H.Q. Central Schools are requested to make exact copies and be prepared to inform this H.Q. at any moment of the number under column "C". (Items already held) It is requested that as soon as copies are made that the lists be returned.
7. It is notified for your information that a large number of spare parts are being issued to C.A.D.E. Bologna spare parts should be indicated for to Ministry of War as automatic issued is highly improbable.

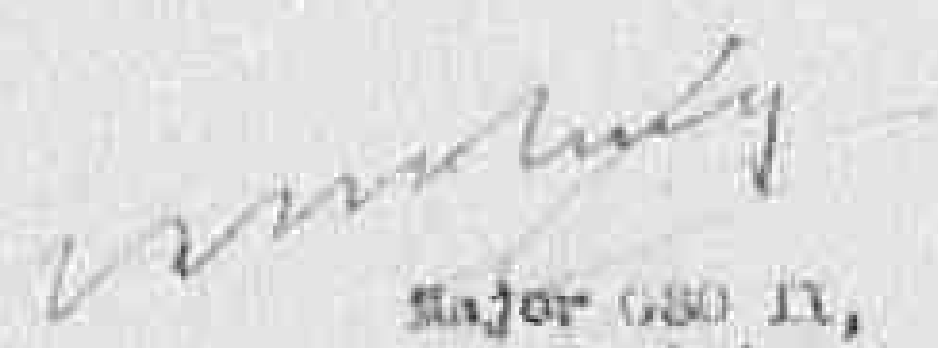

Preservation procedure to be carried out by Units before returning Artillery Equipments to RAO Stock Parks.

Artillery Equipments will be returned to RAO in a serviceable condition, complete with all associated stores including gauges, and, wherever possible, all modifications will be completed prior to handing over.

The following points will be observed :-

1. Ordinance.

- (a) Thoroughly clean and dry the bore, and apply a liberal coating of Mineral Jelly over the entire surface. If Mineral Jelly is unobtainable, use Grease No 2.
- (b) Close the chamber face with a sheet of waterproof paper (Glad Paper if obtainable) and seal it with Mineral Jelly or Grease No 2.
- (c) Close the muzzle end of the barrel with a properly seasoned wooden tamper. This should be done during fine weather if possible.
- (d) Where applicable, ease the tension on the Breech Closing Spring.
- (e) Strip the breech mechanism, and where applicable the auto-leader, and coat all components with Oil C600. Do NOT use Grease No 2.
- (f) Reassemble and cover all exterior parts, including the Breech Block Face, with Grease No 2. This particularly applies to Clinometer Plates.
- (g) Fit the Muzzle and Breech covers.

NOTE 1:- For Ordnance fitted with Jackets and Breech Rings the following action will be taken :-

Remove the loose Barrel, and apply Oil C600 to the exterior.
Screw the Barrel Threads with Graphite Grease, and replace the Barrel and Breech Ring.

2. Carriage and Mountings.

NOTE :- For Ordnance fitted with Jackets and Breech Rings the following action will be taken :-

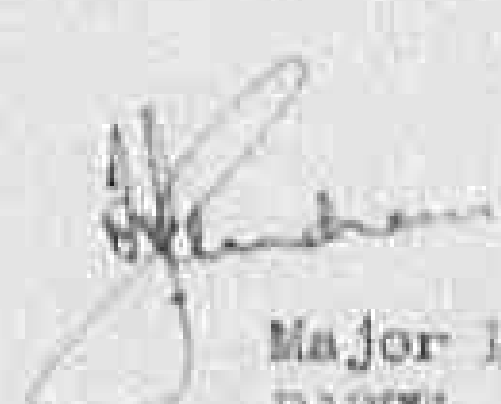

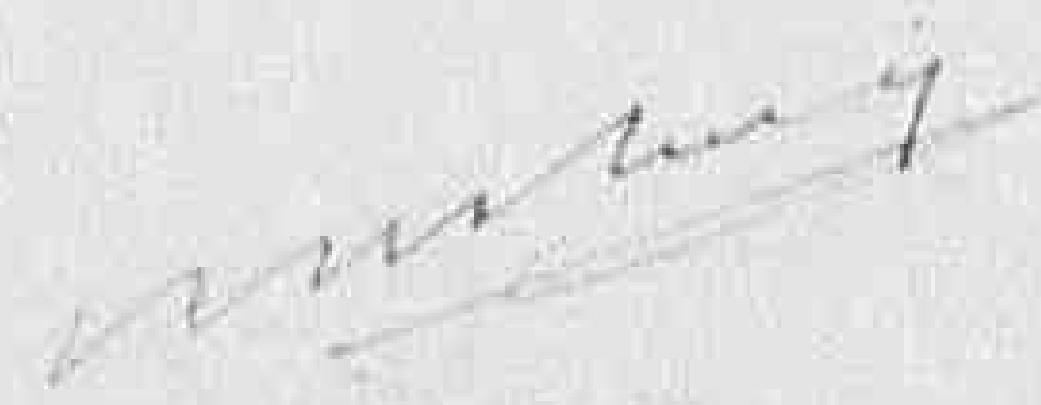

1. In reply to your letter reference 01/1029/2/Comm. di. prot A11.1 of 27 June 45. We have investigated the subject of the missing items and must state here that we really do not see how this matter can be taken up now after such a lapse of time, as our Ordnance Services cannot be expected to refer back to individual packages or to be able to point blame for the shortage. We might say this shortage is extremely unlikely as Ordnance packages are normally full.

2. We think you might take up the following points with your Unit complaining of the shortage :-

- (b) The packages were not opened until 26 April (2 months after the receipt).
- (c) The report from the Regiment of the deficiencies is dated 9 May (3 weeks after discovery).
- (d) Your letter advising us is dated 27 June (1 month after the Regimental report).
- (e) This advice of shortage to us is 4 months after the weapons were originally drawn.
