1. A recent report of a fire inspection of the Reinforcement Training Centre, Italian Combat Force, stationed at ORSANO, was submitted to this Headquarters by the CG 618 (1st CI) Army Fire Bde, now withdrawn from Rome Area.

2. In this report a recommendation was made to the effect that adequate fire cover could be provided, and was warranted, by attaching to HTO ICF one Section of the Italian Civil Fire Service complete in every detail.

3. In the event of a serious fire in the area of the Italian Depot, the unit's local fire appliances, although being increased, could not effectively cope with such a situation.

4. It is, therefore, requested that authority may please be given for this proposal, which is strongly recommended by this Headquarters, to be effected as early as possible.
