1. Permission has been given under various authorities for individuals to purchase, on sentimental grounds, a number of WD horses of UK origin and also those purchased overseas. No similar authority has been given for the purchase of captured horses.

2. It is known that a number of individuals wish to purchase captured horses and UK CWP is attempting to reach a solution which will allow this to be effected without undue expense and repatriation difficulties to the individual. No definite scheme can yet be authorized and this letter does not constitute any assurance that purchase of captured animals will be permitted; it is however desired to establish the numbers of personnel who would wish to take advantage of this opportunity, should it offer, under the terms of the following paragraph.

3. (a) Sentimental grounds must be proved.

(b) A signed undertaking must be given not to resell alive. ER 1940 para 1522 refers.

(c) Applications would be called for by a fixed date, and when requirement is established arrangements would be made, if the scheme is approved, for all horses to be shipped to UK on the same date. Alternatively horses would be sent in trucks attached to 12200 trains and this would enable officers to go on using their horses in this theatre till they were due to leave the theatre. This latter course is being recommended by GHQ CWP to the War Office.

(d) On arrival in UK sale to individual applicants would be completed at a price to be fixed by WO. It has been suggested to WO that a figure not greatly in excess of £10 should be applied. In addition the cost of transport and quarantine would have to be borne by the purchaser.

4. It is considered that sale in this theatre would be disadvantageous to the purchaser as it would entail difficulties in securing conveyance to UK of the animal under private arrangements and the individual

4. It is considered that sale in this theatre would be disadvantageous to the purchaser as it would entail difficulties in securing clearance to UK of the animal under private arrangements and the individual can still enjoy the use of a horse under the restricted riding scheme. HQ GEP also propose to recommend to War Office that any horses purchased under existing authorities should be repatriated at the same time on payment of transport and quarantine charges, but individuals are warned that this is purely in the proposed stage and no reliance should be placed on this method.

5. Will units please forward by 5 Oct 46 names of individuals, and the horses in which they are interested, who would take advantage of the scheme at para 3 above.

SUBJECT: Traffic Accidents

TO : Distribution 'R' British

In the last few weeks there has been a most regrettable increase in the incidence of traffic accidents in and around ROME.

It is not possible with any certainty to ascribe this rise to any one cause but the following are thought to be contributing factors.

Shortage of experienced drivers and their replacement by soldiers with insufficient training, by Italian civilians or S.E.P., shortage of Military Police, and possibly to a greater extent than most of us realize, loss of interest and attention owing possibly to the proximity (or deferment) of release or Python.

A careful analysis of these accidents shows that a greater number of British vehicles have been involved than can be justified by the volume of British traffic still on the roads, and of those involved a very considerable proportion have been driven by British drivers.

This has caused the growth of considerable bitterness in Italian public opinion which has found an outlet in a particularly virulent anti-Allied, and particularly anti-British, press campaign.

Because I know that a number of the accidents have been caused by the misconduct or dangerous driving of the drivers of British vehicles I do not find it possible to place too much the bitterness of public feelings and of the press campaign. It is urgent that an improvement is seen in the next few weeks and that it shall be manifest that a real attempt is being made to check the evil.

Police resources are now so limited that little can be done from this side and an improvement can only come as a result of unit efforts. Officers Commanding units must co-operate to the utmost limit of their power, by warning drivers of their responsibility, by impressing upon them the need for careful driving at all times, and the observance in built-up areas of moderate speeds, even lower when necessary than that laid down. They will warn them that so far as it is possible to do so Police measures will be intensified and that severe action is to be taken against all drivers who are found to be guilty of careless or dangerous driving or of excessive speeds.

The co-operation of all officers and men is asked for to combat this evil. It must be realized that the dangerous driving of any British vehicle is the concern of any British officer or NCO. Too often one sees British
