COPY OF TRANSLATIONMEMORANDUM FOR MAJOR TAYLOR OF THE MIA CONCERNING THE ORGANISATION OF M.T.  
TRAINING FOR THE ITALIAN ARMY

We consider it advisable, in view of the present circumstances, to propose that all the M.T. training should be concentrated in one school.

This is in view of the following circumstances:

- the present lack of good instructors suitable to carry out the work entrusted to them. For this reason, we consider it necessary to unite such personnel in one single group, which, well-directed, would undoubtedly be able to carry out with greater success, the training of even large numbers.
- The advisability of ensuring a unity of training principle intended to create that new M.T. mentality, especially among the personnel of the staff, which is necessary, besides meeting the present situation, to give it that serenity of purpose, which forms the moral basis for reaching of the final aims, also of a technical nature which have been imposed both in the new organisation and by the changed principles of the M.T. regulations.

In order that the above may be opportunely realised, it is, furthermore necessary that the school should be placed directly under the technical commands of the central technical department without any interference from HQ's or other intermediary formations.

Tasks of the school and organisation of courses.

The school should carry out the following training tasks:

- a) courses for drivers of vehicles of various types, both Allied and Italian;
- b) courses for mechanics in the maintenance of vehicles, both Allied ~~and~~ 58 Italian;
- c) courses for Artillery mechanics and tradesmen;
- d) courses for specialists for the M.T. Repair workshops;
- e) courses for M.T. Section NCO's;
- f) advanced courses for specialist NCO's for the MT Repair workshops;
- g) preliminary courses for officers of the MT units or of the various arms of the service which may have on issue MT vehicles;
- h) refresher courses for officers of the MT units or of the various arms of the service which may be supplied with MT vehicles;
- i) higher training courses for officers, of a largely technical nature.

Details of the courses are as follows:-

- a) must guarantee the training of personnel, who, although arriving at the school without any, or ~~very~~ with very little knowledge of M.T. matters (as will be the case among the young members of the classes next to be called-up) must be able to acquire such a degree of knowledge and practice as to permit them to drive, with confidence, the normal types of Italian or Allied vehicles.

For such a course an adequate assignment of vehicles must be estimated (not more than 8 pupils to each vehicle).

Duration of the course - 2 months; number of pupils attending - 1000  
 b) must guarantee the training of personnel, who although having the said M.T. training described against letter a) must acquire such a degree of knowledge and practice as to permit them to carry out, with the necessary competence, all the work required for the normal maintenance of vehicles.

Duration of the course - 2 months; number of pupils attending 200.  
 c) must guarantee the training of personnel who whether or not they already posses mechanical knowledge, must be able to acquire that knowledge of arms and arms repairs which will permit them to carry out their work with safety.

Duration of the course - 4 months; number of pupils attending - 500.  
 d) must guarantee the training of personnel who, although arriving at the school with only a little mechanical knowledge or with a satisfactory school diploma (not lower than the 5th Form-Elementary for those who have no mechanical knowledge) upon completion of the course will for each of the respective trades be able to carry out the repair works executed in the M.T. Workshops.

Duration of the course - 6 months; number of pupils attending - 150.  
 e) must guarantee MT training relative to driving, carrying out of the duties of driving instructor and those duties of command required in NCOs i/c's sections.

During the last phase of the course, the NCO's will be called-upon to act as auxiliary instructors to the pupils attending the courses described in a) and b).

Duration of the course - 4 months; number of pupils attending - 100.  
 f) will give advanced workshop training to NCOs who have acquired theoretical and practical knowledge from the courses which they will have attended at one of the Royal Industrial Institutes under the care of the Ministry of Education, for which negotiations are now in progress. This first course should be of a duration of no less than 6 months. The duration of the advanced course is established at 2 months, and therefore the pupil, in order to reach his full qualification of "Specialist NCO", in a certain category must attend for a total period of 8 months. 2657

Number of pupils attending the course - 50.  
 g) will give a complete "preliminary" training to junior officers who are to be transferred to MT units or to units which are supplied with vehicles. They must be given the opportunity of perfecting their knowledge by exercising their command.

Duration of the course - 6 months; number of pupils attending - 50.  
 h) will disseminate general MT knowledge to officers of various ranks, in relation to recent technical innovations, and further new training principles for personnel, as well as further changes in regulations.

Duration of the course - 2 months; number of pupils attending - 50.  
 i) will train officers who, because of having special qualifications and higher scholarship diplomas, may be given the opportunity of solving constructive problems. Thus they will be able to prospect new materials or modify those already existing, and dedicate themselves to the study of workshops etc.

Duration of the course - 12 months; pupils attending - 20.  
 The total number of pupils who would be able contemporarily to attend the school is estimated at 2120.

TRAINING OF SPECIALIST PERSONNEL

The training of specialist personnel of the various categories necessary to the MT Repair Workshops would also be carried out at the Royal Industrial School and Institutes under the care of the Ministry of Education, and also with the following civilian establishments:-  
FIAT, ANSALDO, MARELLI, RACI.

Negotiations are in progress both with the said Ministry and the aforementioned establishments and society, in order to arrive at agreement as to organisation. Such an organisation, which was formerly effected by the now disbanded Inspectorate of MT Corps, had reached highly satisfactory results.

The agreements and negotiations now being undertaken, have the aim of furnishing the courses with experienced teaching personnel, sufficient vehicles and equipment, and with programmes and principles drawn up by the central technical formation. Thus they may, as in the past, guarantee results, both as regards quantity and quality, to an extent warranted by requirements.

The Royal Industrial Schools and Institutes can hold the following specialisation courses:

motor mechanics - fitters - turners - smiths - electricians and magneto mechanics - carpenters - electric welders.

The FIAT Firm:  
motor mechanics - fitters - electricians and magneto mechanics - injection pump mechanics.

The ANSALDO Firm:  
turners - smiths - electric welders.

The MARELLI Firm:  
electricians and magneto mechanics.

The R.A.C.I.:  
Motor mechanics - fitters

Total no of sites for courses about 18.

Upon agreements the possibility would exist of training at each site an approximate number of between 50 and 70 pupils. This would make possible a turnover (for each course of a duration of 6 months) of between 900 and 1260 pupils to which should be added the 150 pupils trained at the Military school.

We would thus arrive at an approximate total turnover of 1500 men every 6 months.

At the military school, trades could be taught for which facilities existed neither at the Royal Industrial Schools nor at the manufacturing firms and the RACI. These trades are: vulcanizer - storeman - upholsterer etc.

With reference to the above and in the interests of the training of "military specialists" it is necessary to stipulate that there should be, at the military school a repair workshops, besides that used for training. Such a workshop in addition to serving for repairs of M.T. materials used by the school would act as a unit workshop for the practical and advanced training for Specialist NCO's and men.

#### FORMATION OF A SPECIALIST CORPS

In order to be able to form a corps of military specialists, below NCO's rank, it is necessary to award them some form of trade pay.

The matter is still under review, and nothing has yet been resolved.

It is necessary to hasten this matter, submitting the advisability of an adequate payment being made, comparing favourably with that made to civilians, to the specialist personnel, who thus would wish to sign for period of not less than 5 years. The creation of a corps of military specialists, in addition to guaranteeing a technical independence to the Italian Army, would also enable it to employ elements of a secure competence, thereby meeting the requirements without having to recourse to civilians labour. This latter as shown by the present situation, does not generally fulfill the necessary demands in specialisation.

In order to meet the enormous demands for work by the repair services, we have had to employ the civilian specialist personnel, offered to us in the normal way, but in view of the modest pay, but in view of the modest pay offered by the Military Administration, especially with regard to experience specialists, in comparison with that paid by civilian firms, we have ~~W65~~ <sup>scad</sup> to employ a larger number of personnel to that estimated in order to be able to ensure quality by using quantity.

In this manner, there has been created an establishment, which in many cases is elephanine, the cost of which is, for the Army, enormous, and far above that which would be necessary for the small group of suitable and well-trained military personnel required by the repair services.

In this way, a large economy could be realised in the training phases of the military specialists, who if they have not signed on to stay in the Army, would have to be changed yearly with the disadvantage of being available only for a period of 4 months, for each class, since personnel, in order to reach the qualification of specialists, must undergo an 8 months period of training.
