1. A limited number of officers and ORs Volunteers will shortly be required for the Glider Pilot Regiment.
2. Qualifications and conditions of service are being revised but will be similar to those in ACI 1391/43 as amended except that additional pay for all ranks will now be 2/- per day when under training and 2/6 per day when qualified.

4. To avoid unnecessary movement, volunteers in UK will be accepted in first instance although it is possible that volunteers serving overseas may also be required owing to reduced field for selection at home.

6. Instructions will follow regarding despatch of personnel if and when required.

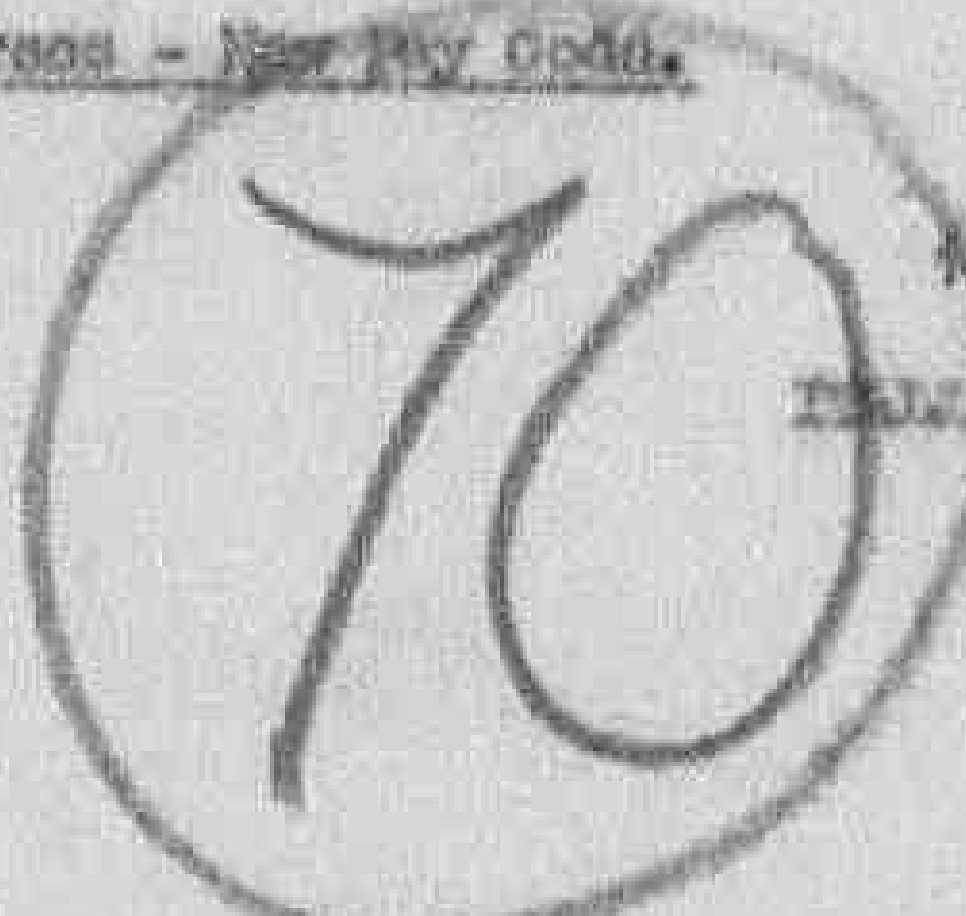

SUBJECT: Provision of RASC Clerks GD.

TO List 'B' (Br)

1. The deficiency of RASC Clerks is becoming acute and by the end of September the deficiency will amount to some 1100, the loss for July alone totalling 527.
2. The only means of making good the above mentioned loss is via the medium of the RASC Training Unit GRAZ. The loss has to be made good from within the theatre.
3. It is, however, realized that units have difficulty in sparing men to fill vacancies on these courses but if it is not done, a very serious breakdown will be felt by all units. Consequently it has been found necessary to allot vacancies which will be filled. Where candidates of the calibre previously demanded cannot be found then the most suitable will be selected. Where these have been selected in good faith as genuinely the best available, the RASC Training Unit will persevere with them.
4. Candidates must be in A/S Group 48 or above or be regular soldiers or deferred volunteers and have at least 6 months to serve in the theatre. They must be non tradesmen of any arm and not above the rank of corporal.
5. Every unit will earmark one man and selection will be made by this Headquarters when the assembly date and number of vacancies allotted are known.
6. Units who have suitable material will help considerably by forwarding names voluntarily.
