



TO: HQ Allied Commission

1. A recent report of a fire inspection of the Reinforcement Training Centre, Italian Combat Force, stationed at ORBANO, was submitted to this Headquarters by the CO 618 (1st CI) Army Fire Sdn, now withdrawn from Zone Area.

2. In this report a recommendation was made to the effect that adequate fire cover could be provided, and was warranted, by attaching to RTO ICF one Section of the Italian Civil Fire Service complete in every detail.

3. In the event of a serious fire in the area of the Italian Depot, the unit's local fire appliances, although being increased, could not effectively cope with such a situation.

4. It is, therefore, requested that authority may please be given for this proposal, which is strongly recommended by this Headquarters, to be enforced as early as possible.

The charge will therefore generally be left under Section 40 Army Act. "Officer or has prejuidice of good order and military discipline in committing himself through negligently handling a rifle," and an alternative charge to this effect should be made, even if the accused is to be tried under Section 40 for wilful shooting.
