- (a) - Serves for the training of junior officers in the organisation of services in minor units (courses for 30 officers - duration 4 weeks).
- (b) - Serves for the instruction of junior officers in the care of the soldier (courses for 30 officers - duration 4 weeks).
- (c) - Serves for training in the regulations for the welfare of the soldier (courses for 30 junior officers - duration 4 weeks).
- (e) - trains 180 office specialist trainees (stenographers, typists, filing clerks, accounts clerks, etc. - duration 4 weeks).
- (f) - Possibly with Staff College certificate.
- (g) - A captain with duties of adjutant and a subaltern as officer i/c pay.
- (h) - And also i/c accounts.
- (l) - They are also responsible for the medical service of the school.
- (m) - It administers both the permanent personnel and the trainees. It is divided into six sections: H.Q. Section; Services Section; Hygiene Section; Welfare Section; Democratic Culture Section; Office Personnel Section.
- (n) - And i/c H.Q. Section. The other sections are under the control of the senior sublaterns attending.
- (o) - And also i/c M.T.
- (p) - For every five officers on courses there is one batman.
- (q) - Individual arms are laid down for only about a quarter of the N.C.O.s and men on courses.
- (r) - Of which 1 heavy truck and 1 light truck are reserves.

SUBJECT: Formation of a printing office

The School of Cooperation of Various Arms, in letter No 633/Add of 18th Inst. addressed for formation also to your S.M., pointed out the urgency in arranging for the formation of a Printing Office for the reproduction of the large quantity of teaching and study material.

I agree with that request which is useful and urgent.

While waiting for an amendment to WE/IS/14/1 of publication 42/S regarding the personnel required to staff said office and since said personnel cannot be taken from Schools under our command, I beg your S.M. to approach the Gen. Directorate of Civilian Employees of the M. of W. so that authority be granted immediately for the employment of the following ~~civilian~~ civilian tradesmen :-

- 1 - Lithographer
- 1 - Assistant lithographer
- 1 - Typist (whose duties are to prepare the original text for the lithographic reproduction).
