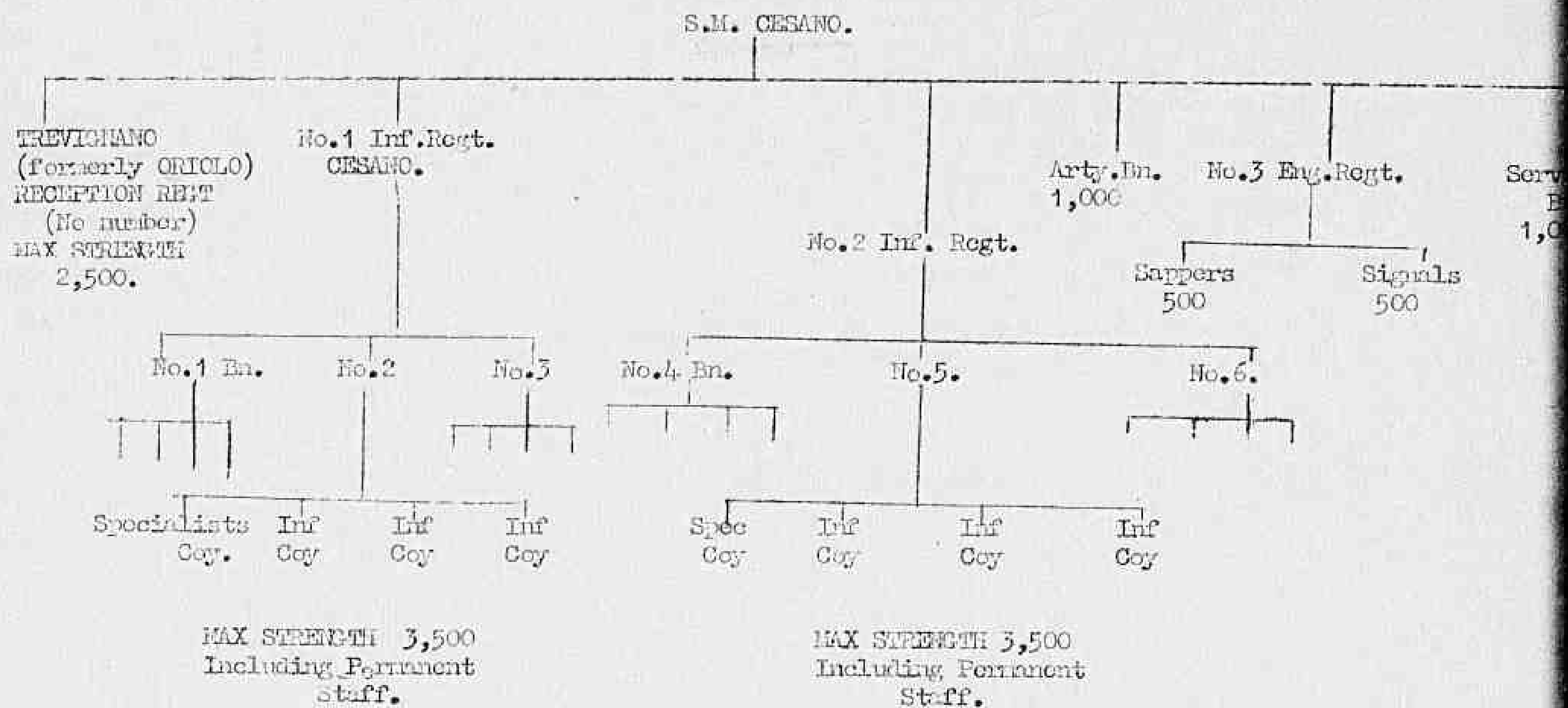

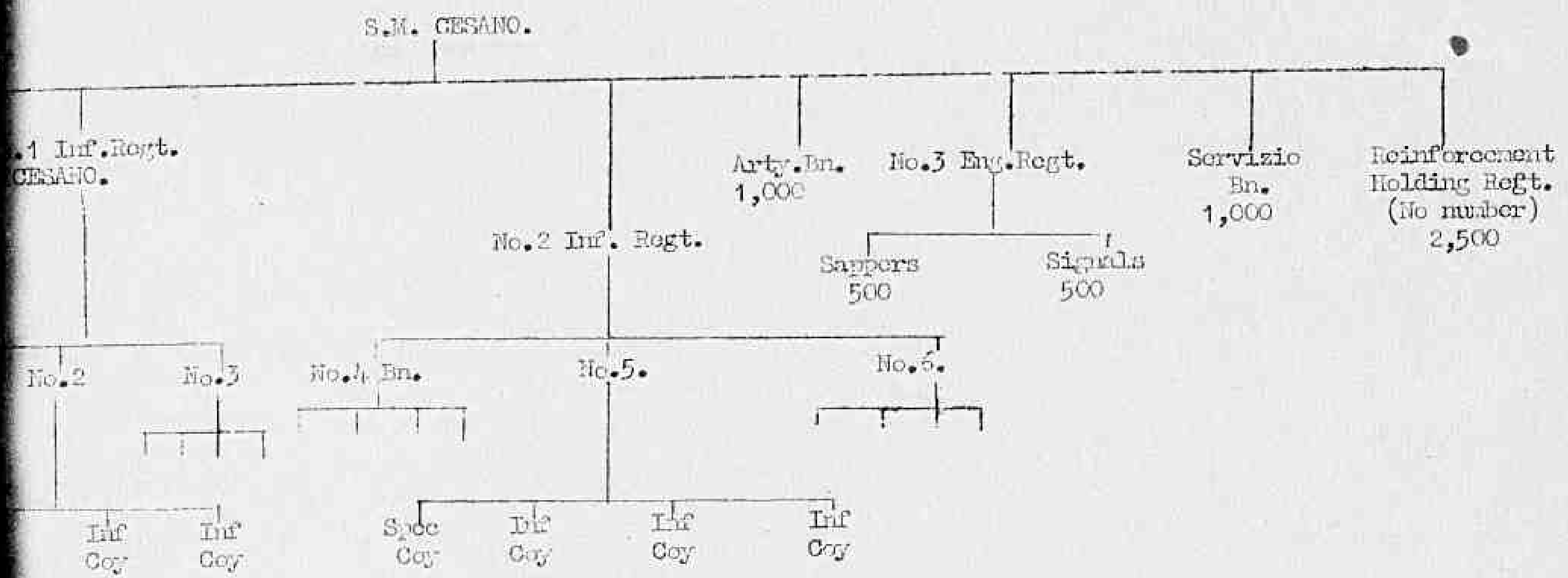

1. The object of the present Memorandum is to indicate a means by which certain unsatisfactory factors which at present impede training and efficiency can be overcome, and to indicate the best means of absorbing and training new elements which it is anticipated may enter in the near future.

2. The whole proposal is built on the framework contained in this office Memorandum, ref: 01/1/51 of 1 March, under heading, "Proposed increase of the establishment at CERNIC".

3. To enable these proposals to be put into effect, definite authorization on a number of points is required and as an immediate consequence that a meeting should be called at the earliest possible date, when these proposals can be discussed and a reply given to the various questions mentioned at the end of each paragraph. It is suggested that this meeting might be held at the R.F.O. Office in Rome, to enable the responsible authority on each point to discuss with the relevant authorities.

4. The following gives a list of the main problems:-

(a) The reception camp at CERNIC is too close to the Central School at MARZANO, as a result, untended overalls are inclined to create a disturbance and this interferes with the concentration of the students. To overcome this, the camp is being moved during the course of the next ten days to a new location on the North side of Lake Bracciano, in the vicinity of TRAVIATO NOGLIO, ref: 5396. The regulations facilities for the formation of the camp, water, etc., are available. The camp is being formed to accommodate 2,500 recruits and the long-term policy envisages its displacement by mid-summer, as it is hoped that the whole of the personnel will then have been absorbed into one or other of the training Regiments.

(b) The present setting at CERNIC - BRACCIANO is broadly as follows:-

No.1 Regiment of 3 Battalions at CERNIC, an Infantry training.

There are no immediate problems connected with this Regiment for which no solution can be found.

- 2 -

Proposal No. 1 :-

- (a) That the Artillery Bn. be made a separate, independent Battalion. (Ref: 2/1/11 of 13 March 1955), and that it should have all connection with No. 3 Regiment, to this effect?
- (b) That Col. BULLA, now commanding No. 3 Regiment, should be given command of the Independent Artillery Bn., and that Col. SAMUEL, at present commanding, be transferred to 1st General Brigade, where he is anxious to go and where it is understood a vacancy exists. May these transfers be approved and put into effect forthwith?
- (c) That authority should be granted by M.F.A. to S.M.A. to post the necessary staff additional staff to the Independent Artillery Bn., to enable it to function efficiently as an independent unit. Can this be done?

Proposal No. 2 :-

- (a) That the present No. 3 Regiment be re-organised on a two-Battalion basis. This involves :
- (i) The separation of the Artillery Bn. in the manner already suggested.
- (ii) The removal of the 'Misto' Bn. in the manner discussed in a letter paragraph (6).
- (iii) The division of the present composite Engineer Bn. into two separate Battalions, one of which will be confined entirely to Engineers, i.e. Engineer Troop, and the other to 22 mile personnel, i.e. equivalent to R.C.G., and specialist signallers for other arms.
- (d) The present Battalion H.Q. staff of the composite Engineer Bn. will form the H.Q. of the 'Sayer' Bn. Is this approved?

- (e) A new Battalion H.Q. staff under a new Lieut-Col. be formed to command and administer a new 'Signal' Battalion. It is thought that the majority of the personnel and equipment required will be available when the signal at ROCTRA is transferred to HMOOLING. May authority be granted for this re-organisation and permission be granted to S.M.A. to post the requisite personnel (if any are required), not provided by the ROCTRA staff?

Proposal No. 3 : (Reference: 2/1/15/55 of 6 March).

- (a) Application was made in the above mentioned memorandum for permission to form a 4th Regiment for certain specific purposes. Is this proposal approved in principle?
- As circumstances now render its formation, at any rate as a nucleus, essential, may this proposal be formally implemented for authority and authority granted for the provision of the War Establishment equipment and training stores referred to in Appendix 'D' and 'E' of the above mentioned memorandum.
- (b) The above mentioned memorandum visualised No. 4 Regiment to comprise two Battalions, the first of which was to be devoted exclusively to 'Patriot', and the second to Specialists.

(c) That authority should be granted to S.M.I.A. to post the necessary and additional staff to the Independent Artillery Bn., to enable it to function efficiently as an independent unit. Can this be done?

6. Proposal No. 2 :-

- (a) That the present No. 3 Regiment be re-organised on a two-battalion basis. This involves :
- (i) The separation of the Artillery Bn. in the manner already suggested.
 - (ii) The removal of the 'Histo' Bn. in the manner discussed in a later paragraph (8).
 - (iii) The division of the present composite Engineer Bn. into two separate battalions, one of which will be confined entirely to the Engineer Bn. beyond repair, and the other to Signals personnel, S.O. cadre sent to I.O.S., and specialist signallers for other work.

(b) The present Battalion H.Q. staff of the composite Engineer Bn. will form the Bn. H.Q. of the 'Engineer' Bn. Is this approved?

(c) A new Battalion H.Q. staff under a new Adjutant-Col. be formed to extend and administer a new 'Signal' Battalion. It is thought that the majority of the personnel and equipment required will be made available from the school at HQMRA in transferred to HQMRA. By authority, be granted for this re-organisation and permission be granted to S.M.I.A. to post the requisite personnel (if any are required), not provided by the HQMRA staff.

7. Proposal No. 3 : (Reference of 21/5/55 of 6 para).

(a) Application made in the above mentioned memorandum for permission to form a 4th Regiment for certain specific purposes. Is this proposal approved in principle? As circumstances now render its formation, at any rate as a nucleus, essential, may this proposal be formally implemented for strength and authority granted for the provision of the War Establishment and equipment and training stores referred to in Appendix 'D' and 'E' of the above mentioned memorandum.

(b) The above mentioned memorandum visualised No. 4 Regiment to comprise two Battalions, the first of which was to be devoted exclusively to 'Patriot', and the second to Specialists. It now appears that the intention to have 'Patriot' as a unit to be sent forward, ultimately as a Peace Unit, to one of the Groups is not likely to be required, as the ordinary have different views as to the constitution of the Peace group. Hence, arrangements have already been made to post the great majority of the Patriots as normal reinforcements in the units going forward during the week ending March 17th and 24th respectively. Such Patriots as remain will be a negligible factor. It is presumed that this principle meets with the approval of S.M.I.A.

(c) It is anticipated that within the next five to six weeks, from 800 to 1,500 soldiers of the disbanded Cavalry Division, will be arriving at HQMRA. It is understood that it is the intention of S.M.I.A. that :-

- (i) These men shall retain their individuality as members of the Cavalry Division.

- (iii) That they will be trained on a unit, or, if the numbers exceed 500, on two units; each unit to be equipped as a unit.
- (iii) That they will have their own officers.
- (iv) That, after training and equipping, they will be posted to a forward company as complete additional battalions.
- (v) That a formation letter authorising the issue of the necessary stores and equipment will be issued in the near future.
- (vi) That in the meantime these men will require clothing and training.
- (4) It is therefore proposed :-
- (a) To form Nos. 1 and 2 Battalions of No. 4 Regiment with the personnel of the Garibaldi Division.
- (ii) That the equipment asked for in Appendix 'B' of B.I.I. letter (originally submitted for Private Recon Training Bn.) shall be devoted to the two new Garibaldi Battalions.
- (iii) That this equipment and any authority be granted for the issue of the necessary War Establishment equipment.
- (iii) It is believed that this equipment will be adequate for the training of the nucleus number of 1500 Garibaldi personnel, but it is hoped that permission may be granted for the issue of further equipment, if required, when the exact details of the type of personnel in the Garibaldi Division intake are known.
- (4) The Specialist Bn. as detailed in the above mentioned B.I.I. letter is essential not in view of the great demand for specialists, no time should be lost in forming it.
- In this regard in principle and any the War Establishment equipment asked for in Appendix 'B' to B.I.I. letter be authorised forthwith?
5. There remains the question of the 'Misto' Bn., to which reference is made in paragraph 6 above. This Battalion is at present located at BRACOLINO and administered by the H.Q. of No. 5 Regiment.
