During a visit by Commander 12 I.R.U. on Friday 26 April 1946 to the School of Tactics, School of Engineers, and School of Artillery Civitavecchia, the following matters were raised and discussed and are forwarded for necessary action.

Guards.

The arrangements for guarding the School of Tactics are satisfactory but there have been cases of civilians entering the Engineer and Artillery Barracks and relieving military equipment. It is suggested that some form of floodlighting system be installed in the perimeter of the barracks. It is realized that there are at the moment very few men available for guards but it is considered that artificial illumination will make the task less difficult.

2.

Discipline.

There have been instances of NIA personnel trespassing and looting from the Artillery School accommodation in the ruins of Acqua barracks, Civitavecchia. An instance has also come to light of an officer issuing a permit to a civilian to remove accommodation stores from the barracks. These cases must be checked up rigorously and the offenders punished regardless of rank. The standard of discipline in the Artillery is high; it must be impressed on the Commander of NIA that bad discipline on the part of his men who form a small unit using the new barracks as a large unit cannot be tolerated.

3.

Patrol.

A patrol point is being established at the ruins of Acqua barracks. It is most important that NO SHOOTING notices are erected and that all fire precautions are strictly adhered to. It is suggested that the patrol be held at the camp be allocated to the various Schools at Civitavecchia.

During a visit by Commander 12 J.L.B. on Friday 26 April '46 to the School of Tactics, School of Engineers, and School of Artillery Civitavecchia, the following matters were raised and discussed and are forwarded for necessary action.

1. Guards.

The arrangements for guarding the School of Tactics are satisfactory but there have been cases of civilians entering the Engineer and Artillery Barracks and pilfering military equipment. It is suggested that some form of floodlighting system be installed in the perimeter of the barracks. It is realized that there are at the moment very few men available for guards but it is considered that artificial illumination will make the task less difficult.

2. Discipline.

There have been instances of N.M. personnel trespassing and looting from the Artillery School accommodation in the case of Acosta Barracks, Civitavecchia. An instance has also been brought to light of an officer leaving a permit to a civilian to remove accommodation stores from the barracks. These cases must be checked up vigorously and the offenders punished regardless of rank. The standard of discipline in the Artillery is high; it must be impressed on the Commander of N.M. that bad discipline on the part of his men who form a small unit using the same barracks as a large unit cannot be tolerated.

3. Patrol.

A patrol point is being established at the Dips of Acosta Barracks. It is most important that NO UNARMED notions are created and that all fire precautions are strictly adhered to. It is suggested that the patrol be held at the dump be allocated to the various Schools at Civitavecchia on an equal basis, and that each School be informed how much patrol is available to them.

4. Much hard work has been carried out during the last fortnight at all three Schools at Civitavecchia and the results are most encouraging. Plans and preparations for the arrival of students are now far advanced.

SUBJECT :- Notes on the work of DADST, HQ 12 B.L.U. for the Italian Central Military Schools, up to date 26 April 1945.

1. General.

The work of DADST 12 B.L.U. is divided up into 2 parts :

(1) S & T Duties for Central Schools.

(2) Training of Corpo Automobilistici personnel, commissariato and sussistenza personnel (supply side only) and petrol training. This training is carried out in schools under the command of the Central Military Schools.

2. S & T Duties

(A) GENERAL.

At the time of compiling this report the services (HQ) of the H.Q. Central Military Schools are being disbanded.

(B) SUPPLIES.

(1) Bakery.

The 319 Field Bakery is now disbanded and bread is supplied to the Schools at CESANO from a Contractor in CESANO Village, who has a contract up to 4,000 rations per day.

(11) Distribution Depot.

(C) P.O.L.

POL is issued to Units and Schools from the Petrol Point at CESSANO. (D) Transport.

3. Training.(A) Transport.

The training of transport personnel for Corpo Automobilistica and other arms is carried out at the School of Motorisation at CECCHIGNOLA (Commandant Col. NIPPI Auto Corps). This School is sub divided into 4 schools, 3 of which are the responsibility of DADST.

Driving and Maintenance School, (Recruit Drivers) Junior Officers IT Instructors School, Cadet Officers and Potential NCOs School. The D & M School is commanded by a Lieut Colonel and sub divided into 2 Battalions, each of 4 companies, each of 4 platoons, each of 4 squads. Each Battalion is capable of training 800 recruits at one time, and the whole school 1,600 recruits.

3. (A)

Continued.

The first batch of recruits are due to arrive at the D & M School on 15 May for a 3 month course. The total call-up of drivers is 4,800 at the rate of 1600 each 4 months. Recruits spend one month in Primary Training Centres and 3 months at D & M School (the first call up was in April). Thus as far as the D & M School is concerned it should receive 1600 recruits in May, September and January '47. Since the course is of 3 months duration this allows the School 1 month for reorganisation before the next batch arrives.

The other two Schools are not due to open until late June or July and will cater for students as follows:

Junior Officers School : 50 Officers on 6 Month course.
Cadet Officers & Potential NCOs School: 50 Cadet Officers and 50 Potential NCOs on 6 months course.

1. The H.Q. Central Military Schools have advised this H.Q. that they have suggested to Ministry of War that the 319 Field Bakery be disbanded and that the units served by this bakery should collect their bread ration from Rome.

2. This decision is agreed for the following reasons:-

(a) The Bakery is not supplying all the schools, only the following:-

- (i) H.Q. Central Military Schools.
- (ii) Infantry School.
- (iii) P.I. School.
- (iv) Police School.
- (v) Carabinieri.

with a total daily ration strength of from 3,200 - 3,300 (1 lorry load).

(b) The bakery is in a very bad location, with very poor accommodation, to which a vehicle cannot approach nearer than 150 yards. The civilian oven is very old fashioned and the "dividing" and "moulding" all have to be done by hand. The water supply too is precarious. All work throughout the 24 hours has to be done by artificial light, and there is no ventilation in the bakery whatsoever.

(c) The bakery could never be used for training purposes since although technical side of bread production is up to standard, the whole general appearance would give students the wrong impression at once. Also there is very little extra room for students in addition to normal shift personnel.

3. In view of the above no report will be submitted for 2nd inspection of this unit on 27 March 46. The following points are however forwarded for information:-

(a) The bakery is at present using 70% National flour (Ex Italian sources) and 30% white flour and the yield is 12%. The old dough process is used.

1. The R.O. Central Military Schools have advised this R.O. that they have suggested to Ministry of War that the 319 Field Bakery be disbanded and that the units served by this bakery should collect their bread ration from Rome.

2. This decision is agreed for the following reasons:-

- (a) The Bakery is not supplying all the schools, only the following:-
- (i) R.O. Central Military Schools.
 - (ii) Infantry School.
 - (iii) P.T. School.
 - (iv) Police School.
 - (v) Carabinieri.

with a total daily ration strength of from 3,200 - 3,300 (1 Lorry load).

(b) The bakery is in a very bad location, with very poor accommodation, to which a vehicle cannot approach nearer than 150 yards. The civilian oven is very old fashioned and the "Dividing" and "Moulding" all have to be done by hand. The water supply too is precarious. All work throughout the 24 hours has to be done by artificial light, and there is no ventilation in the bakery whatsoever.

(c) The bakery could never be used for training purposes since although technical side of bread production is up to standard, the whole general appearance would give students the wrong impression at once. Also there is very little extra room for students in addition to normal shift personnel.

3. In view of the above no report will be submitted for 2nd inspection of this unit on 27 March 46. The following points are however forwarded for information:-

(a) The Bakery is at present using 70% National flour (Ex Italian sources) and 30% white flour and the yield is 124%. The old dough process is used. The amount of salt used was checked and found to be correct.

(b) A constant complaint of the men is that they still receive no trade pay.

(c) It appears that previously Bakers used to be issued with Brandy or coffee which helped them, especially in the hot season and they want this issue restarted.

(d) The following accounts are kept:-

- (i) Commodity account showing commodities received and commodities struck off charge as bread.
- (ii) Account 1270 showing commodities issued to ovens and % bread yield.
- (iii) Register of Units inmates.
- (iv) Register of unit drawings showing signature of representatives.

This book also contains a "Remarks column" where units can make complaints.
