The following confirms telephone conversation 3 Oct 45 Staff Captain - I.C. (for GSO II R.A.).

It is proposed that the R.A.Wing Office hitherto established at the Bracciano Detachment Officers' Mess, Villa Nardelli, Bracciano, be moved immediately into the HQ Building of the Artillery Barracks, as its present location is distinctly unsatisfactory for liaison purposes.

At the moment, the procedure is that communications are received into the Wing office, letters written in English to the Arty Barracks, and taken up to the Barracks. The answer is duly received in Italian, and, if found difficult, it has to await the arrival of an interpreter before it can be dealt with.

There are many queries which could be dealt with immediately were the Wing office "on the spot".

If the R.A.Wing moves up into the Barracks, as the Detachment has been run hitherto entirely by the R.A.Wing personnel, certain changes become necessary. It is suggested, therefore, that there should be a "Detachment Office Hour" daily, say 1600 to 1700 hours, and calls of a Detachment nature be instituted then.

Due to the normal absence on Duty of all members of the Detachment, it is more than possible that telephone or other calls made outside this hour, would not be answered, and it would therefore be necessary to ring the Arty Barracks Exchange and ask to be put through to the GSO II R.A.'s office.

The services of Bdr Ide would still be available for work of a general nature in addition to his specialised R.A. duties.

4. *This will result in a corresponding decrease in the number of daily transport details.*

1. The following is a brief summary of the supply situation at E.T.O., I.C.P., CESSANO, as of 22 March 45.

- (1) Supply stocks are held both at CESSANO and PALIORDO, the actual quantities held at PALIORDO being shown at Appendix 'A'. It is the intention to transfer all stocks from PALIORDO into the new central Distribution Depot at CESSANO, where all bulk receipts and detail issues are now made. Stocks at the latter total 5 days' rations. It will be seen that the rations held at PALIORDO are very unbalanced. Immediately the stocks are consolidated at CESSANO a complete stock-taking will be carried out and bulk drawings adjusted to build up the required holdings of balanced rations.
- (2) The stocks held at PALIORDO total approximately 170 tons. These stocks have lain idle, with no turn-over, for 4-5 weeks and there is the risk of such items as macaroni and flour deteriorating, unless consumed as soon as possible. The quantity of stock transferred to CESSANO has been negligible, due to shortage of road transport. Rail transport is most inadvisable as the trucks would have to be routed via Padoa, thus causing delay and encouraging pilfering.
- (3) In order to expedite the clearance of the PALIORDO depot I have arranged with C.C. Driving & Maintenance School, and the Commissariato, for 20 to 30 3-ton vehicles of the School to conduct driving instruction with the transport of supply stocks from PALIORDO to CESSANO, until the former depot is cleared. By this means all stocks should be concentrated at CESSANO within 5 to 4 days.
- (4) A civilian bakery has been reestablished at CESSANO village. This was visited on 17 March, the day it commenced operating. The bakery is very old and small. Due to its age and ~~poor~~ construction, the oven is not highly efficient but is adequate for existing requirements. This bakery is operated entirely by Italian Military personnel and is capable, if required, of producing a maximum output of 7,500 rations a day. The civilian bakery at PALIORDO is capable of producing up to 6,000 rations a day. There are thus sufficient facilities at these two bakeries to provide for a total ration strength up to 13,500. Before the CESSANO civilian bakery started operating, we were made of five Neles Field bakery ovens, situated under canvas, also at CESSANO village. It is suggested that E.T.O. be advised to concentrate all bread making at CESSANO, at the civilian bakery, and to cease using the Neles ovens. These could then be thoroughly overhauled and repaired, and kept as a reserve to provide for any future increase in the ration strength.

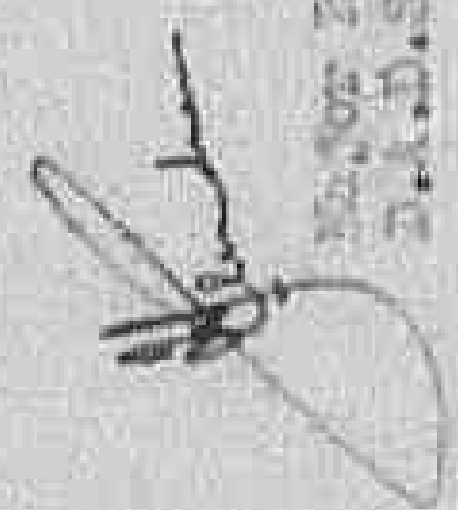

1. The Railway now operates to CESSANO di ROMA Station and serves the R.T.C., I.C.F. There is a R.T.C. at this Station.
2. It is understood that a pack train now runs daily from Rome and supplies are now railed direct to Cesano.
3. Accommodation Stores of Italian origin have also been arriving at Cesano.
4. In view of the above facts, can British Ordnance Stores for the R.T.C., I.C.F. be railed to Cesano? This would economise considerably on road transport, which at present is necessary to collect Ordnance Stores from Rome.
5. Furthermore, some difficulty is almost invariably encountered when lorries are required to collect stores from Rome, owing to the critically inadequate motor transport available within the R.T.C.
6. The weekly tonnage of British Ordnance Stores for R.T.C., I.C.F., is estimated as 100 - 120, for at least the next month.

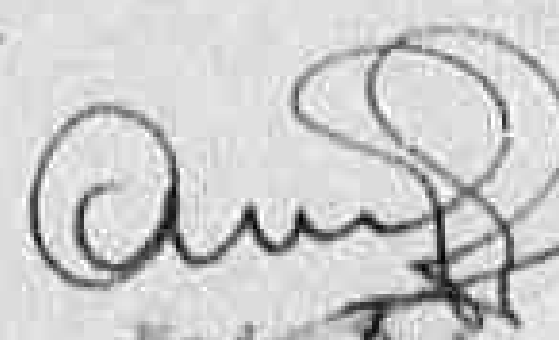
