



General. At present there is a great improvement in accommodation owing to the work done by Contractors. However, there are many important improvements which can be done by the soldiers at present in the Camp to improve general facilities.

1. Disposal of refuse.

At present is just not disposed. The best that can be said is that it is merely being moved and dumped outside the walls of the Camp. The correct disposal of refuse is a matter of the greatest importance. All rubbish and empty tins should be burnt and buried.

Some designs of possible incinerators are forwarded. These will assist to limit the labour which is available in the Camp.

The organisation for the disposal of refuse and its supervision is as follows which should be performed by the Field Engineers Section.

2. Sports Grounds.

At present in the whole of Camp there is no sports ground and no football pitch. The two football pitches which were have been destroyed by negligence. One largely destroyed by the Garibaldi driving on it. The work on the Lotto Sports Ground has been suspended for over two months.

This is just not disposed. The best that can be said is that it is merely being moved and dumped outside the walls of the Camp. This correct disposal of refuse is a matter of the greatest importance. All rubbish and empty tins should be burnt and buried.

Some usefull possible Instructors are forwarded. These will fit in with the labour which is available in the Camp.

The organisation for the disposal of refuse and its supervision is one of the tasks which should be performed by the Field Hygiene Section.

2. Sports Grounds.

At present in the whole of OENIC there is no sports ground and no football pitch. The two football pitches which were have been destroyed by negligence. One largely destroyed by the Guardsmen driving on it. The work on TV Totten Sports Ground has been suspended for over two months.

At present there are 6,000 men available in the Centre for work and shortly there will be more. This type of work does not need civilian labour or Contractors if a keen and energetic Officer is given the men and the occasional vehicle, and it could easily be carried out. **6999**

3. Ground between Pettine and IV lotte.

Ground which could easily be converted into a Sports Field. A good Training Ground is being allowed to envelope into a tennis field. Besides being unsightly it is a waste of good ground.

4. Octagonal.

It is a great pity if with the great amount of money being spent on the improvements of the Centre, improvements which could be made without any additional cost are not carried out.
