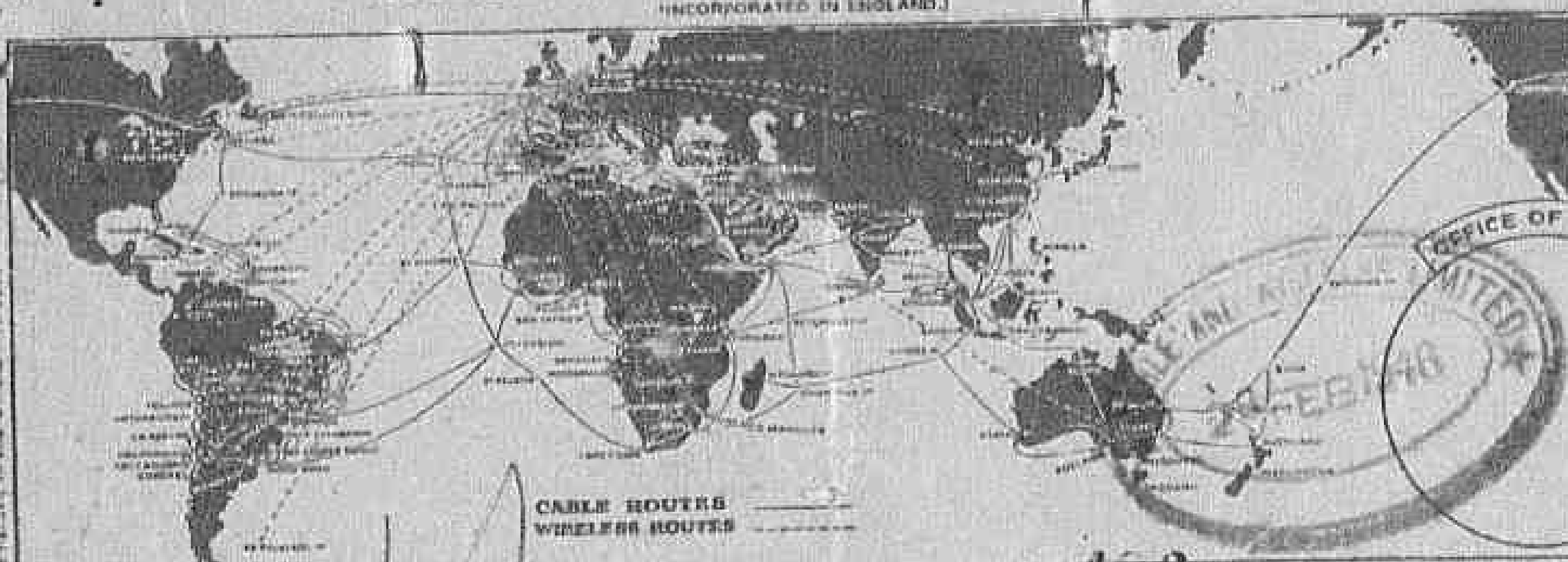

Bdr ADAMS Mother, who now calls herself Mrs. K. MASON, left her husband Mr. F. ADAMS in 1929, and since 1932 has been living with Mr. J. MASON. She now lives at 53 Ridgview Close, Mays Lane, Barnet, Herts. In 1938 or 9 she had a son by Mr. J. MASON. Bdr ADAMS Mother has not been considered one of the family since 1929.

Bdr. ADAMS Father has a house keeper called Mrs. L. GARRY, who has a 24 year old unmarried daughter who gave birth to a daughter in 1944. Mr. F. ADAMS is reputed to be the father of this child.

Bdr ADAMS is the eldest of three brothers, the other two brothers being Frederick ADAMS aged 21 and Lancelot ADAMS aged 18. All three brothers lived with their Father after their Mother and Father separated. Their Father drinks heavily and frequently there are rows in the family. Frederick ADAMS (Junior) is employed at Newbiggin Colliery earning £10 -£12 a week: he has quarrelled with, and left, his Father, and now lives in lodgings, being self supporting. Frederick ADAMS (Junior) also drinks heavily, gambles on both horses and dogs, and keeps bad company. Lancelot ADAMS is also employed at Newbiggin Colliery and earning 30/- to £3 a week and, as he is not yet self supporting, he is forced to live with his Father. Mrs GARRY's son has now been released from the RAF and is also living at 123 Storey Crescent. Quarrels are frequent.

SUBJECT: RA Ball.TO : ALL CONCERNED

1. It has been suggested that advantage should be taken of the anticipated visit to Italy of the RA Band, to hold a Royal Artillery Ball during April. I have discussed this with the Supreme Commander, and he has agreed to give it his active support provided there is a general demand from Gunner officers in Southern Italy.
2. No details can be discussed until the extent of support which the Ball would receive is known. The present idea is that it should be held in the state rooms of CASERTA Palace, with the full string orchestra of the RA Band. It would be organised on a first-class basis, with supper and refreshments as near to peace-time scale as possible, and tickets would cost about 1000 lire a head. Profits would be devoted to the RA Old Comrades' or Memorial Fund.
3. Attendance would be limited to parties brought by Gunner officers, but non-Gunners of any arm or service would be welcomed in parties sponsored by Gunners. Italian ladies would be excluded. In addition to private parties, invitations might be extended by the Supreme Commander to the senior officers and officials of British and Allied services and embassies in Italy. It is hoped that accommodation would be available for those coming from a distance.
4. I am sending this letter to G.O's and to as many individual Gunners as can be reached direct, but I shall be glad if recipients will canvas other Gunners who may be serving under their command or near them, and ask them all to reply direct. We must know roughly how many would come, and although nobody can be sure that he will still be in this part by next April, I should like you to say how many tickets you will be willing to take up if you are still here. Please reply by letter, or by telephone to Freedom 1017 or 1042, before the end of January. ... 6424
