1. At present there appears to be a great difference between the various units at GESATO as to the control of men going on leave to ROME. While some units check very carefully the number of men travelling by transport to ROME and their passes, other units will accept men on a truck if they have a pass or not.
2. The result is that while there is a check on the number of men going on leave with official passes there is none on unofficial (i.e., absence) leave.
3. If it was made a rule that the evening meal was a parade for the whole Centre and the names of men absent checked against the pass roll the number of men in ROME would diminish rapidly, and the crowd at ROME MILVIO decrease. Alternatively the "fall-in" could be sounded at any time of the day at a time fixed by Comd., RTO ICF.
4. If men knew that this was going to happen they would be less keen on going into ROME without a pass.
5. It is, however, necessary to have a fixed rule for the camp as opposed to Regimental rules as at present.
