Out of the total number of available vehicles 30 are allotted daily to the Driving School.

Assuming that each vehicle is on the road for 30 hours each week, as laid down in the syllabus, a total number of 900 hours per week is available for 1067 students. It can be seen therefore that at the end of 12 weeks the recruit gets less than 12 hours practical driving instruction whereas it is considered that 50 hours should be the absolute minimum.

To put this School on a practical and useful basis the adoption of one of the two following policies is necessary.

- 1. Equip the School with not less than 184 vehicles which would give the recruit just over 50 hours practical training.
- 2. Reduce the next intake to 200 recruits which figure is all that could reasonably be well trained with 30 vehicles.

Col. Negri is in complete agreement with these suggestions and proposes to put them up at Gen. Rossi's conference which has been called for this week to discuss the whole question.
