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



1. From 1st November, 1946 12 I.L.U. Transport will be located on the 2nd floor of the Garage.
2. No information will be obtained from the M.M.I.A. telephone (843381). Any call from the M.M.I.A. Transport Office will therefore be passed through the M.M.I.A. Office.
3. The M.T.S.t. will post a duty roster of Italian drivers. One driver will be on duty each day and will sleep by the telephone at night. He will also be available by the telephone out of working hours and when no British personnel are present at the Garage.
4. One duty vehicle will be available for emergency journeys every evening after 16.30 hrs. This will be driven by the duty driver as required, and during his absence any messages will be taken by the M.M.I.A. duty driver. The M.T.S.t. is responsible for seeing that the workshop of the duty vehicle is signed each evening at 16.30 hrs. As far as possible, the M.T.S.t. should be notified of all requirements for other vehicles before 16.30 hrs.
5. Officer in-charge Italian Increment will arrange for the midday meal for Italian drivers to be brought to the Garage at 12.00 hrs. He will also arrange for the evening meal to be brought to the duty driver at 18.00 hrs.
6. All drivers will be present at the Garage during working hours, when not out on duty.
7. At 7.00 hrs each evening the duty driver will leave the Supergarage and will drive the duty vehicle to the Palazzo Salviati, where he will collect the other drivers and the baton.
8. Orders regarding vehicle maintenance days will be issued separately.

1. Letter AG 311.3/47, this Headquarters, 3 July 1946, subject "Telephone Service", is hereby revoked and will be withdrawn from all files and destroyed.

2. In accordance with current directives, drastic reductions in existing telephone services will be affected. Most important amongst these are outlined hereunder for the information of all concerned:

a. Military-requisitioned Hotels to have one (1) military telephone, to be located in the Hotel Manager's Office to be used by military personnel for transaction of Official Business, both local and long distance. Each person using telephone for outgoing calls will be required to sign roster maintained by Hotel Manager, listing name and telephone number of person called. Personal calls made by residents of Hotels from room-extension telephones, will be furnished by the Civil Management of the Hotel, through their regular civilian facilities. Any charge for these calls will be by agreement between the civilian management and individual subscribers, based upon standard rates.

b. Discontinuance of the following services:

(1) Billet telephones, except as authorized, in accordance with paragraph 3, page iii, current RAAC Telephone Directory.

CAMS | (2) Telephones in Officers', E's, Sgts' or OR's messes.

(3) Access of press correspondents to military long distance service.

3. Under provisions of existing directives and in accordance with above instructions, all unauthorized billet telephones are being disconnected by Signal Officer, this Headquarters.

4. In order to clarify the present situation, the following rules will govern the authorization of billet telephone service.

Billet phones will not be installed except for:

- a. General Officers
- b. Chiefs of Sections
- c. Key personnel requiring 24 hour contact

5. Each unit will immediately forward to this Headquarters a roster personally signed by the Commanding Officer, specifying who of their personnel should be authorized service as outlined in paragraph 4 above. Unit Commanders are reminded that service should not be recommended indiscriminately and that they will be held strictly accountable for unnecessary expenditures from Government budgets for above services.

6. Report as directed in paragraph 5 above is to reach this Headquarters on or before 15 July 1946.

7. Signal Officer, this Headquarters, will take immediate action to affect above changes and all necessary personnel should be apprised of contents of this letter.






