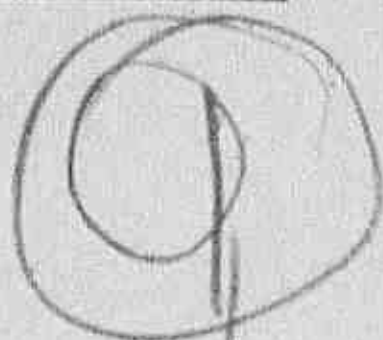
1. We have none of the forms in this Office but chief clerk is trying M.H.I.A. & other units, at the same time indenting.

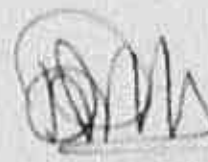

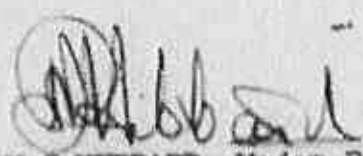
