SUBJECT: Advanced training of artillery recruits.

Reference circ. 5216/R/O/I dated 17 August from
SME.

- 1) The SME has already explained the reasons why a number of artillery recruits must be trained temporarily in units instead of at the Artillery School and the proper centers entrusted with advanced training.
- 2) The present general directives for advanced training of recruits to be assigned to 25 Pdrs groups and to general services or who are not to become tradesmen, complete directives already issued by the SME in circular 4446/R/1 dated 1st May 1946 and in the booklet "Programs for the training of recruits in CARS Year 1946" 2nd edition, the "premise" of which at page 3 and the "prescriptions" at page 23 are to be particularly considered.
- 3) The aim of this training ^{is} that of forming gunners who, beside having completed ~~instructions~~ ^{instructions} common to all weapons (for the parts which will ^{be} deemed necessary) are suitable to be assigned to 25 lbs groups and to carry out tactical and firing exercises.
Gunnery to be assigned to general services and ~~which~~ ^{who} are not ^{to} be trained as tradesmen, must also attend ~~this~~ training.
All recruits must be trained in all duties of the gun members, so as to ensure, as far as possible, ~~changes in the~~ ^{changes in the} said duties and to put in evidence the most suitable personnel for particular duties (DCs and layers).
- 4) Experience recently acquired from the previous contingent of recruits, make us believe that a training group ^{fully} satisfactorily operates under the following conditions:-
 - strength a little over 150 recruits;

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- organisation: 3 sections, each commanded by a junior officer instructor; 12 squads, each commanded by an NCO instructor (and possibly with at least one junior NCO);
- strength of the squad: 12 - 15 recruits;
- equipment: 1 gun car for every 2 squads;
1 gun dismantled for each section;
4 LMGs, 4 automatic carbines, 2 Pist per section or group.

Each group must ^{aim} ~~use~~ to train each recruit at least 2 hrs a day on the service of the piece.

- 5) The weekly training program which S.M.E. ordered to be forward by this Inspectorate is shown on enclosure 1.
Said program, of a length ^{of} 8 weeks of training (280 periods of instructions of 45 minutes and 56 periods at the disposal of the unit commander) has been adopted for the advanced training of the previous contingent at the Artillery School and amends slightly the original one, according to the experience required.
Regtl. commanders may modify that program in accordance with the particular unfavourable conditions of the ground and climate or if they were to ascertain a lack of training in some instructions carried out in the CARS (for instance, increase the periods laid down for training in regulations or in small arms)-
- 6) In Enclosure 2; compiled according to that included between pages 10 and 13 of the above mentioned booklet "Program for the advanced training of recruits in the CARS" a graphic time-table for the 8 weeks of training is enclosed.
Such a scheme is to be used as a guide.
- 7) Still as a guide, the directives for the advanced training of recruits at the Artillery School are enclosed (Encl. 3).
Summaries of the various instructions on material and ammo. compiled by the Artillery School will be ~~to be~~ ^{to be} ~~used~~ ^{used} later on.
- 8) I finally inform you that on account of a wish expressed by M.M.I.A.:
- recruits for 25 lbs groups should be gathered in training units to be kept separate from units formed by old soldiers;
- a part of the instructors of the training groups of the

Artillery School who may become free, must be sent to the regiments to cooperate in the training of recruits (ordered separately).

Enclosure 3Art. SchoolDirectives for the advanced training of the recruits (1st - 1925d class)1) Planning out of the training.

The training must be planned out, from the beginning, on a strictly unique policy. -

Each subject must be divided into a number of lessons corresponding to a total number of periods of instructions assigned to that subject. Repetitions and any external exercises should be counted in these lessons. External exercises are to be considered as lessons of more consecutive periods.

On each lesson, at least one scheme should be drawn up in advance with the succession of points to be taught or to be summarised, the demonstrations to be carried out, the practical exercises for recruits, the interrogations, and eventual competitions to be held among individuals or squads. -

The scheme will be completed with references on manuals at the disposal of the instructor (i.e. regulations synopsis, hand books etc.) and with the number of the pages or chapters regarding it. -

This obviously means that every instructor should have at his disposal (possibly on permanent issue) the necessary manuals.

Thus all the instructors will use the same system and can be substituted.

Wherever possible and practically convenient, it would be desirable that each lesson be written in full.

We noted, in practice, to be excellent the system of gathering, several weeks before the beginning of a training period, all instructors, officers and NCOs available, and test them in turn on the most important lessons; example: 4 first weeks. One instructor a time will give a lesson lasting 45 minutes and the other instructors will attend it as if they were recruits and at the end of the lesson they will make their remarks.-

In 6 days and working for instance 4 hours a day we can repeat 24 lessons. And if these lessons are selected well as to represent the basis of the training, all instructors will undoubtedly benefit by it. -

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- 2 -

Generally, it is not the practice to have instructors specialised and every instructor (officer and NCO) should be in a position to give to a squad all practical elementary instructions of the whole training period.

It is understood that some of the instructions on theory and practical ones requiring the attendance of a section or group will be materially given by officers with a without the help of NCOs who all or in part could be usefully left to themselves so that they may prepare other lessons of their concern.

In case of an NCO i/c squad being unavailable, the officer will automatically replace him.-

Each instructor must keep a nominal roll of his recruits on which he will note all instructions carried out and against the name of each recruit he will record absence and all personal characteristics which permit all time a judgment. Said nominal roll, which must be handed over to the new instructor in case of change, should show notes considered in the "Personal Record Card" copy enclosed for your guidance.-

To complete the planning out of the training it is advisable to mark in advance and with maximum care the areas and premises earmarked for each squad or section and regulate the timely arrival of material and personnel so as not to cause delays in each period of instruction. The instruction will punctually end at the time fixed.-

Reduce to the minimum, periods of time wasted on account of moving to the places of instruction and in every case exclude them from the useful time for training.-

All these warnings which might look useless, have the greatest importance when considering the briefness of the periods of training and their sequence strictly connected.-

II) Development of the training.

Battery commanders will, in addition to compiling and illustrating verbally - week per week - the detailed time-table in force for groups under their command, gather daily in the afternoon and wherever necessary, group commanders and will give to them advices on the instructions of the following day.-

Group commanders will do the same with their instructors.

If this is done daily, only a few minutes will be required for these advices.-

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Each lesson on instruction lasts 45 minutes and must be developed both through the activity of the instructor (illustration, recapitulation of certain previous lessons, dealing new subjects, demonstrations, interrogations, summarising, etc) and through the activity of the recruit (imitation, practice,

- 3 -

application, answer questions of the teachers, emulation, etc.)

Several practical rules to be observed during the lesson are given below:

- Instructors should be irreproachable in their uniform and person
 - Maximum punctuality in beginning and ending the instructions (clock-bugle)
 - Teaching equipment should always be handy at the beginning of the instruction and in sufficient quantity for the number of recruits present.
 - Tact, serenity, firmness and brilliant, passionate and varied survey to be given by instructors.
 - Words of command to be given from "attention" position.
 - A question should be put to all the class and then after a few minutes, point to the recruit who must answer it.
 - Movements of practical application to be carried out with intensity and with the maximum correctness (always preceded by "attention")
- It is better to alternate periods of intense activity with short period of physical (not mental) relaxation rather than have a slack behaviour.

The functioning of units, especially at the beginning, requires an attentive control from commanders in order to guarantee a close adherence of the instructions to the time-table in force and to the rules stated above, and to contain unavoidable little individual differences in a limit so that they may be easily eliminated when the recruits are called to carry out exercises in sections and groups.

Said control should be done with the intention of assisting, guiding and advising *the recruits*.

The instructor, although having his specific responsibility must be helped and guided.

This is most essential within a battery of which the commandant will bear the responsibility of guaranteeing a uniform training of all the recruits of a whole regiment. -

III) Continuation of the training common to all arms (basic)

a) Premise -

Substantially this is as that written on pages 13-21 of publication "Programs for the training of recruits in CARs for the year 1946" identical in the part "P.T." "Regulations" "Close Order", with large reduction in the part concerning "weapons".

The fundamental principle is that of making the point on what has been done during the preliminary period in CARs.

If the contents of page 7 - 10 of a/m publication have been

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entirely acquired by the recruits, then we can proceed with in accordance with the weekly program. Otherwise we must complete the basic training and then proceed further.-

The most convenient time for this examination is the period of arrival of the recruits in units: period during which we can examine the recruits as they report. Practically a week is required before we can begin the weekly program.

b) P.T.

See publication "Elementary and combat P.T." part I - II - IX - and X -).

It might be necessary to entrust this training to instructors who have special aptitudes and knowledge of various exercises. Therefore, instruction per squad cannot in all cases be done: hence the necessity of grouping the recruits per sections.-

It will be necessary to distribute to units, programs, regulations and some material.

Light athletic exercises should be suitably alternated with games and small competitions.

A couple of hours marching should be done in this case if shown on the program.-

Gradual progress of the training so as to strengthen and not tire the recruits. Especially, take care of the whole formation; don't tend to look for and form the athlete.

c) Close order.

- Close order should be carried out with weapons where possible. Do not annoy. A few dynamic moments.

This training can be done for 20-25 minutes a day.-

Tend progressively to the simultaneous and military presence which must constitute half of all the formal training.-

- Tell the instructors to study thoroughly the handling of the British rifle (in units issued with same).-

d) Regulations.

- The regulations, especially those regarding discipline, should be done by the group commander or 2nd in command. Explain a little and converse a lot.-

- Gain and mix with the audience so as to fix well in their mind all the basic principles of education of the soldier.

- Order, discipline and subordination must be fundamental subjects.-

- Several lectures on education which might interest

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everybody (necessity of human work, necessity of our country, freedom and respect the laws, our civilisation etc.). -

- School on moral and rules on behaviour should form the subject of several meetings of groups or batteries to improve and regularise the behaviour of the men.

- e) Small arms. (see Vol. 1 of pamphlet "Training on small arms" and precisely the a/m pamphlets).

Rifle - (See AAP Vol. 1st, 3rd and 18th Appendix III -).

All the recruits, in addition to the firing exercises, eventually done in CARs, must carry out at least the first two firing exercises on ranges 100 yds (preparation) and 200 yds (perfectioning). (Pamphlet 1st par. 15 and pamphlet 18th appendix III). Aiming and positions should be accurately taught. -

L.M.G. - (See AAP Vol. 1st, 4th and 18th appendix IV). -

All the recruits must know the weapon and must know how to handle it. At least one third of the strength should do the first three exercises on the firing ranges (unless the remaining three lessons are to be completed by recruits to be specialised as M.Gs).

Automatic carbine - (See AAP Vol. 18th appendix IX and 21st). -

All recruits must know the weapon and must know how to handle it. At least one third of the strength should do the first two exercises on the firing ranges unless the remaining two lessons are to be done by recruits to be armed with automatic carbines. -

PIAT (See AAP Vol. 18th appendix VII and 24). -

All the recruits must know the weapon and must know how to handle it. At least one third of the strength should do the two lessons.

Hand grenades (See AAP Vol. 13). -

All the recruits will have to know the various types of hand grenades and their use and ~~xxx~~ possibly complete two lessons. -

IV - Art. Training

a) Service of the piece

Service of the piece is compulsory for all the recruits.

At first training is done per squad each having a gun vehicle at disposal (1 or 2 hours a day). -

When the strength of the squad exceeds the number of gun numbers, frequent changes will be made so that everybody

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alternatively execute the exercises and looks on. The latter will have to be frequently interrogated.-

The elementary training requests that each function be known by all and above all that every recruit learns to carry out silently, correctly and with the due energy, the movements prescribed.-

It is not vain formalism to pretend that the movements be carried out exactly as indicated in the regulations as these regulations advise, always the shortest, more accurate and sure way to reach the aim. The movement repeated always in the same manner permit to acquire elasticity particularly appreciable during combat and in conditions of bad visibility.-

When we have no NCOs capable of expressing themselves brilliantly, it might be useful that the instruction, even elementary, be carried out in sections by an officer (i.e. four pieces) leaving to the NCOs the duty of assisting and especially controlling the gun numbers of each gun.

This procedure becomes more normal with the advancing of the training when group service is done and can also be usefully applied in several special aiming lessons for those who are more qualified to be trained as DCs and layers.-

In such case, the recruits selected can be changed per couple (DCs and layers) to each piece. Words of command will be given by an officer and the control will be carried out by NCO instructors.-

Words of command and warnings will be those of the regulations. No change is permitted.

b) External exercises.

These exercises concern especially: take and abandon waiting position and the deployment position.-

They can be started on the 5th week when the commandant judges sufficient the degree of elementary training reached by the men.

Naturally, several preliminary exercises can be done in camp should there be enough space to carry out same.-

The strength concentrated in training units is far superior to that which a normal group can move and train during external exercises.-

Example, a training group of about 150 recruits (corresponding to the total strength of 6 Groups) going out with 4 guns a time should carry out at least 6 repetitions of the same external exercise so that all the personnel is practically trained at least once.-

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- c) Exercises on explosive projectiles are not included in the "Preparatory firing" but are demonstrated before these. They can be omitted should there be no firing range near the garrison.

These are real and true lessons on service of the piece with explosive projectiles and conclude the art. advanced training.

No deep firing lines are required (1000 - 2000 yds targets).

The positions must be easily controlled and commanded and should allow visibility of the targets.

Also in this case difficulties are the same as those encountered for external exercises: i.e. for a group of 150 men 27 squad in 6 successive teams must fire. These teams can fire in one cycle or in two days (at a week interval) so that the teams of the second day can fill in any gap noticed during the first day.

From recent experience acquired it appears possible to make in one day and in about two hours 2 groups fire simultaneously on 6 various targets (3 per group) alternating 5 teams.

From the 5 teams of each group, the first adjusted on 3 various targets. Each of the other 4 teams did effective repetitions of one shot per gun on each of the three targets changing each time the aiming point.

Teams not employed can observe the effect of the firing.

The first team retakes position and the fifth abandons

it.

- d) Art. theory.

Arty theory should always be taught by officers in a class room using blackboards and training posters.

Improvised posters proved to be very useful.

Avoid terms which cannot be easily understood. Teach only what the men must know.

Proceed slowly, interrogate and repeat frequently.

- e) Equipment and maintenance

The training has a double aim: -

- to teach to the gun numbers, not only the nomenclature of the main parts but also the functioning of various mechanical parts, the difficulties met during firing and how to avoid them and the rules of ordinary maintenance.

- to instil, from the beginning, in the mind of every gunner the responsibility and pride they must feel for their gun.

Give to the lessons a practical character.

Make the pupils handle the parts more than make them listen.

The last hour of each day must be reserved for cleanliness

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and maintenance of the gun.-

The gun must be presented to the recruit, from the day they arrive, in perfect condition.

f) Ammo.

The scope of this training is, above all, to make the recruits conciensious of the delicate task in handling ammo.

A good knowledge of the propelling charge, (I) and its practical functioning, is essential.

Insist on the degree of time fuses.

In case sectioned projectiles are not available, use the a/m training posters.-

A copy of the attached letter TRG, dated 27 Sept 46 from MMA, is forwarded to you regarding the arranging of advanced training courses for subsistence recruits.

As it is known, orders have been issued that, temporarily, said training will be carried out by individual subsistence cogs., until the renewal of the courses mentioned above, with a view to permit a uniform procedure in the carrying out of these courses.

Therefore it is thought advisable to set up a Training Centre in Rome for the a/m training. This Centre must be completed by the end of the year in order to be in a position to receive, during January next, the new contingent of recruits.

As the Centre cannot be formed, at present, as an independent unit, it is necessary for it to come under the Commissariat Units in that area, from which it will draw personnel and transport for general services.

The main problem in the carrying out of said project is that of the premises required for housing approx. 600-700 men.

Therefore we beg you to carry out the necessary work in order to find the property which is considered most convenient for the requirements of the Centre. We would appreciate two or more solutions to the problem as soon as possible in order to decide about the conformity of the premises, together with the Officers of MMA who have kindly offered their assistance and to supply it suitable suggestions for the organization of the Centre.

9. The principal objections to a monthly call-up are given as follows:-

SUBJECT: Advanced training for Subsistence recruits.

From reports received from various territorial units regarding the subsistence recruits sent to the Advanced Training Centre of Milan, it resulted that the degree of technical training acquired by them at the a/m Centre has been, generally, sufficient.-

Undoubtedly, better results could have been obtained from that course if various difficulties would have not hindered the carrying out of same.-

In fact, it was the adoption of a new system for which neither the instructors were sufficiently prepared nor could we obtain immediately all the necessary teaching material.-

To this, we add that the premises which could be allotted to that Centre, were not the best ones and repair works had to be carried out while the course was in progress.-

The procedure of sending to a single unit the subsistence recruits for their technical training, instead of sending them directly to the subsistence coys (ex supply units) is, under all aspects, the solution to be preferred. And this, because :-

- 1)- The subsistence coys have not sufficient staff to detail personnel for training the recruits.
- 2)- The subsistence coys have many duties to carry out and, notwithstanding any superior intervention, the recruits would have been taken off their training and employed in urgent service.
- 3)- The accommodation of subsistence coys is generally just enough for a limited number of men and hence it would

not permit the easy carrying out of regular courses.

- 4)- It is much easier and more practical to have in one single unit, all the teaching material required for this particular training.-
- 5)- By having one unit for the training of the recruits we can obtain better results because of the ~~single~~<sup>STANDARD</sup> system adopted.
- 6)- Finally, the intervention of the central authorities for training (S.M.E.) could be more timely and effective.-

Subj-: Responsibilities of the G.O.C. of the Central Milit.Schools

Ref: AQ/2/1/1951 of the 23 July inst.

- 1.- The G.O.C. is responsible for all the Training policy at the Schools and for the disciplinary policy as well.  
No written charter from the Ministry of war lays down his duties and responsibilities because same proceed from the normal attribution of a General Comm.
  - 2.-a) According to the tasks previously decided by the S.M.R.E. for each School the G.O.C. decided about the number, kind and duration of Courses, the necessary programs, the general procedure etc.  
As soon as the S.M.R.E. has agreed, instructions are forwarded by S.M.R.E. same to the various Units with reference to the number of Students supposed to attend the Courses.  
At the end of each Course the H.Q. of Centr.Schools sends to the S.M.R.E. a full report about the results, general observations and new proposal.
  - b) The tactical teaching had followed until now the instructions of the British one - Copy of all the translations, booklets, etc. are forwarded to the S.M.R.E. that, together with the Infantry Divisions, Inspect. of the various Arms etc. will study and codify the above teaching.  
The Cooperation School will be of great help to the S.M.R.E. in this circumstance.
  - c) Instruction about the technical training are given by the S.M.R.E. in agreement with the Inspect. of the various Arms (Artillery, Engineers, Motorisation).  
The H.Q. of Central Military Schools is however continually and directly in touch with the Inspect. of v.Arms.
  - d) Provisions of instructional & admin. staff are decided by the H.Q. of the C.M. Schools by asking the necessary personnel from the Ministry of War or with convenient transfers of personnel from one school to another.
  - e) The H.Q. of the Schools, according to the new W.E. and following the disbandment of its Ufficio Servizi has no authority about decisions on priority for building and repairs. He only suggests to the Ministry of War and to the Comando Genio Territoriale which are the most urgent and important works to be done and xxx eventually recommends the priority of the works same.  
Practically the execution of above works depends directly from the Engineers and particularly from the available funds.

- 3.- Technical advice is given normally by the Training Office of S.M.R.E. or directly by the Inspectorates.
  - 4.- Normally the Schools do not communicate direct to the Ministry of War but follow the following channels:
    - Through the H.Q. of the Central Milit.Schools with reference to Training and disciplinary questions;
    - through the Comando Territoriale with ref. to service, works etc.

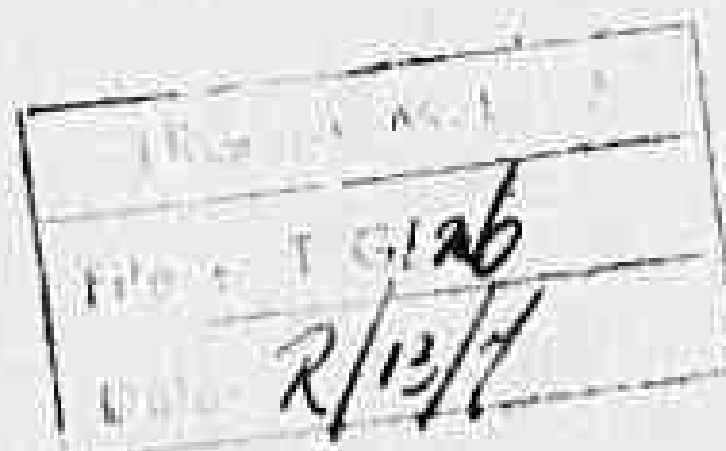
The carrying out of these courses, at present under examination, depends on the availability of instructors (who are being sent) and premises, which have yet to be prepared.

Difficulty has arisen in teaching the Italians British Survey methods, in that all Italian calculations are based on computations involving latitude and longitude, whereas the British method is based on the formation of a grid and the use of co-ordinates. The conversion necessary involves a long and tedious mathematical calculation. During the war this conversion was carried out and AFHQ issued under secret cover to formations, trigonometrical lists giving triangulation stations of the Italian mainland. Since this publication contains no information which is not already known to the Italians in that the co-ordinates produced are computed from pre-war Italian data, in order that the Italians may be taught the British methods without resorting to the lengthy conversion, it is requested that the AFHQ publication be lifted from the secret list and issued to the Italian School of Artillery.

1. Prior to the end of April I visited all the Schools, with a view to ascertaining whether every possible step had been taken to ensure that recruits, when they arrived, should be satisfactorily accommodated and that all necessary preparations made for feeding them and dealing with immediate welfare requirements. I formed the impression that in spite of grave difficulties, each of the Italian Colonel Commandants of the Schools had done everything possible to meet the situation, but that a considerable amount of improvisation would be inevitable, pending the completion of the builders work.

2. On Saturday, May 4th, Major Alexander, G.II R.A., reported to me that there had been incidents at the former Genio Barracks at BRACCIANO, now occupied by the Recruit Training Centre, School of Artillery. The main causes of complaint made by the recruits were :-

- (a) That the rations were inadequate and not as well cooked as they were accustomed to.
- (b) That the dining accommodation was too rough and compared unfavourably with that at the C.A.R., and
- (c) That the location of the barracks was remote from any recreational facilities.

These complaints originated among a small body of recruits, but however, had the effect of causing disaffection among the whole. Major Alexander reported that Col. Palma had taken very active steps to deal with the demonstration and that he believed that, although it must be admitted that conditions at Bracciano compared very unfavourably with those at some of the C.A.Rs., the feeling was likely to die down, and he did not regard it as a very serious matter.

3. On Sunday, 5 May 46, I visited CIVITAVECCHIA to discuss the matter further with Major Alexander and ascertain whether there were any developments in the Engineer Barracks at AURELIA. Major Alexander stated there had been no further trouble at BRACCIANO but Major Chapman, G.II R.A., stated there had been considerable trouble at the Aurelia Barracks. It appears that approximately 1,000 recruits left the barracks and proceeded on foot for a distance of approximately 5 miles to Civitavecchia Railway Station, where they assembled. They expressed the intention of taking the first available train for Rome.



1. Prior to the end of April I visited all the Schools, with a view to ascertaining whether every possible step had been taken to ensure that recruits, when they arrived, should be satisfactorily accommodated and that all necessary preparations made for feeding them and dealing with immediate welfare requirements. I formed the impression that in spite of grave difficulties, each of the Italian Colonel Commandants of the Schools had done everything possible to meet the situation, but that a considerable amount of improvisation would be inevitable, pending the completion of the builders work.

I then obtained transport and persuaded the men to return to the Aurelia Barracks. I stated that I was not prepared to agree to the transfer of the Engineers from the Aurelia to the Duc d'Aosta Barracks as this proposal had already been considered and turned down by M.M.I.A. and S.M.R.E., but I emphasized the importance of doing everything possible to improve conditions at the Aurelia Barracks so as to minimize the causes of complaint. I then returned to CESAPO to see General Ronco.

4. Early on Monday morning, 6 May, I visited CECCHIGNOLA to ascertain if there was any danger of incidents at the Scuola Automobilistica and the Signals School. There was no trace of any trouble at the Scuola Automobilistica and on arrival at the Signals School I found General Ronco in the process of addressing the troops and impressing upon them that they must accept conditions as they were, on the understanding that everything possible was being done to improve them as far as possible and within the financial allotment allowed for the purpose. I formed the opinion that there was no likelihood of any immediate trouble at Cecchignola. I impressed on General Ronco that the most important point was to deal with the outbreaks at CIVITAVECCHIA, but I reiterated that I was not prepared to agree to the transfer of the Engineer School to the Duc d'Aosta Barracks. General Ronco promised to visit Civitavecchia in company with General Cortelezza of the Genio Militare, on Tuesday, 7 May, and at the time of writing this report I understand he is at Civitavecchia for this purpose.

5. I have despatched my C.III, Capt. Gibbins, to Civitavecchia to ascertain the latest position and report to me on his return. In my opinion a great deal depends on whether General Ronco can convince the dissident recruits that everything possible, within the limitations of finance, is being done for their good, without making promises which are incapable of fulfilment, such as it would appear have been made by General Mattioli.

6. In my opinion the trouble is purely a temporary one and does not compare with that experienced last year with the recruits at TREVIANO Camp, who had not got the benefit of one month's disciplinary training at the C.A.Rs. It will be recollected that though this was thought to be serious it died down after some minor demonstrations, which were more vocal than actual.

7. It appears, however, that the main cause for the present discontent is due to misinterpretation by the Colonels of C.A.Rs. of their instructions to do everything possible to popularise the army among new recruits. In some cases they have undoubtedly carried this too far and instead of treating recruits as young soldiers subject to discipline, have pampered them to such an extent as to spoil them. While this does not apply to all C.A.Rs., with the Italian temperament, the influence of a few discontented soldiers can adversely affect the whole of a larger body. I explained this opinion to Major Baumann during my visit to M.M.I.A. on Monday morning, and he promised to mention it to S.M.R.E. at the first opportunity.

8. A further report will be submitted after the effect of General Ronco's address this morning has been appreciated.

SUBJECT: Division of the 1924 recruit class (2° and 3° fourmonthly groups) between Arms and Services and Allocation to various units.

1 - The quotas which each C.A.R. will have to supply to units and various Army units have been laid down in the attached allocation and division table for arms and services of the 1924 class recruits (2° and 3° four-monthly groups).

These quotas have been decided on with the idea of:

- allocating to each unit, for each arm, corp and service, a draft equal to 1/3 of the W/E planned for the interim army (excluded therefore US-ITI and BKI-ITI units still in existence) so that, coinciding with the call-up programme and the four-monthly discharges of subsequent batches, we shall thus have, generally, 2/3 of the W/E strength trained and 1/3 in training at C.A.Rs;

- giving units regional characteristics as far as possible and with temperaments suitable to tone down the unwanted aspects of regionalism.

With exception made for the alpiners - who preserve their traditional characteristics - the allocation to corps also agrees with the idea of sending, generally, young men from the southern regions to northern Italy and viceversa, i.e.

in order to accentuate the work of education and the national characteristical cohesion of our Army.

- 2 - On the basis of these ideas - which are to be borne in mind with practical application of further measures - it will be necessary to equally distribute older military personnel, to be carried out within each Military Terr. HQ.

Any surplus or deficiencies will be reported to this S.M. for any action which may be taken.

- 3 - In posting recruits to units it will also be borne in mind the advisability of not mixing them, as far as possible, with the older soldiers.

For this purpose the solution could be adopted of forming a recruits battalion in the regt; (and in companies and platoons in battalions or independent companies).

Anyway we leave the power to Mil. Terr. HQs, in respect of the particular situation of units under their commands, to adopt the more convenient solution as well as measures for the accommodation and the carrying out of training.

It will be necessary, anyway, to bear in mind from now on that, in view of the gradual discharging of the older classes, the final situation of Units, when the 3<sup>o</sup> batch of recruits have been called up, will be, generally, with a strength of:

4 - The following instructions will be followed by C.A.Rs for the division of the recruits between the various arms and services and the allocation of them to various units:

a) - the operations necessary for the division of the recruits between the various arms and services will be carried out from the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 20th April 1946.

b) - An appropriate commission formed as under will operate at each C.A.R.

- President: K/I.O. of the C.A.R.

- Members: a senior officer or Captain for each arm (Infantry - alpine, only for the C.A.Rs concerned - Artillery - engineers - MF) not belonging to C.A.R. and also a C.A.R medical officer.

- Advisory member: C.O. of the recruits company.

- Secretary: a junior officer.

c) said commission:

- will allocate each recruit, on majority, to an arm or service in accordance with qualifications required and on the basis:

. of instructions contained in circular 13 C.M. 1946 concerning the allocation to various arms and services;

. of the designation of districts for the suitability to arm and service;

- Will arrange, by the 25th April 1946, to allocate by sorting out, artillery - engineer - M.T. - Medical - supply - veterinary service recruits in the number laid down for each unit shown in the allocation table. The confirmation on the aptitudes for various artillery, engineer and M.T. trades will be the responsibility of Central Military Schools HQ.

The sorting out for the allocation of Infantry recruits (excluding alpine, for which allocations are already shown in the attached table) will on the other hand be made during the last ten days of the third month by C.A.R. HQs and with the help of a Senior Officer from the Military Territorial HQ to which the C.A.R. belongs.

It is necessary to ensure the various units an equal proportional division of the recruits with qualifications necessary for the more important trades and general services.

For this purpose, separate sorting out will be carried out within each arm or service of the group of recruits earmarked for these trades or general services.

5 - Separate instructions for the sending of artillery - engineer - M.T. - medical - supply and veterinary service to formations and units in charge of advanced training. 4881

6 - Each Military Territorial HQ will report by telegram to this S.M.:

- By the 30th April 1946 the number of artillery - M.T. - medical - supply - veterinary recruits allocated to each unit and also the total number of recruits allocated to Infantry and alpine.

As a result of Brigadier Hope's visit to this Headquarters yesterday and subsequent conversation with him, there are a number of points which he feels should receive the immediate attention of the Commanding General, with a view to impressing their urgency on S.M.R.E.

(1) Technical Students.

A case has recently arisen where, out of 52 students sent on the S.M.O.A. Armourers Course at Civitavecchia, only four had any previous knowledge of small arms, and in consequence the Course, which was originally scheduled to be completed by 30 April will now have to be extended to six weeks. It is absolutely absurd that on a highly technical course like this, Students should be sent without any technical training whatsoever. Unfortunately this is not an isolated case as I have many other instances of Courses of a technical nature where Students have been sent without having the slightest knowledge of the subject or prepared themselves beforehand. It is suggested that the importance of this matter should be placed before the S.M.R.E. to enable them to instruct all Commanders to make a very careful selection of Students before despatching them on courses.

(2) Clothing.

It is most noticeable and deeply to be regretted, that personnel are arriving at the Comando Scuole from the Combat Divisions infinitely better equipped and clothed than those arriving from the Territorial Divisions. It is fully realised that the Territorial Divisional Commanders have a great number of difficulties, but it is of vital importance that they should understand that Students who arrive inadequately prepared and unsuitably dressed for Courses, waste an enormous amount of time and diminish the total value of the Course. It is requested that S.M.R.E. may be asked to emphasize the importance of Students arriving at this Headquarters ready to commence work, as we have facilities whatsoever here for re-equipping or re-clothing Students who are improperly dressed.

(3) Instructors for W/T and Junior Leaders School, ex S.I.V.A.

It appears that a number of these Instructors have been posted to the Technical School at Civitavecchia, while others have been sent to other schools. It is suggested that a great deal of trouble

that spirit of contentment and enthusiasm which is so essential in order to achieve the best results. It is fully appreciated that the Genio Militare is doing everything possible and that the main difficulty lies in lack of funds, but none the less, I consider it to be a matter of such vital importance as to justify continual re-iteration. It is noticeable that in the Cesano district a number of the civilian farm houses rely for their water supply, on windmills, and as Cesano is well known to be a very windy spot it is suggested that the installation of one or two similar windmills might overcome the difficulty of obtaining electric equipment, which is apparently the main cause for the lack of water. May this suggestion be submitted to the expert authorities concerned with a view to their consideration.

(5) Finance.

It is realised that the financial allotment to the Italian Army is exceedingly limited. It appears, however, that within these limitations there is an enormous amount of confusion in the method of allocation to the various Schools. For example, Civitavecchia appears to have got almost sufficient money to meet all their requirements. Torre di Quinto has certainly got adequate funds to make the School into a first-class establishment. Cecchignola has not got 10 per cent of its total requirements and the position is a very grave one, while at Cesano, where it is understood that 80 million Lire has already been spent, is most inadequately catered for and the allocation in relation to the Schools already mentioned is quite insufficient. It appears obvious that the one person best qualified to decide the relative merits and necessities of the various Schools is the Commanding General, and it is suggested that representations should be made to S.M.R.E. that financial allotments should be made in bulk to the Scuole Centrali Militari, and actual allocation to the various Schools made by General Ronco himself; thus obviating instances such as that at Civitavecchia and Torre di Quinto, where either a greater enthusiasm or perhaps closer association with the authorities concerned, has enabled them to obtain an ~~proportion to be allotted to them~~, out of all ~~disproportion~~ proportion to Schools in other localities.

(6) Parade Grounds and Roads.

This subject has also been discussed and commented on to a degree which renders it more than tedious, but in spite of the efforts of Senior Italian Officers and their British advisers, literally nothing whatsoever has been done, with the sole exception of the Gun Park at Bracciano, on which an enormous sum of money appears to have been spent. This appears to be a similar case to that referred to in the preceding paragraph, where a disproportion of the sum of money allotted has been spent in one School, whereas others are starved for want of their most essential requirements.

It is difficult to appreciate how the Infantry School can achieve <sup>487</sup> purpose for which it was formed if there are no flat areas on which essential training of the Infantry soldier can be carried out. May this matter again, please be brought to the attention of the responsible authority so that immediate steps can be taken to deal with this vital matter.

(7) Central Armourers Shop.

It is understood that the Central Armourers Shop at present at the Sacelli Barracks at Civitavecchia has been ordered to move to a building in the Infantry School. It is suggested, however, that in view of the fact that S.M.O.A. is moving into extensive quarters at the Caserma Duc d'Aosta at

Since the new establishment of the Infantry School two wings are included, one for student officers and one for student NCOs, it is felt that it is of importance to clarify ideas on this subject.

1. At present it is not known who these officers and NCOs are to be. From conversations with Italian Officers here, I understand that the student officer may be a man straight from civilian life with no previous military training. What decides the qualifications of an Officer I have been unable to discover. On the other hand, it is believed that educational qualifications are the main factor, high School education being necessary. Having been selected, on the old system, the student officer did a year's service at a School for 6 months as a private soldier and 6 months as a Corporal. He was then posted as an Officer to his regiment. If this is to be the system, then I do not consider the Infantry School is a fit and proper place to train these officers. If, on the other hand, the officers had a certain amount of training and of Unit rank service and are later selected for O.C.T.U. type of training, this can be perfectly feasibly carried out.
2. In the same way, it would seem that NCOs are to be selected in roughly the same way. If a man volunteers and passes certain educational qualifications after (?) 3 months at a CAR he will be made either a Graduate where he will do a special course at the CAR, or a Sotto Ufficiale, when he will do a course at the Infantry School or with his corresponding arm.
3. By neither of the methods given would it appear that leadership or powers of command will have been fully tested before the appointment is made.
4. Attention is also drawn to an article published in the Italian Rivista Militare of February 1946, which of course is unofficial, but must represent Italian Military thought. In this article it suggests that NCOs should attend a two year course "In surroundings where the student can have the joy of living and working." (NOT CESANO).
