker that the motor transport, for the most part were lying on the battle fields at the time of sale. Further that Gen Juliani although purchasing many parts did rehabilitate various vehicles on the basis of having not only to repair the vehicles in question but to build a stock pile. Those in authority here are only now aware of his claim. However that, I know, is beyond the point. I am forwarding the attached letter for calling up to Gen Juliani's title if any be the property.

In February, 1944, I was introduced by A.C.C. Catania (Col French, then C.C.P.C. Catania) to Capt Williams, C.C. Garage, Sc Area, No 1 District, in order to make arrangements for the purchase of a abandoned Motor-vehicles which had escaped to the Italo-German Armed Forces. After the return of Sicily, and in view of several purchases in the summer and under the terms set out in the letter above, as can be seen in the attached documents.

During the first fortnight of Oct at last, Sig. Parrini, identifying himself as interpreter of I.A.T. accompanied British and Italian Police, carried out the seizure of the vehicles sold to the British Army. The said vehicles were taken to the local I.A.T. garage. Following the kind and immediate intervention of Col Falter of Catania A.C., the Motor-vehicles were released to the undersigned. At eight days later, Capt. Arnold, stating he was acting on behalf of 12th Corps, Palermo, collected from the Langemi Garage, where they were located, the same Motor-vehicles that had first been seized by I.A.T. and then returned following the intervention of Col Falter. Of the seven Motor-vehicles which were collected but not confiscated and neither requisitioned, three were delivered to the Messina Italian Navy R.C., three to the Catania "Consorzio Agrario", and one to the Catania Town Major, for whom it had already worked.

It is pointed out that since last June the Sicily Italian Navy R.C. had frozen the seven vehicles concerned in order to buy them for the Italian Navy for which it had requested and obtained from the proper Ministry the authorisation for the purchase.

12th Corps R.C. doubtless ordered the collection of the above mentioned vehicles thinking they were without the legal documents of origin or in any case of illegal origin. It can be seen from the attached copies of documents and receipt of the payed registration taxes and from information that can be obtained from the Allied authorities (Col Falter, Catania A.C., Col French and Mr Stewart formerly of Catania A.C.C., Capt Williams, formerly of Catania Sc Area, and Catania A.I.C.) that the legal origin and legal possession of the Motor-vehicles which have for the present been taken away from me cannot be doubted.

It is noted that, following study of the documents attached and information obtained concerning the lawfulness to sell of the British Army Offices, our A.C. Sir Compton will give orders to return the Motor-vehicles concerned to the undersigned, who is still ready to claim the obligation under which he is placed to sell to the Italian Navy.

I think it appropriate to add the following letter from Capt Williams (see Italian copy).

I wish to add that the said Motor-vehicles, whilst in my possession, were worked only for the Catania Municipal Authorities (sewering), the "Consorzio Agrario" (transportation of sheep into town) and the Town Major (sewers). Palermo, 20 December, 1944.

AERIAL LIGHTHOUSE AT MAZARA.

We have at Palermo an aerial lighthouse; we have been instructed by Air Headquarters, Malta to site this at 3740 North, 1231 East, (not far from Mazara del Vallo), and to have it guarded and maintained by Italian Personnel. For this, 12 guards are required, and either one man with knowledge of petrol engines and electricity, or two men each with knowledge of one subject.

2. We have been able to obtain the guards from the Italian Air Force, but they tell us that it is quite impossible for them to supply the specialists. We understand that the Italian Military Authorities are willing to supply these and we request you to be good enough to see whether the matter can be arranged.

3. The Italian Air Force guards will draw rations with another Unit stationed at Marsala, and it is suggested that the one or two Army specialists be attached for rations to these guards.





