1. That a tactical doctrine be prepared for the Italian Army.
2. That spares for arms and vehicles be decentralised.

Note : At the moment a vehicle with a puncture must go to a civilian garage, a major repair means evacuation to O.A.R.P. Pologno. A rifle with a broken Ferro-mai must go to Terni.

3. That maintenance "items" such as oil, flannellette be considered a British responsibility until such times as the Italians produce a similar item.

Other minor points might be :

1. The formation of a physical Training corp and a Central Army Sports Board.
2. The representation of Infantry at the Ministry of War.


