Ref. notes attached to my X 508 of 25 Jan 47.

- I (a) Signals Policy is directed from Signals Directorate, which is combined with Engineers Directorate.
(b) The two directorates will be separated in the near future and will function individually.
(c) Stores and Equipment branches of Signal Inspectorate have already become separated from Engineer Branch.
- II (a) Divisional Signals do some training within Div. Areas, but no specialist training is carried out in any formation other than the School of Signals.
(b) Long-range W/T Trng. - NIL
(c) Ship to Shore - NIL
(d) Ground-Air - NIL
(e) Radar (Still held by British) - NIL
(f) Alpini, no individual training
- III No specialist training in Units during 1946.
- IV Training Shortages now being made-up from PONTECAGNANO; acute shortage in 1946.

Subject:- SIGNAL TRAINING - ITALIAN ARMY

Ref. Conversation - Col Medlam - Dunn.

The Italian Army Signals are at present being instructed, within units, on Wireless Theory, setting up of W/T Stations, Netting, R/T and W/T procedure along the lines set out in Signal School Syllabi.

Small schemes are arranged; a "fair" degree of efficiency has been attained.

DR and SDS services, as such, are practically non-existent, thus making the Army dependant on the Civil Postal Service to a great extent.

Arty. Regts. and Inf. Bn. Signallers are getting practical training on schemes, excersises etc.; Signallers of Static formations however, are heavily committed in normal routine duties and therefore receive brief refresher training, and experience in domestic installations.

Switchboard Operators are employed in their trade.

Radio Mechanics and Instrument Mechanics are fully occupied with repair and maintenance of Signal Stores.

Driver Operators are generally properly employed where W/T is used in a mobile role, but, vehicles, in many cases, are misused, i.e. taken for internal economy, transporting personnel etc.

Regtl. Signallers, generally, are receiving satisfactory instruction considering the short period they are required to serve after leaving the Signal School.
