1. The present accommodation of the Signal School will, according to the plan proposed by the Commandant, accommodate approximately 2,500 men. Under the training scheme proposed by S.M.R.S., the total numbers to be accommodated in the School will be approximately 2,600 in May, rising to a peak of 3,000 by September.
2. It is believed that the D. & M. School are vacating the buildings adjacent to the Signal School, when the Poles move from CHOCOLINA, and are transferring the portion of their School at present occupying these buildings, into the accommodation to be vacated by the Poles. If these vacated buildings are allotted to the Signal School, as is believed to be the intention, it will then be possible to house the 3,000 personnel in good accommodation.
3. The present allocation of accommodation, as proposed by the Commandant of the Signal School can, however, only be put into effect by 1 May 1946 if a considerable amount of re-habilitation is carried out before that date. The building allotted as a 'Troops' cookhouse and roof's, while one block of the main barracks is almost devoid of doors and windows.
4. At present, few men are engaged on the re-conditioning of the barracks and unless considerably more men and material are made available for this work in the immediate future, there appears little prospect of the buildings being in good condition by the beginning of May.
5. Owing to the large numbers to be accommodated it has been necessary to use three of the four main blocks purely for accommodating men and as a result, the classrooms have had to be provided in what were originally stables. It is hoped that, when additional accommodation is

4. At present, few men are engaged on the re-conditioning of the barracks and unless considerably more men and material are made available for this work in the immediate future, there appears little prospect of the buildings being in good condition by the beginning of May.

5. Owing to the large numbers to be accommodated it has been necessary to use three of the four main blocks purely for accommodating men and as a result, the classrooms have had to be provided in what were originally stables. It is hoped that, when additional accommodation is obtained, it will be possible to use some of the more suitable rooms on the ground floor of the main buildings as classrooms.

6. If a pressing need for accommodation arises for a period, when the School has its first intake, it is suggested that the recently acquired barrack block outside the main barracks could accommodate considerably more than the 557 men allocated to it. Judging by the capacity figures painted on the walls of each room by the Americans, it is capable of holding approximately 700 men.
